## Fabric Requirements

(B) Snowflakes	White, Lt. Blue	4270-01	5/8 yard (0.57m)
(C) Snowflakes	Lt. Blue	4270-70	5/8 yard (0.57m)
(D) Swirls	Red	4271-88	1 yard (0.91m)
(E) Snowmen with Snowflakes	White	4272-01	1/3 yard (0.30m)
(F) Snowman Pillow Panel	Blue	4274P-75	1 yard (0.91m)
(G) Intermix	Navy	3188-77*	2 1/8 yards (1.94m)

## Additional Materials:

- 100% cotton thread
- 64" x 84" (1.63m x 2.13m) batting
- Thread and sewing supplies

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## Cutting

### Notes:

- Please make sure to check [www.blankquilting.net](http://www.blankquilting.net) for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

### Fabric A, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; subcut
- (4) 6½" squares

### Fabric B, cut:

- (5) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (16) 3½" x 6½" rectangles
- (16) 3½" squares

### Fabric C, cut:

- (5) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (16) 3½" x 6½" rectangles
- (16) 3½" squares

### Fabric D, cut:

- (7) 4½" x WOF; sew together end to end with 45-degree diagonal seams and cut
- (2) 4½" x 68½"
- (2) 4½" x 56½"

### Fabric E, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; subcut
- (4) 6½" squares

### Fabric F, cut:

- Fussy-cut (1) 35½" x 42½" rectangle

### Fabric G, cut:

- (8) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (2) 3½" x 35½" strips
- (64) 3½" squares
- (3) 3" x WOF; sew together end to end with 45-degree diagonal seams and cut
- (2) 3" x 48½"
- (3) 2½" x WOF, sew together end to end with 45-degree diagonal seams and cut
- (2) 2½" x 48½"
- (7) 2½" x WOF for the binding

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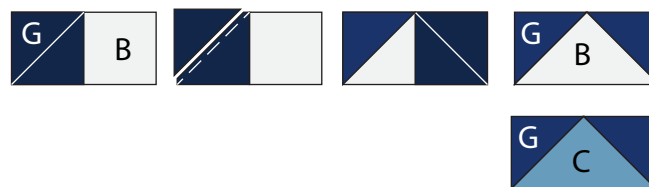
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## Block Assembly

### Note:

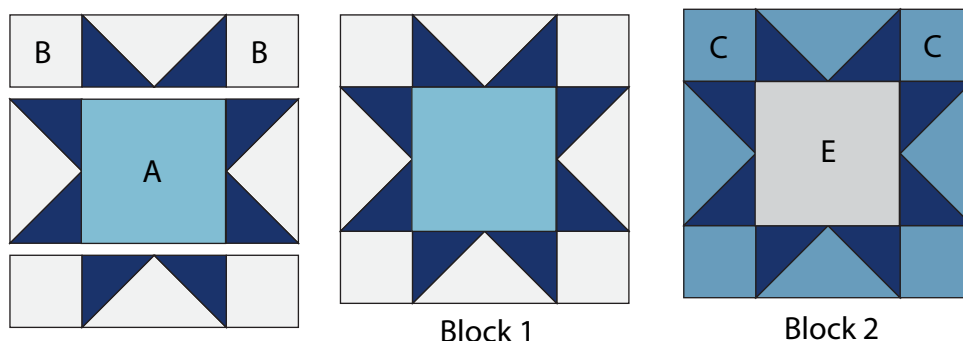
- All seam allowances are  $\frac{1}{4}$ " (.64cm) unless otherwise noted.
  - Sew pieces right sides together (RST).
  - Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.
1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric G** squares. Place a marked square RST on the left end of (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric B** rectangle. Stitch on the drawn line, trim seam allowance to  $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press open. Repeat on the opposite end to make (1) BG unit (**Fig. 1**). Make a total of (16) BG units. In the same way, make a total of (16) CG units.

2. Sew BG units to opposite sides of (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric A** square to make a center row. Sew **Fabric B**  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to both ends of (2) BG units to make (2) outer rows. Sew outer row to the top and bottom of the center row to make Block 1 (**Fig. 2**). Make (4) total. In the same way, make a total of (4) Block 2 using  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric E** squares,  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " C squares, and CG units. Blocks will measure  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

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## Quilt Top Assembly

Follow the Quilt Layout (page 6) while assembling the quilt top.

3. Sew  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $35\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric G** strips to opposite sides of the  $35\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $42\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric F** panel rectangle. Sew 3" x  $48\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric G** strips to the top and bottom.
4. Sew together (2) Block 1 alternating with 2 Block 2. Make (2) block rows measuring  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $48\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew to the top and bottom of the Quilt Center.
5. Sew  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $48\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric G** strips to the top and bottom of the Quilt Center.
6. Sew (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $68\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric D** strip to each side of the Quilt Center. Sew (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $56\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric D** strip to the top and bottom to make the quilt top which measures  $56\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $76\frac{1}{2}$ ".

## Finishing

7. Sew together the (7)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF **Fabric G** binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
8. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the quilt top.
9. Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the quilt top, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the quilt top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.
10. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides matching. Trim seam to  $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the quilt top.
11. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the quilt and hand or machine stitch in place.

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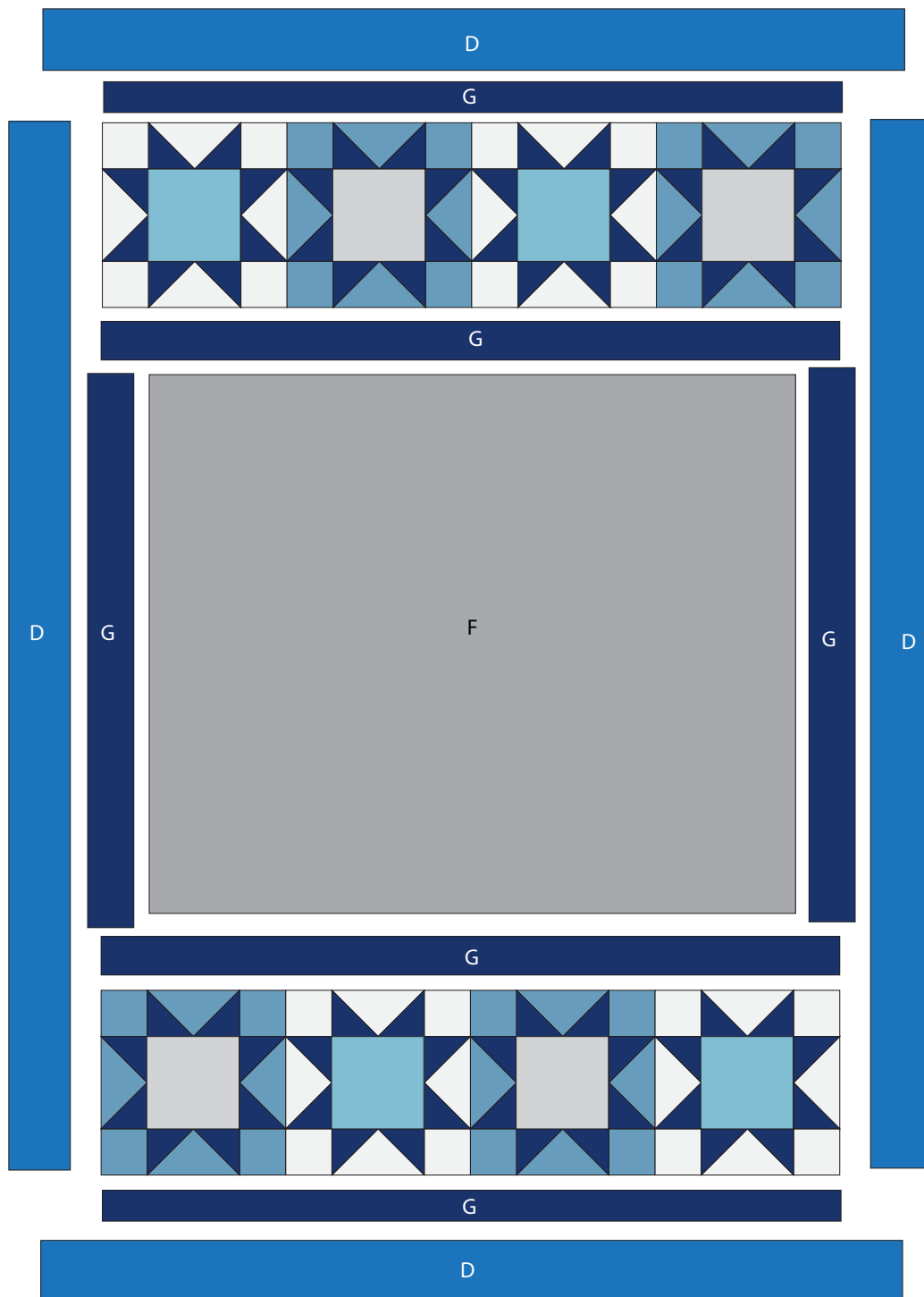
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## Quilt Layout



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
