Cutting Instructions

Notes:

- Please make sure to check blankquilting.net for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.
- *Strips cut Length of Fabric (LOF).

Fabric A, cut:

(1) 16½" x WOF strip; sub-cut (4) 16½" x 4½" squares

Fabric B, cut:

- (2) 21/2" x 631/2" LOF strips*
- (6) 2½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 2½" x 56½" strips
- (3) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $60\frac{1}{2}$ " strips

Fabric C, cut:

(2) 13½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end and cut (1) 13½" x 56½" strip

Fabric D, cut:

(2) 41/2" x 671/2" LOF strips*

From the remaining fabric, cut:

(2) 4½" x 68½" WOF strips, piece as needed

Fabric E, cut:

(3) 5½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5½" x 56½" strips

Fabric F, cut:

- (2) 2½" x WOF strips; sub-cut (6) 2½" x 11½" strips
- (3) 2½" x WOF strips; sub-cut (6) 2½" x 15½" strips See instructions to cut (3) Yarn Balls

(8) 2½" x WOF strips for the binding

Fabric G, cut:

- (2) 2½" x WOF strips; sub-cut (6) 2½" x 11½" strips
- (3) 2½" x WOF strips; sub-cut (6) 2½" x 15½" strips See instructions to cut (4) Yarn Balls

Fabric H, cut:

- (6) 1½" x WOF strips; sub-cut (12) 1½" x 14½" strips
- (6) 1½" x WOF strips; sub-cut (12) 1½" x 16½" strips See instructions to cut (3) Yarn Balls

Fabric I, fussy cut,

(6) 11½" squares each centered on a block

Backing, cut:

(2) 76" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 76" x 83" back



Sewing

- Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
- The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) 2½" x 11½" **Fabric F** strip to each side of (1) 11½" **Fabric I** square. Sew (1) 2½" x 15½" **Fabric F** strip to the top and bottom of the **Fabric I** square to make (1) Unit 1 square (**Fig. 1**). **Trim the unit to measure 14½" x 14½".** Repeat to make (3) Unit 1 squares total.






Sew (1) 2½" x 11½" Fabric G strip to each side of (1) 11½" Fabric I square. Sew (1) 2½" x 15½" Fabric G strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric I square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Trim the unit to measure 14½" x 14½". Repeat to make (3) Unit 2 squares total.



3. Sew (1) 1½" x 14½" **Fabric H** strip to each side of (1) 14½" Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1½" x 16½" **Fabric H** strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) 16½" Block One square (**Fig. 3**). Repeat to make (3) Block One squares total.



4. Sew (1) 1½" x 14½" **Fabric H** strip to each side of (1) 14½" Unit 2 square. Sew (1) 1½" x 16½" **Fabric H** strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) 16½" Block Two square (**Fig. 4**). Repeat to make (3) Block Two squares total.




- 5. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
- 6. Press each template onto the wrong side of



- the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
- 7. Arrange and press (5) assorted Yarn Balls as shown in **Figure 5** onto (1) 5½" x 56½" **Fabric E** strip.



- 8. Finish the raw edges of each yarn ball with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (1) Unit 3 strip (**Fig. 5**).
- 9. Using your favorite embroidery method, add the loose ends to the red yarn balls using a portion of the "loose end" template.
- 10. Repeat Steps 7-9 and refer to **Figure 6** for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (1) Unit 4 strip.




11. Sew (1) 2½" x 56½" **Fabric B** strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 3 strip lengthwise to make (1) Block Three strip (**Fig. 7**).


12. Sew (1) 2½" x 56½" **Fabric B** strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 4 strip lengthwise to make (1) Block Four strip (**Fig. 8**).

- 13. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric A** strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric A** strip and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make the $16\frac{1}{2}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " top row.
- 14. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (1) 4½" x 16½" **Fabric A** strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 4½" x 16½" **Fabric A** strip and (1) Block Two square, in that order from left to right, to make the 16½" x 56½" bottom row.
- 15. Sew together the top row, Block Three strip, (1) 13½" x 56½" **Fabric C** strip, Block Four strip and the bottom row, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make the 56½" x 63½" Center Block (**Fig. 9**).

Quilt Top Assembly

Follow the **Quilt Layout** (Page 7) while assembling the quilt top.

16. Sew (1) 2½" x 63½" **Fabric B** strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2½" x 60½" **Fabric B** strip to the top and bottom of the Center block.



17. Sew (1) 4½" x 67½" **Fabric D** strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4½" x 68½" **Fabric D** strip to the top and bottom of the Center block to complete the quilt top which should measure 68½" x 75½".

Layering, Quilting and Finishing


18. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the quilt.

Binding


- 19. Sew together (8) 2½" x WOF **Fabric F** binding strips end to end with diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- 20. Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the quilt top, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the quilt top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.
- 21. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides matching. Trim seam to ¼" and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the quilt top.
- 22. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the quilt and hand or machine stitch in place.




Quilt Layout
