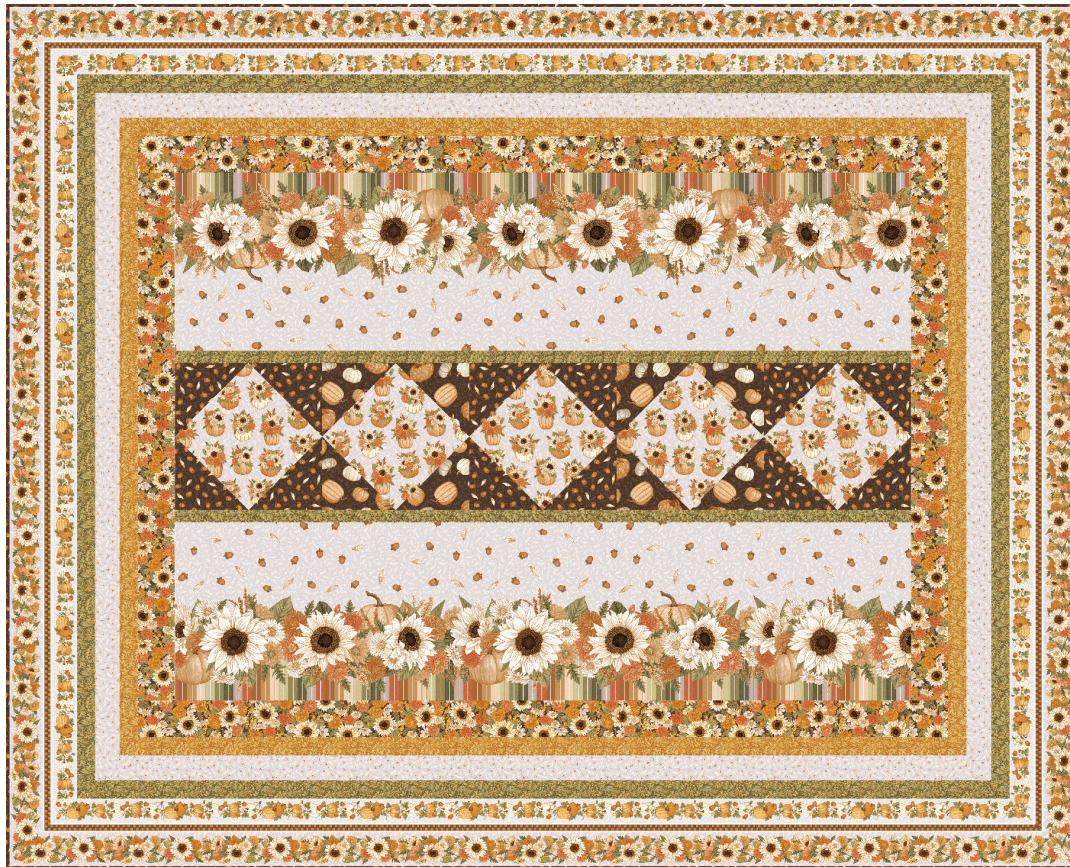

(D) Tossed Pumpkins	Brown	4686M-38	1/2 yard (0.46m)
(E) Tonal	Gold	4687M-33	1/2 yard (0.46m)
(F) Tonal	Olive	4687M-66	2/3 yard (0.61m)
(G) Large Floral	Brown	4688M-38	3/4 yard (0.69m)
(H) Border Stripe	Ivory	4689M-41	2 5/8 yards (2.40m)

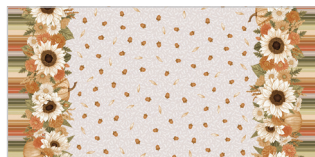

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Tablecloth Cutting Instructions

Notes:

- Please make sure to check blankquilting.net for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvedge to selvedge edge unless otherwise noted.
- *Strips cut Length of Fabric (LOF).

Fabric A, cut:

- (3) 2½" x WOF. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut
(2) 2½" x 52½"
- (4) 2½" x WOF. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut
(2) 2½" x 73½"

Fabric B, cut:

- (2) 12½" x WOF; subcut
(5) 12½ squares

Fabric C, cut:

- (2) 6½" x WOF; subcut
(12) 6½" squares
- (9) 2½" x WOF for the binding

Fabric D, cut:

- (2) 6½" x WOF; subcut
(8) 6½" squares

Fabric E, cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut
(2) 2" x 49½"
- (4) 2" x WOF. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut
(2) 2" x 69½"

Fabric F, cut:

- (4) 1½" x WOF. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut
(2) 1½" x 60½"
- (3) 2" x WOF. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut
(2) 2" x 56½"
- (4) 2" x WOF. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut
(2) 2" x 76½"

Fabric G, cut:

- (3) 3½" x WOF. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut
(2) 3½" x 43½"
- (4) 3½" x WOF. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut
(2) 3½" x 66½"

Fabric H, fussy cut:

- (2) 6" x 74" LOF* (see cover)
- (2) 6" x 91" LOF* (see cover)

Fabric I, fussy cut:

- (2) 15" x 60½" LOF* (see cover image)

Tablecloth Sewing

- Sew using a ¼" (0.64cm) seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
- The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Place (1) 6½" **Fabric C** square on the top left corner of (1) 12½" **Fabric B** square RST (**Fig. 1**). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (**Fig. 1**). Flip open the triangle formed and press (**Fig. 2**). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.

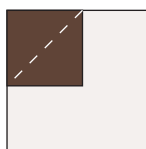
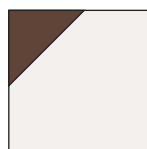

2. Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 6½" **Fabric C** square to each of the remaining corners of the 12½" **Fabric B** square to make (1) Block One (**Fig. 4**).
3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make an additional (2) Block Ones.

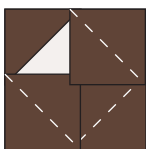
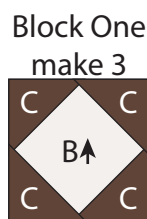

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figure 5 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (2) Block Twos.

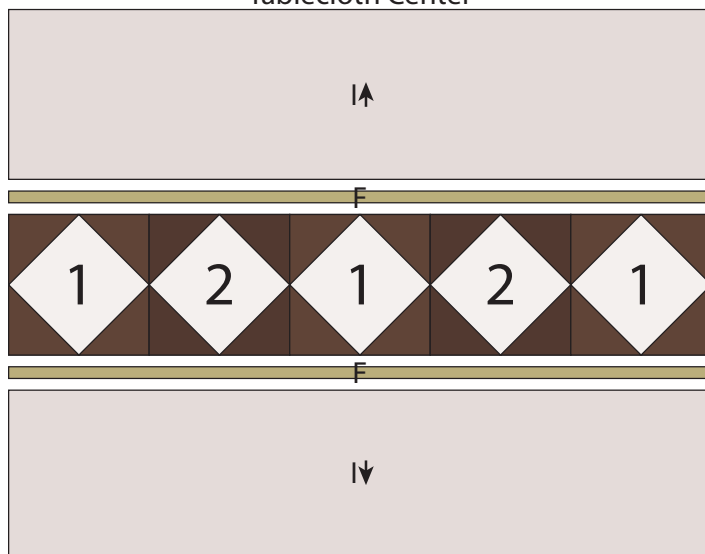

5. Sew together (3) Block Ones and (2) Block Twos alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) 1½" x 60½" **Fabric F** strip to the top and bottom of the newly sewn strip. Sew (1) 15" x 60½" **Fabric I** strip to the top and bottom of the newly sewn strip to make the 60½" x 43½" Tablecloth Center (**Fig. 6**).

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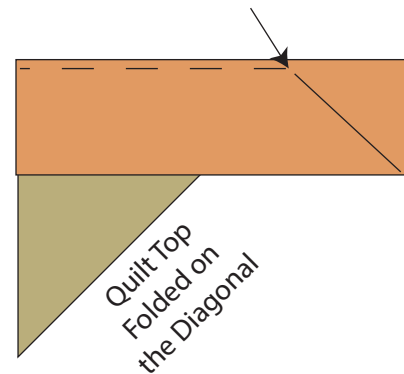

Tablecloth Top Assembly

Follow the Tablecloth Layout (Page 6) while assembling the quilt top.

6. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $43\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric G** strip to each side of the Tablecloth Center. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $66\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric G** strip to the top and bottom of the Tablecloth Center.
7. Sew (1) 2" x $49\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric E** strip to each side of the Tablecloth Center. Sew (1) 2" x $69\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric E** strip to the top and bottom of the Tablecloth Center.
8. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $52\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric A** strip to each side of the Tablecloth Center. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $73\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric A** strip to the top and bottom of the Tablecloth Center.
9. Sew (1) 2" x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric F** strip to each side of the Tablecloth Center. Sew (1) 2" x $76\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric F** strip to the top and bottom of the Tablecloth Center.
10. Center (1) 6" x 74" **Fabric H** strip on (1) side of the Tablecloth Center and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge and stop a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
11. Repeat Step 10 to sew (1) 6" x 91" **Fabric H** strip to the top and to the bottom of the Tablecloth Center, making sure to stop and start $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end. To miter each corner, fold the Tablecloth Center on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (**Fig. 7**).

12. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 7), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the tablecloth top.

Tablecloth Layering, Quilting and Finishing

13. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and tablecloth top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the tablecloth.

Tablecloth Binding

14. Sew together (9) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF **Fabric C** binding strips end to end with diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
15. Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the tablecloth top, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the tablecloth top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.

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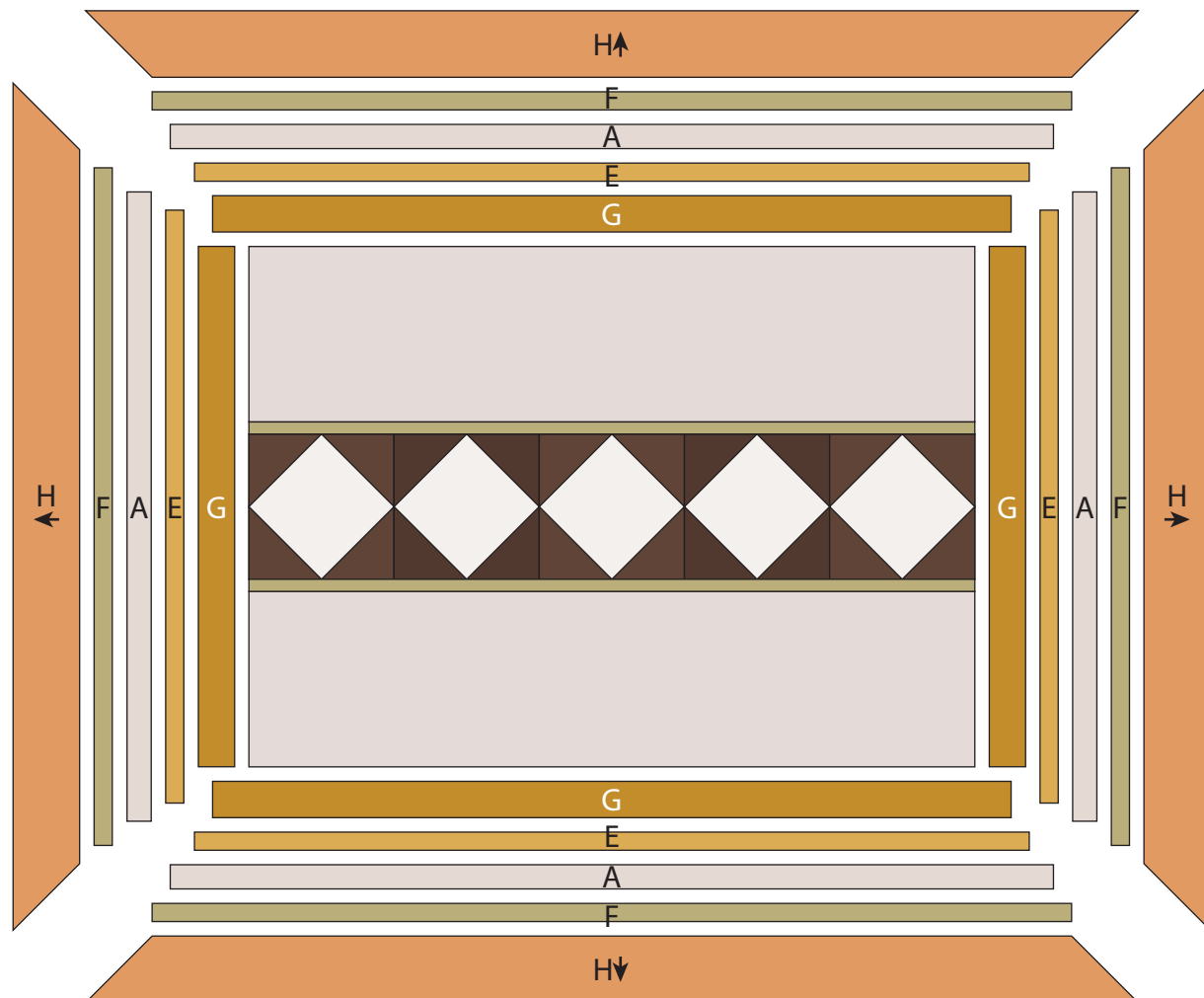

16. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the tablecloth edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides matching. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the tablecloth top.
17. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the tablecloth and hand or machine stitch in place.

(B) Tossed Pumpkins	Brown	4686M-38	1¼ yards (1.14m)
(C) Tonal	Gold	4687M-33	1¼ yards (1.14m)
(D) Double Border	Ivory	4690M-41	1¼ yards (1.14m)



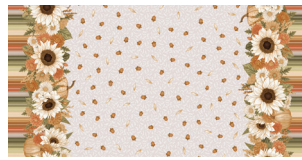

Napkin Cutting Instructions

Notes:

- Please make sure to check blankquilting.net for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvedge to selvedge edge unless otherwise noted.

Fabric A, cut:

(3) 20½" squares

Fabric B, cut:

(3) 20½" squares

Fabric C, cut:

(3) 20½" squares

Fabric D, fussy cut:

(3) 20½" squares (see cover image)

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Nature's Beauty Table Set

Napkin Sewing

- Sew using a ¼" (0.64cm) seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
 - The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.
1. Place (1) 20½" **Fabric B** square RST with (1) 20½" **Fabric C** square, aligning the raw edges. Sew around the two pieces, leaving a 3" opening for turning.
 2. Turn the sewn piece right sides out and press. Tuck in the raw edges at the opening and press. Topstitch around the entire piece, making sure to close the opening while stitching, to complete (1) Napkin #1 (**Fig. 8**).
 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make an additional (2) Napkin #1's.

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 with (3) 20½" **Fabric A** squares and (3) 20½" **Fabric D** squares while referring to **Figure 9** to make (3) Napkin #2's.

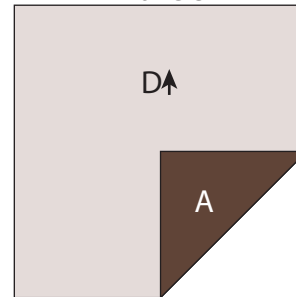
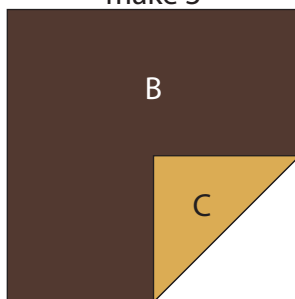
