$11 / 3$ yards Stripes - Red (E)
$11 / 3$ yards USA Stripe - Blue (F)
$1 / 4$ yard Eagles - Ivory (G)
$3 / 8$ yard $\quad$ Stars - Red (H)
$2 / 3$ yard Urban Legend - Navy (I)
$1 / 4$ yard Hearts - Blue (J)
3/4 yard Urban Legend - Ecru (K)
$1 / 4$ yard Words - Blue (L)
$1 / 3$ yard Stars - Ivory (M)
5 yards Words - Ivory (Backing)
*Includes binding

## Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24" Panel - Blue (A), fussy cut:
-(1) $23^{\prime \prime} \times 21 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ panel, centered on (3) middle blocks.
-(6) 10 " $\times 73 / 4$ " small blocks.

From the Wood Grain - Brown (B), cut:

- (1) $73 / 4$ " $\times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) $21 / 2 " \times 73 / 4 "$ strips.
-(2) $3 " \times 27 "$ WOF strips.
-(4) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) $21 / 2 " x 14 "$ strips.
- (2) $21 / 2 " \times 211 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (3) $21 / 2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) $21 / 2 "$ x $121 / 2 "$ strips.
- (8) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strips for the binding.

From the Urban Legend - Red (C), cut:

- (3) $31 / 2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) $31 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ strips.
- (2) $31 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) $31 / 2 "$ squares.
- (2) 2 " $\times 281 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (2) 2 " $\times 251 / 2 "$ WOF strips.

From the Stars - Blue (D), cut:

- (2) $41 / 2 " \times 361 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (2) $41 / 2 " \times 281 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (4) $31 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) $31 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Stripes - Red (E), cut:

- (2) $41 / 4$ " $x 441 / 2 "$ Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) $41 / 2 " \times 361 / 2 "$ WOF strips from the remaining fabric, piece as needed.


## From the USA Stripe - Blue (F), fussy cut:

- (2) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 441 / 2 "$ LOF strips, each centered on a strip of red words.

From the Eagles - Ivory (G), cut:

- (1) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $61 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Stars - Red (H), cut:

- (3) $31 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) $31 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Urban Legend - Navy (I), cut:

- (3) $31 / 2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) $31 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ strips.
- (2) $31 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) $31 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Hearts - Blue (J), cut:
-(1) $61 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) $61 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Urban Legend - Ecru (K), cut:

- (4) $31 / 2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) $31 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ strips.
- (2) $31 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) $31 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Words - Blue (L), cut:

- (1) $61 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $61 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Stars - Ivory (M), cut:

- (3) $31 / 2 " x$ WOF strips.Sub-cut (32) $31 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Words - Ivory (Backing), cut:
-(2) $88 "$ x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the $76 " \times 88^{\prime \prime}$ back.

## Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 21 \frac{1}{2} / 2$ Fabric B strip to each side of the $23 "$ x $211 / 2 "$ Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 3" x $27 "$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure $251 / 2 "$ square to make (1) Unit 1 block (Fig. 1).

Pay attention to the orientation of the units when constructing the blocks in the following steps. Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 1 block. Sew (1) $2 " \times 281 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 block to make the Center Block (Fig. 2).

3. Place (1) $31 / 2 "$ Fabric H square on the left side of (1) $31 / 2 " \times 1 / 2 "$ Fabric I strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.

4. Place another $31 / 2$ " Fabric H square on the right side of the $31 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ Fabric I strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 6).
5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (16) Unit 2 strips.

6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figures 7-8 for fabric identification, location and seam direction to make (24) Unit 3 strips and (16) Unit 4 strips.

7. Sew (1) $31 / 2 "$ Fabric I square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) $61 / 2$ ", Fabric G square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figures 10-11 for component identification, location and orientation to make (6) Block Two squares and (4) Block Three squares.

9. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 73 / 4 "$ Fabric B square to each side of (1) $10 " \times 73 / 4 "$ Fabric A small block. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 14 "$
Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. Trim the block to measure $121 / 2 " \times 11$ " to make (1) Block Four rectangle (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (6) Block Four rectangles total.

## AMERICAN HONOR II

## Quilt 1

Quilt Top Assembly
(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top. The arrows in the quilt layout denote fabric print direction. Pay attention to the orientation of the fabric when constructing the quilt top.)
10. Sew (1) $41 / 2 " \times 28 \frac{1}{2} "$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $41 / 2 " \times 361 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
11. Sew (1) $4 \frac{1}{2} / " \times 361 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $41 / 4 " \times 441 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
12. Sew (1) $6 \frac{1}{2} / 2 \times 441 / 2 "$ Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
13. Sew (1) Block Four rectangle, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Four rectangle, (1) Block Two square and (1) Block Four rectangle together in that order to make (1) Side

Border. Repeat to make a second Side Border. Sew (1) border to each side of the Center Block.
14. Sew (1) Block One square, (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) $21 / 2 " \times 121 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip, (1) Block Three square, (1) $21 / 2 " \times 121 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) $21 / 2 " \times 121 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip and (1) Block One square together in that order to make the Top Border. Repeat to make the Bottom Border. Sew the borders to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
15. Layer and quilt as desired.
16. Sew the (8) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
17. Bind as desired.
