1/2 yard	Crows - Orange (B)	2165-33
2/3 yard	Spiders - Taupe (C)	2162-39
5/8 yard	Urban Legend - Charcoal (D)	7101-99
3/4 yard	Bats - Orange (E)	2164-33*
1/4 yard	Portraits - Black (F)	2166-99
5/8 yard	Urban Legend - Light Brown (G)	7101-32
1 yard	Roses - Black (H)	2167-99
4 yards	Halloween Patch - Black (Backing)	2169-99

*Includes binding

Batting: 59" x 71"
(Recommended: Air Lite® Colour Me 100% Cotton)

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Halloween Elements - Black (A), cut:

- (1) 7" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 7" squares.

From the Crows - Orange (B), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 1/2" squares.
- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 1/2" x 7" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 1/2" x 9" strips.

From the Spiders - Taupe (C), cut:

- (2) 5 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 1/2" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 5 1/2" triangles.
- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.

From the Urban Legend - Charcoal (D), cut:

- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips.

From the Bats - Orange (E), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/2" squares.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Portraits - Black (F), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 6 1/2" squares.

From the Urban Legend - Light Brown (G), cut:

- (2) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3 1/2" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 1/2" WOF strips.

From the Roses - Black (H), cut:

- (3) 6 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 1/2" x 51 1/2" strips.
- (2) 6 1/2" x 39 1/2" WOF strips.

From the Halloween Patch - Black (Backing), cut:

- (2) 71" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 59" x 71" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 7" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 7" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 9" Fabric B strip to each side of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

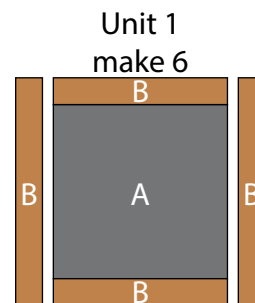

2. Sew (1) 2 1/2" Fabric E square to the top of (1) 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" Fabric D strip. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" Fabric D strip to the left side of the newly sewn strip to make (1) 3 1/2" Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (24) Unit 2 squares total.

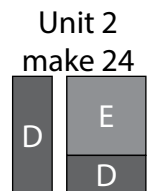

3. Sew (1) 5 1/2" Fabric C triangle to adjacent sides of (1) Unit 2 square, along the Fabric D sides to make (1) Unit 3 triangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (24) Unit 3 triangles total.

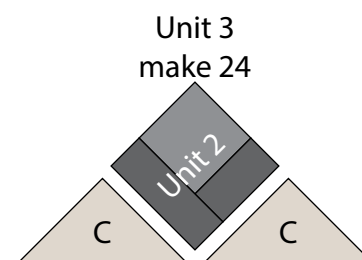

4. Sew (1) Unit 3 triangle to each of the (4) sides of (1) Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One square. The square should measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

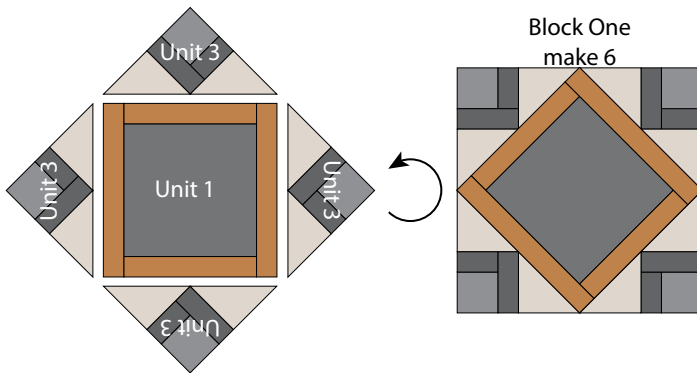

5. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip and (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square together in that order from left to right to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (12) Unit 4 strips.

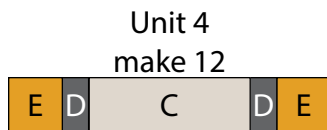

6. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip and (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip together in that order from left to right to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (6) Unit 5 strips total.

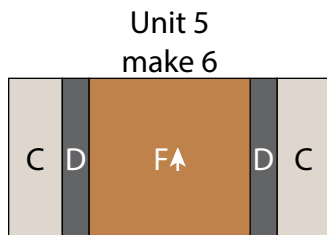

7. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, (1) Unit 5 strip, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip and (1) Unit 4 strip together lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom to make (1) $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square. Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.

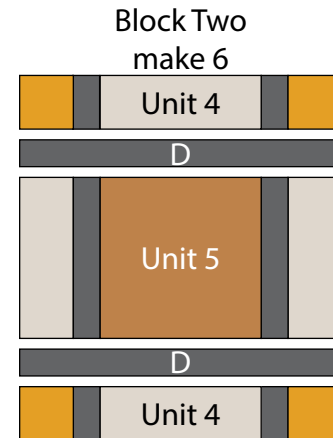

8. Place (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square on the top left corner of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 9).

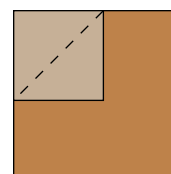

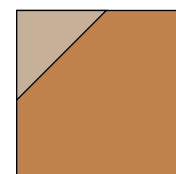

9. Follow Figure 10 for the seam direction to add a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square to each of the remaining corners of the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 11).

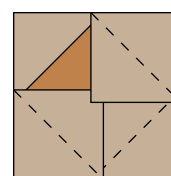

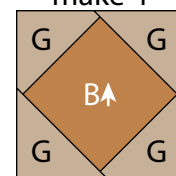

10. Repeat Steps 8-9 to make (4) Unit 6 squares total.

11. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 12). Repeat to make Row Three.

12. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 12). Repeat to make Row Four.

13. Sew together the (4) rows from Steps 11-12, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 36 1/2" x 48 1/2" Center Block (Fig. 12).

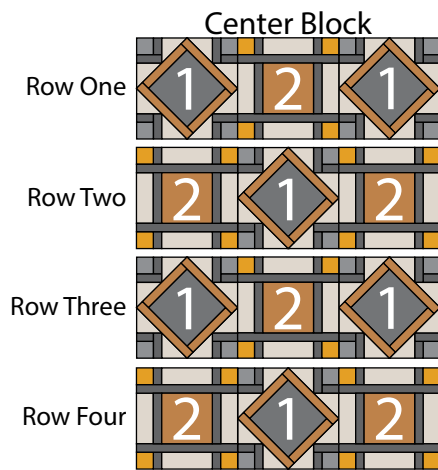

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

14. Sew (1) 2" x 48 1/2" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 39 1/2" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

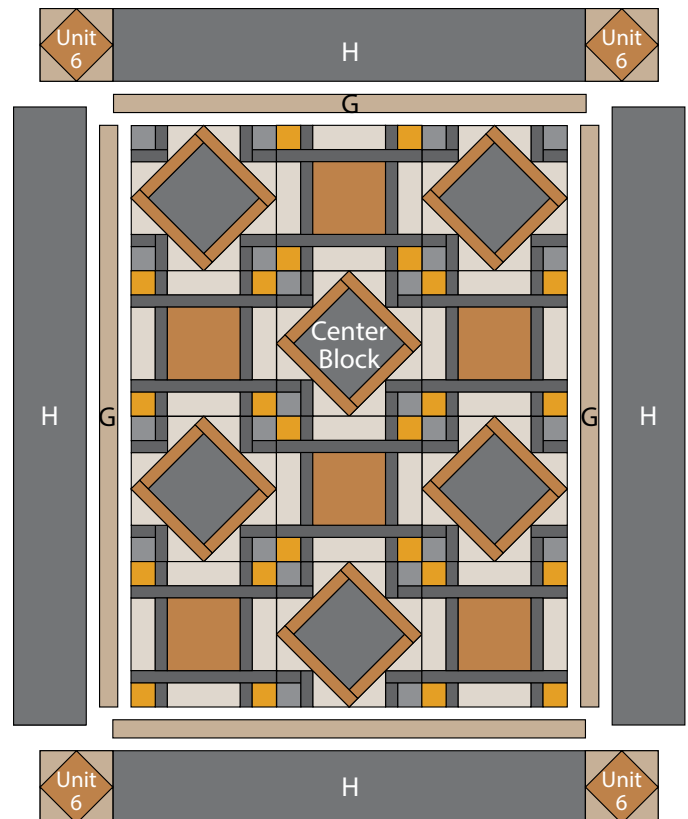
15. Sew (1) 6 1/2" x 51 1/2" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to each end of (1) 6 1/2" x 39 1/2" Fabric H strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

17. Layer and quilt as desired.

18. Sew the (6) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric E strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

19. Bind as desired.
