Cutting Instructions - Firefighter Version

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Firefighter Book Panel - Red (A):

• Fussy cut (12) 8 ½" squares, each centered on a fireman block.

From the Starlet - Red (B), cut:

- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2" x 8 ½" strips.
- (8) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2" x 11 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Starlet - Navy (C), cut:

- (6) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ³/₄" x 10" strips.
- (8) 1 3/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 3/4" x 12 1/2" strips.

From the Starlet - White (D), cut:

- (4) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (31) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (124) 4 1/4" triangles.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 63 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.

From the Jot Dot Basics - Dark Blue (E), cut:

• (2) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 4 1/4" triangles. *Note: You will use (62) 4 1/4" triangles.*

From the Jot Dot Basics - Red (F), cut:

• (2) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 4 1/4" triangles. Note: You will use (62) 4 1/4" triangles.

From the Firefighter Vehicles - White (G), cut:

• (6) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (31) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

From the Dalmatians & Hydrants - Blue (H), cut:

• (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3 ½" squares.

From the Firefighter Stripe - Red (I), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x 77" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 4 ½" x 62" LOF strips.

From the Firefighter Motif Checkerboard - White (Backing),

• (2) 66" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 66" x 81" back.

Cutting Instructions - Police Version

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Police Book Panel - Light Blue (A):

• Fussy cut (12) 8 ½" squares, each centered on a police block.

From the Starlet - Sky (B), cut:

- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2" x 8 ½" strips.
- (8) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2" x 11 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Starlet - Royal (C), cut:

- (6) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ³/₄" x 10" strips.
- (8) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ³/₄" x 12 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Starlet - White (D), cut:

- (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (31) 4 ½" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (124) 4 1/4" triangles.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 63 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.

From the Jot Dot Basics - Dark Blue (E), cut:

• (2) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 4 1/4" triangles. Note: You will use (62) 4 1/4" triangles.

From the Starlet - Navy (F), cut:

• (2) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 4 1/4" triangles. *Note: You will use (62) 4 1/4" triangles.*

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Block One

Cutting Instructions - Police Version (Continued)

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Police Vehicles - Blue (G), cut:

• (6) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (31) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

From the Police Motifs in Circles - Blue (H), cut:

• (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3 ½" squares.

From the Stripe - Blue (I), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x 77" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 4 ½" x 62" LOF strips.


From the Police From the Words - Blue (Backing), cut:

• (2) 66" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 66" x 81" back.


Block Assembly (Both Versions)

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 11 ½" Fabric B stirp to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim** the unit to measure 10" x 10". Repeat to make (12) Unit 1 squares total.



2. Sew (1) 1 ³/₄" x 10" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1 ³/₄" x 12 ¹/₂" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (12) Block One squares total.




3. Sew (1) 4 1/4" Fabric F triangle to (1) 4 1/4" Fabric D triangle to make (1) FD


triangle. Sew (1) 4 1/4" Fabric E triangle to (1) 4 1/4" Fabric D triangle to make (1) ED triangle. Sew the FD triangle to the ED triangle along their long sides to make (1)

3 ½" Unit 2 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (62) Unit 2 squares.

4. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (31) Unit 3 stirps total.



- 5. Sew together (4) 3 ½" Fabric H squares and (3) Unit 3 strips, alternating them, to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (5) Unit 4 strips.
- 6. Sew together (4) Unit 3 strips and (3) Block One squares, alternating them, to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (4) Unit 5 strips.




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
Quilt Top Assembly (Both Versions) (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 7. Sew together (5) Unit 4 strips and (4) Unit 5 strips, alternating them, to make the Center Block.
- 8. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 63 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 9. Center (1) 4 ½" x 77" Fabric I strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 10. Repeat Step 9 to sew (1) 4 ½" x 62" strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 7).

11. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 7), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.



- 12. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 13. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 14. Bind as desired.
