1/4 yard	Flowers on Check - Gray (G)	2779-90
1 1/3 yards	Check - Red (H)	2786-88*
1/2 yard	Jot Dot - Black (I)	9570-99
3/8 yard	Jot Dot - Marshmallow (J)	9570-09
3/8 yard	Tossed Windmills - Slate (K)	2785-70
1 5/8 yards	Wagon Wheels with Flowers - Dark Teal (L)	2778-67
5 yards	Farm Scenic - Light Green (Backing)	2783-60

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Farm Panel-36 inches - Green (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 42 1/2" x 35 1/2" rectangle, centered on the panel.

#### From the Check - Gray (B), cut:

- (2) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 4 1/4" triangles.
- (2) 3" x 35 1/2" WOF strips.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3" x 47 1/2" strips.

#### From the Jot Dot - Brown (C), cut:

- (2) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 4 1/4" triangles.
- (2) 1 1/2" x 39 1/2" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 48 1/2" strips.

#### From the Goats Allover - Gray (D), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 1/2" squares.

#### From the Chickens - Green (E), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 1/2" squares.

#### From the Tossed Pigs - Dark Teal (F), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 1/2" squares.

#### From the Flowers on Check - Gray (G), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 1/2" squares.

#### From the Check - Red (H), cut:

- (3) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 3 1/2" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 65 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 1/2" strips.
- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Jot Dot - Black (I), cut:

- (2) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 4 1/4" triangles.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2" squares.

#### From the Jot Dot - Marshmallow (J), cut:

- (2) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 4 1/4" triangles.

#### From the Tossed Windmills - Slate (K), cut:

- (3) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Wagon Wheels with Flowers - Dark Teal (L), cut:

- (4) 6 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 1/2" x 68 1/2" strips.
- (4) 6 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 1/2" x 63 1/2" strips.

#### From the Farm Scenic - Light Green (Backing), cut:

- (2) 88" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 71" x 88" back.

### Block Assembly

*Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.*

1. Sew (1) 3" x 35 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the 42 1/2" x 35 1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 3" x 47 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 46 1/2" x 39 1/2"**.

2. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 39 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 1 rectangle. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 48 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make the 48 1/2" x 41 1/2" Center Block (Fig. 2).








3. Place (1) 2" Fabric I square on the top left corner of (1) 3 1/2" Fabric K square, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (32) Unit 2 squares total.




4. Follow Figure 5 and sew together (1) 4 1/4" Fabric J triangle, (1) 4 1/4" Fabric B triangle, (1) 4 1/4" Fabric I triangle and (1) 4 1/4" Fabric C triangle to make (1) 3 1/2" Unit 3 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (32) Unit 3 squares total.





5. Repeat Step 4 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (32) Unit 4 squares.

6. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of (1) Unit 4 square, along the Fabric I sides, to make (1) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Unit 5 rectangle (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (32) Unit 5 rectangles total.





7. Place (1) 3 1/2" Fabric H square on the top left corner of (1) 6 1/2" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 9). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.






8. Follow Figure 10 for the seam direction to add a 3 1/2" Fabric H square to each of the remaining corners of the 6 1/2" Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 11).


9. Repeat Steps 7-8 to make a second Unit 6 square.



10. Repeat Steps 7-8 and refer to Figures 12-14 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (2) of each unit square for Unit 7 through Unit 9.



11. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 rectangle to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 5 rectangle to each side of (1) Unit 6 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make 12 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make a second Block One square.



12. Repeat Step 11 and refer to Figures 16-18 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) of each unit square for Block Two through Block Four.







13. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block Four square, in that order from left to right, to make the Top Border (Fig. 19).

14. Sew together (1) Block Four square, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Two square and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 20).



### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

15. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
16. Sew (1) 2" x 65 1/2" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 1/2" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
17. Sew (1) 6 1/2" x 68 1/2" Fabric L strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 1/2" x 63 1/2" Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
18. Layer and quilt as desired.
19. Sew the (8) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
20. Bind as desired.
