

1 ½ yards	Snowflakes - Black (B)	2234-99*
1 3/8 yards	Scenic Snowmen - Light Blue (C)	2228-11
²⁄₃ yard	Tossed Penguins - Light Blue (D)	2229-11
5∕8 yard	Snowflakes - Red (E)	2234-88
1 1/8 yards	Urban Legend - Hunter (F)	7101-66
²⁄₃ yard	Christmas Gifts - Black (G)	2230-99
½ yard	Snowflakes - White on White (H)	2235-01W
1 3/8 yards	Christmas Gift Tags - Green (I)	2227-66
5 yards	Snowman Collage - Green (Backing)	2231-66

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Christmas Panel-36 inches - Black (A):

• (1) $34 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $42 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Snowflakes - Black (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 37 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 54 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 48 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Scenic Snowmen - Light Blue (C), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 44 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 ½" x 46 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Tossed Penguins - Light Blue (D), cut:

• (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (15) 6 ½" squares.

From the Snowflakes - Red (E), cut:

• (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (28) 4 ½" squares.

From the Urban Legend - Hunter (F), cut:

- (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (28) 4 ½" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 63 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 68 ½" strips.

From the Christmas Gifts - Black (G), cut:

• (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (15) 6 ½" squares.

From the Snowflakes - White on White (H), cut:

• (9) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (52) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

From the Christmas Gift Tags - Green (I), cut:

- (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 71 ½" strips.
- (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 73 ½" strips.


From the Snowman Collage - Green (Backing), cut:

• (2) 89" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 81" x 89" back.


Block Assembly


Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 42 ½" Fabric A strip to each side of the 34 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 37 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to** measure 36 ½" x 44 ½".



- 2. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (13) Unit 1 rectangles total.
- 3. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (13) Unit 2 rectangles total.





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4. Place (1) 4 ½" Fabric F square on the bottom left corner of (1) Unit 1 rectangle, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 5).

- 5. Follow Figure 6 for the seam direction to add a 4 ½" Fabric F square to the lower right corner of the Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) Unit 3 rectangle (Fig. 7).
- 6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (13) Unit 3 rectangles total.









7. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figure 8 for component identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (13) Unit 4 rectangles.



8. Place (1) 4 ½" Fabric E square on the bottom right corner of (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Unit 5 square.





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
9. Place (1) 4 ½" Fabric F square on the bottom right corner of (1) 6 ½" Fabric G square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make a second Unit 6 square.





- 10. Sew together (4) Unit 3 rectangles and (3) Unit 4 rectangles, alternating them from top to bottom, to make the Left Side Border (Fig. 12).
- 11. Sew together (4) Unit 4 rectangles and (3) Unit 3 rectangles, alternating them from top to bottom, to make the Right Side Border (Fig. 13).





12. Sew together (3) Unit 3 rectangles and (3) Unit 4 rectangles, alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to the left end of the newly sewn strip and (1) Unit 6 square to the right end to make the Top Border (Fig. 14).



13. Repeat Step 12 and refer to Figure 15 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Bottom Border.


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Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 14. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 46 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 15. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 54 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 48 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 16. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.
- 17. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 18. Sew (1) 2" x 68 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 63 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 19. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 71 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 73 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 20. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 21. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 22. Bind as desired.
