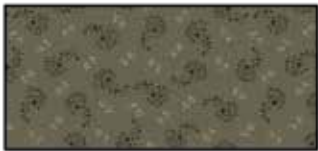

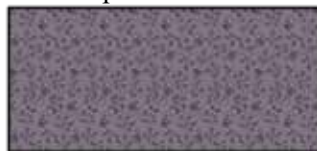

⅜ yard	Check - Gold (G)	2664-44
½ yard	Texture - Ivory (H)	2669-41
⅜ yard	Berries - Ivory (I)	2667-41
¼ yard	Ferns - Green (J)	2666-66
¼ yard	Ferns - Purple (K)	2666-55

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Floral Panel - 36 inches - Ivory (A), fussy cut:

- (1) 34 ½" square, centered on the large block.
- (4) 8 ½" squares, each centered on a small block.

From the Ferns - Teal (B), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 34 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 38 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 53 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 56 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 74 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 77 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ⅞" x 8 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ¼" x 8 ½" strips.

From the Check - Red (C), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Old Fashioned Floral - Teal (D), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Check - Cocoa (E), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Bouquet with Dot - Purple (F), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Check - Gold (G), cut:

- (3) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Texture - Ivory (H), cut:

- (5) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Berries - Ivory (I), cut:

- (3) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Ferns - Green (J), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Ferns - Purple (K), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Bouquet with Dot - Red (L), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Old Fashioned Floral - Cheddar (M), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Berries - Green (N), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Old Fashioned Floral - Cocoa (O), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Rings - Red (P), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Bouquet with Dot - Cheddar (Q), cut:

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ⅞" squares.

From the Border Stripe - Ivory (R), cut:

- (4) 9 ½" x 78" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.

From the Chicken Scratch - Cocoa (S), cut:

- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Bouquet with Dot - Ivory (Backing), cut:

- (3) 85" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 85" x 85" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 34 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the 34 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 38 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 37 1/2" x 37 1/2".**

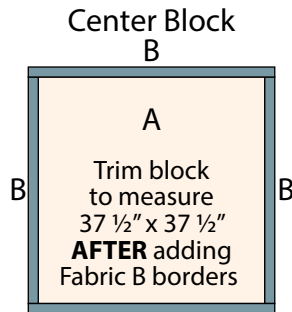

2. Place (1) 2 7/8" Fabric C square on top of (1) 2 7/8" Fabric G square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 1/2" square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (16) Unit 1 squares total.

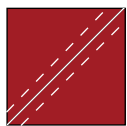

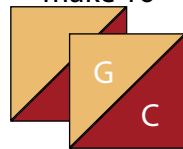

3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 5-23 for fabric identification and placement to make the indicated number of unit squares for Unit 2 through Unit 20.

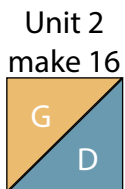

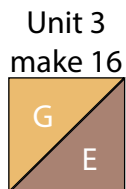

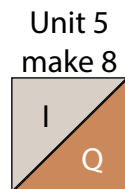

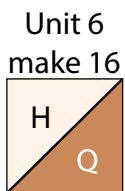

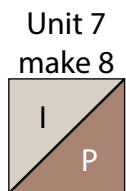

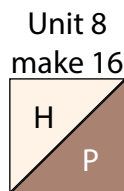

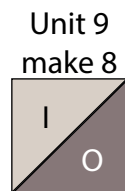

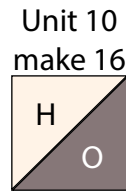

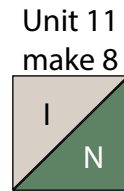

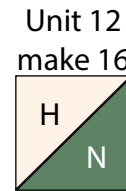

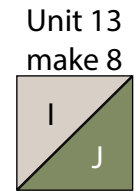

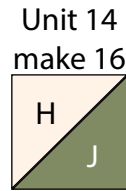

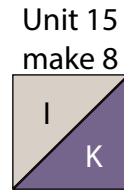

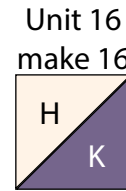

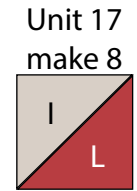

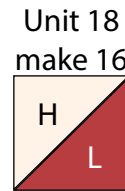

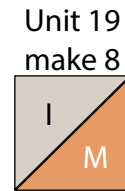

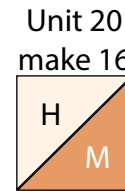

4. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to the left side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of (1) Unit 4 square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 4 1/2" Unit 21 square (Fig. 24). Repeat to make (16) Unit 21 squares total.

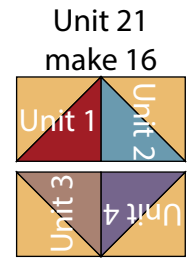

5. Sew together (2) Unit 6 squares to make (1) Unit 22 strip (Fig. 25). Repeat to make (8) Unit 22 strips total.

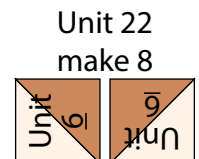

6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figures 26-32 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (8) of each unit strip for Unit 23 through Unit 29.

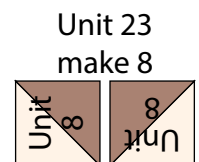

11. Sew together (1) $1\frac{7}{8}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, (1) Block Five square, (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, (1) Block Six square, (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, (1) Block Seven square, (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, (1) Block Eight square and (1) $1\frac{7}{8}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip in that order from left to right. Sew (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 43).

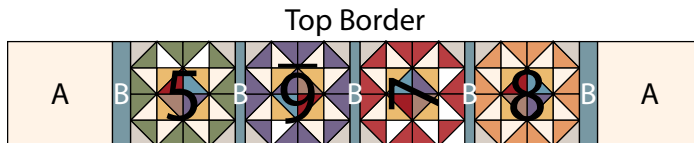

12. Sew together (1) $1\frac{7}{8}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, (1) Block Eight square, (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, (1) Block Seven square, (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, (1) Block Six square, (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, (1) Block Five square and (1) $1\frac{7}{8}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip in that order from left to right. Sew (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 44).

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

13. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

14. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

15. Sew (1) 2 " x $53\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Center (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x 78 " Fabric R strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

17. Repeat Step 16 to sew (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x 78 " Fabric R strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 45).

18. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 45), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

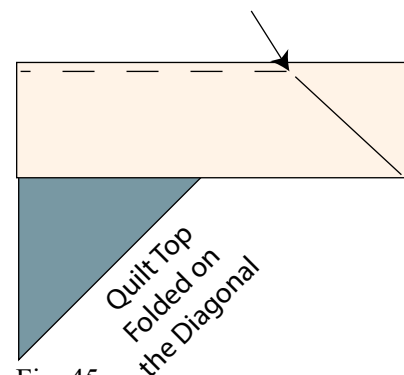


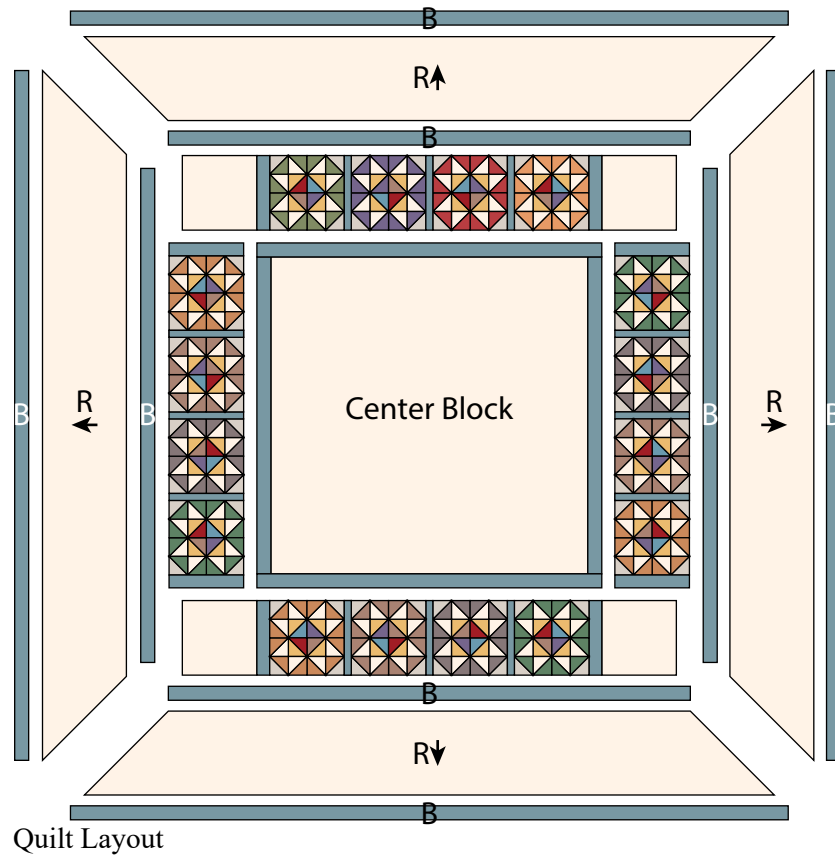

19. Sew (1) 2 " x $74\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 " x $77\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

20. Layer and quilt as desired.

21. Sew the (8) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric S strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

22. Bind as desired.
