

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Gingerbread House Panel - Red (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 42 ½" x 22" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Urban Legend - Navy (B), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 45 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 22" WOF strips.

From the Gingerbread Cookies and Candy - White (C), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x 32 ½" WOF strips.
- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 24 ½" WOF strips.

From the Blocks - White (D):

• Fussy cut (12) 7 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Urban Legend - Hunter (E), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" strips.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

From the Cups and Cookies - Blue (F), cut:

- (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 8 ½" squares.
- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Gingerbread Cookies - Red (G), cut:

• (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips.

From the Peppermints - White (H), cut:

• (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips.

From the Gingerbread Stripe - Blue (I), cut:

- (2) 7" x 84" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 7" x 68" LOF strips.

From the Gingerbread Cookie Collage - Tan (J), cut:

• (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.


From the Gingerbread Houses - Tan (Backing), cut:

• (2) 88" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 72" x 88" back.


Block Assembly

Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 22" Fabric B strip to each side of the 42 ½" x 22" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 45 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure 44** ½" x 24 ½".




2. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 24 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 1 rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 2).



3. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of (1) 7 ½" Fabric D square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 2 square

(Fig. 3). Trim the unit to measure 8 ½" x 8 ½". Repeat to make (12) Unit 2 squares total.




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
4. Sew together (2) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric G strips and (2) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric H strips, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Strip Set 1 (Fig. 4). Repeat to make a second Strip Set 1.

5. Cut the (2) Strip Set 1's into (24) 2 ½" x 8 ½" Unit 3 strips (Fig. 5).






6. Sew (2) Unit 3 strips together lengthwise and rotating the bottom strip 180-degrees to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (12) Unit 4 strips total.



7. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to the top of (1) Unit 2 square to make (1) Block One rectangle (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (6) Block One rectangles total.

8. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to the top of (1) Unit 4 strip to make (1) Block Two rectangle (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (6) Block Two rectangles total.





9. Sew together (2) Block One rectangles lengthwise. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric C strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 9).



10. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric F strip to the top of (1) Block One rectangle. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) newly sewn strip to each side of (1) Unit 5 square to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 10).



11. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric C strip to the bottom of (1) Unit 6 strip to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 11).





12. Sew (1) 8 ½" Fabric F square to the top of (1) Block One rectangle. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) newly sewn strip to each side of (1) Unit 7 strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 12).



13. Sew together (2) Block Two rectangles lengthwise. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric C strip to the top of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 8 square (Fig. 13).



14. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric F strip to the bottom of (1) Block Two rectangle. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) newly sewn strip to each side of (1) Unit 8 square to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 14).




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15. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric C strip to the top of (1) Unit 9 strip to make (1) Unit 10 strip (Fig. 15).



16. Sew (1) 8 ½" Fabric F square to the bottom of (1) Block Two rectangle. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) newly sewn to each side of (1) Unit 10 strip to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 16).



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
17. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 18. Sew (1) 2" x 64 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 19. Center (1) 7" x 84" Fabric I strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ½" from the top edge of the block and stop a ½" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 20. Repeat Step 19 to sew (1) 7" x 68" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 17).

21. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 17), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.




- 22. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 23. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric J strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 24. Bind as desired.



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
