Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Bones & Skulls - Purple (A), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

From the Cats in Moons - Dark Gray (B), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

From the Halloween Bats - Orange (C), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 ½" x 10 ½" strips and (2) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

From the Allover Pumpkins - Orange (D), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 13 ½" strips.

From the Signs - Brown (E), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

From the Skeletons on Crescent Moons - Black (F), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

From the Spiders - Gray (G), cut:

• (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

From the Witches on Brooms - Purple (H), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

From the Witches with Potion Bottles - Black (I), cut:

• (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 8 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

From the Pumpkins with Halloween Words - Black (J), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 13 ½" strips.

From the Urban Legend - Orange (K), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 13 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

From the Urban Legend - Dark Purple (L), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 13 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips and (2) 2 ½" x 5 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips and (2) 1 ½" x 5 ½" strips.

From the Urban Legend - Chartreuse (M), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" x 5 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2" x 9 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 5 ½" strips.

From the Urban Legend - Gray (N), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" x 5 ½" strips.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2" x 9 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 5 ½" strips.

From the Urban Legend - Black (O), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 5 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 5 ½" strips.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Cats in Moons - Dark Gray (Back), cut:

• (2) 48" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 48" x 62" back.

Page 2

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric K strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric F strip. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric F strip to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 rectangle.






2. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric M strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 8 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric I strip. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric M strip to the right side of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Unit 2 rectangle.




3. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric N strip to the left end of (1) 2 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric K strip. Sew the newly sewn strip to the bottom of (1) Unit 2 rectangle to make (1) 12 ½" Unit 3 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make a second Unit 3 square.



4. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric O strip to each side of (1) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric C strip. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric O strip to the top of the newly sewn block and (1) 2 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric O strip to the bottom to make (1) Unit 4 rectangle (Fig. 4). Repeat to make a second Unit 4 rectangle.




5. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric N strip to the bottom of (1) 5 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric E strip. Sew (1) 2" x 9 ½" Fabric N strip to each side of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 5 rectangle (Fig. 5). Repeat to make a second Unit 5 rectangle.




6. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric K strip to the right side of (1) 5 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric J strip. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric K strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 6 rectangle (Fig. 6). Repeat to make a second Unit 6 rectangle.



7. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric M strip to the left side of (1) $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric M strip to the right side of the Fabric H strip. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 11 ½" Fabric M strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 7 rectangle (Fig. 7). Repeat to make a second Unit 7 rectangle.



8. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric K strip to the right side of (1) Unit 7 rectangle to make (1) Unit 8 strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make a second Unit 8 strip.



9. Sew (1) Unit 4 rectangle to the left side of (1) Unit 5 rectangle. Sew (1) Unit 8 strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) 13 ½" x 15 ½" Unit 9 rectangle (Fig. 9). Repeat to make a second Unit 9 rectangle.



10. Sew (1) Unit 1 rectangle to the left side of (1) Unit 3 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 9 rectangle to the left side of (1) Unit 6 rectangle to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (1) 20 ½" x 27 ½" Block One rectangle (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Block One rectangle.





- 11. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric N strip to the left side of (1) 8 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric B strip. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric N strip to the right side of the Fabric B strip. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 11 ½" Fabric N strip to the top of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 10 rectangle (Fig. 11). Repeat to make a second Unit 10 rectangle.
- 12. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric L strip to the right side of the Unit 10 rectangle to make (1) Unit 11 strip (Fig. 12). Repeat to make a second Unit 11 strip.





- 13. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric L strip to each side of (1) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric L strip to the top of the newly sewn strip and (1) 1 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric L strip to the bottom to make (1) Unit 12 rectangle (Fig. 13). Repeat to make a second Unit 12 rectangle.
- 14. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric M strip to the top of (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip. Sew (1) 2" x 9 ½" Fabric M strip to each side of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 13 rectangle (Fig. 14). Repeat to make a second Unit 13 rectangle.

15. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric L strip to the right side of (1) 5 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric D strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric L strip to the top of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 14 strip (Fig. 15).

16. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric L strip to the left side of (1) 5 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric D strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric L strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 15 strip (Fig. 16)





17. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric O strip to each side of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric O strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric C strip to make (1) Unit 16 rectangle (Fig. 17). Repeat to make a second Unit 16 rectangle.




- 18. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 10 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric I strip. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric K strip to the right side of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 17 rectangle (Fig. 18). Repeat to make a second Unit 17 rectangle.
- 19. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric M strip to the left end (1) 2 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric L strip. Sew the newly sewn strip to the top of (1) Unit 17 rectangle lengthwise to make (1) Unit 18 square (Fig. 19). Repeat to make a second Unit 18 square.

20. Sew (1) Unit 12 rectangle to the left side of (1) Unit 13 rectangle. Sew (1) Unit 11 strip to the top of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 19 rectangle (Fig. 20). Repeat to make a second Unit 19 rectangle.



21. Sew (1) Unit 19 rectangle to the left side of (1) Unit 14 strip to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 16 rectangle to the left side of (1) Unit 18 square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (1) 20 ½" x 27 ½" Block Two rectangle (Fig. 21).



22. Repeat Step 21 and refer to Figure 22 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (1) Block Three rectangle.




Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 23. Sew (1) Block One rectangle to the left side of the Block Two rectangle to make the top row.

- 24. Sew the Block Three rectangle to the left side of (1) Block One rectangle to make the bottom row.
- 25. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make the quilt
- 26. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 27. Sew the (5) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric O strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 28. Bind as desired.
