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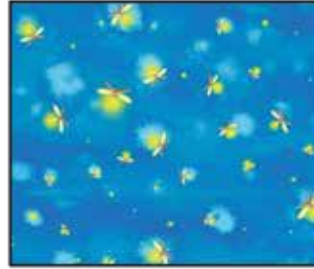

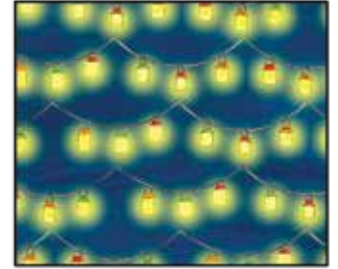

$\frac{1}{3}$ yard	Tossed Gnomes - Light Blue (G)	1444-70

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From Gnome Panel - Green (A), cut:

- (1) 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " panel.

From the Starlet - Red (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 76 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Gnome Blocks - Light Blue (C):

- Fussy cut (8) 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, each centered on a Gnome block.

From the Fireflies - Medium Blue (D), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2" x 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (8) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

From the String Lights - Dark Blue (E), cut:

- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ " LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.

From the Starlet - White (F), cut:

- (5) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (44) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Tossed Gnomes - Light Blue (G), cut:

- (2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Gnome Collage - Light Blue (H), cut:

- (2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Gnomes in Waterpark - Medium Blue (I), cut:

- (2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Campers - Green (J), cut:

- (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Gnome Stripe - Light Blue (K), cut:

- (2) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 95" LOF strips.
- (2) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 71" LOF strips.

From the Gnome Patch - Light Blue (Backing), cut:

- (2) 99" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 75" x 99" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".**

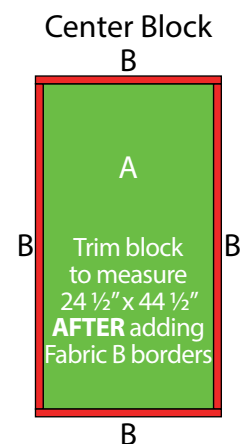

2. Sew (1) 2" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square. Sew (1) 2" x 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric C square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). **Trim the block to measure 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".** Repeat to make (8) Block One squares total.

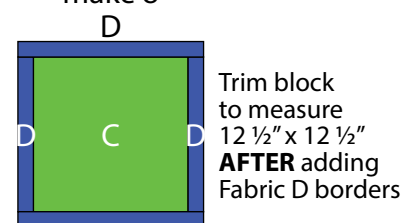

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3. Follow Figure 3 and sew together (8) 4 ½" Fabric F squares, (2) 4 ½" Fabric G squares, (2) 4 ½" Fabric H squares, (2) 4 ½" Fabric I squares and (1) 4 ½" Fabric J square into a 3 x 5 matrix to make (1) Block Two rectangle. Repeat to make a second Block Two rectangle.

4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figure 4 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Block Three rectangles.

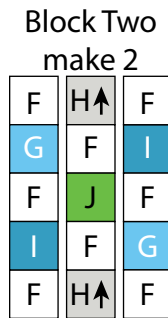

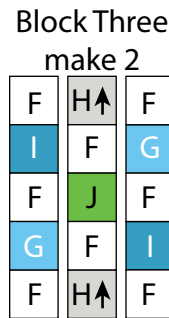

5. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric F square to the top and to the bottom of (1) 4 ½" Fabric H square to make the left column. Sew together (1) 4 ½" Fabric G square, (1) 4 ½" Fabric F square and (1) 4 ½" Fabric I square, in that order from top to bottom, to make the right column. Sew the (2) columns together lengthwise to make (1) Block Four rectangle (Fig. 5).

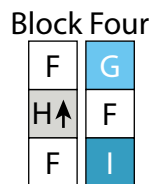

6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figures 6-8 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (1) Block Five rectangle, (1) Block Six rectangle and (1) Block Seven rectangle.

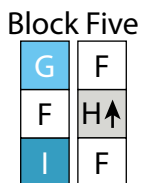

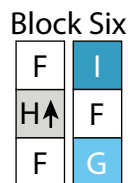

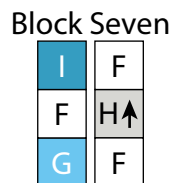

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

7. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 28 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

8. Sew (1) Block Two rectangle to the top and to the bottom of (1) Block One square. Sew the newly sewn strip to the left side of the Center Block.

9. Sew (1) Block Three rectangle to the top and to the bottom of (1) Block One square. Sew the newly sewn strip to the right side of the Center Block.

10. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Four rectangle, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Five rectangle and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right. Sew the newly sewn strip to the top of the Center Block.

11. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Six rectangle, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Seven rectangle and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right. Sew the newly sewn strip to the bottom of the Center Block.

12. Sew (1) 2" x 76 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 55 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Center (1) 6 ½" x 95" Fabric K strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

14. Repeat Step 13 to sew (1) 6 ½" x 71" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 9).

15. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 9), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

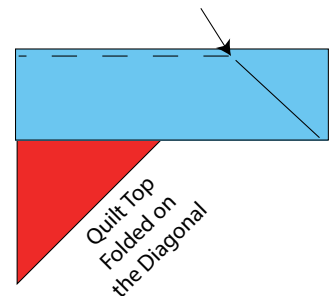

16. Layer and quilt as desired.

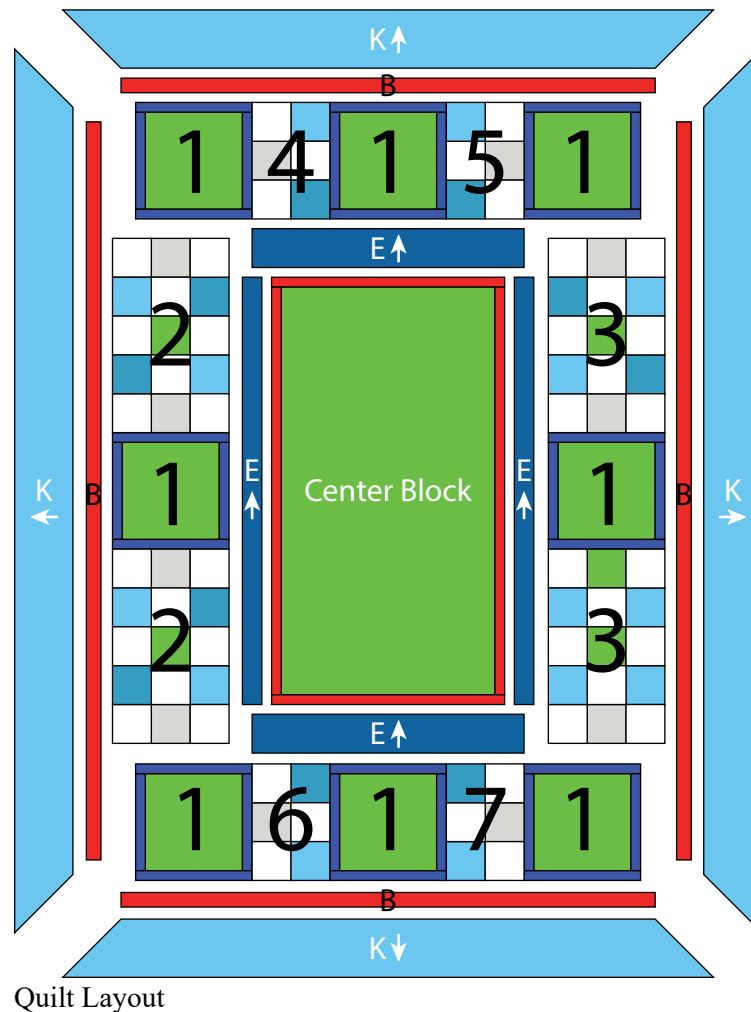
17. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric D strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

18. Bind as desired.

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
