



²⁄₃ yard	Urban Legend - Black (G)	7101-98
3/4 yard	Small Cannabis Leaves - White (H)	2065-01
3 ¹ / ₄ yards	Cannabis Candy - Black (Backing)	2069-99

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Cannabis Verbiage - Black (A), cut:

• See instructions to cut (1) Large Circle and (4) Small Circles.

From the Cannabis Leaves - White (B), cut:

- (1) 20 ½" WOF. Sub-cut (1) 20 ½" square and (2) 8 ¾" squares.
- (1) 8 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 8 1/8" squares.

From the Urban Legend - Hunter (C), cut:

• See instructions to cut (8) Large Leaves and (8) Small Leaves.

From the Lighters - Gray (D), cut:

- (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 10 ½" squares.
- (1) 8 %" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 8 %" squares.

From the Large Cannabis Leaves - Black (E), cut:

- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2" x 20 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 23 ½" WOF strips.

From the Cannabis Joints - Green (F), cut:

- (1) 8 \%" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 8 \%" squares.
- (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 8 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

From the Urban Legend - Black (G), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x 39 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 41 ½" WOF strips.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Small Cannabis Leaves - White (H), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x 41 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 ½" x 49 ½" strips.

From the Cannabis Candy - Black (Backing), cut:

• (2) 57" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 57" x 57" back.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

- 1. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
- 2. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
- 3. Refer to Figure 1 to arrange and press (1) Fabric A Large Circle onto the center of (1) 20 ½" Fabric B square.
- 4. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (1) Unit 1 square.




5. Place (1) 10 ½" Fabric D square on the top left corner of the Unit 1 square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 3).








6. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a 10 ½" Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 5).

- 7. Sew (1) 2" x 20 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the Unit 2 square. Sew (1) 2" x 23 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 6).
- 8. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 7 for component identification, placement and orientation to add (4) Fabric C Large Leaves to the Unit 3 square to make (1) Unit 4 square.











9. Place (1) 8 %" Fabric B square on top of (1) 8 %" Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 8). Sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 8). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 9) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 8 ½" square to make (2) Unit 5 squares (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (4) Unit 5 squares total.








10. Repeat Step 9 and refer to Figure 11 for fabric identification and placement to make (8) Unit 6 squares.



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11. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 12 for fabric identification and placement while using (4) 8 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric F strips and (4) Fabric A Small Circles to make (4) Unit 7 rectangles.

- 12. Sew together (1) Unit 5 square, (1) Unit 6 square, (1) Unit 7 square, (1) Unit 6 square and (1) Unit 5 square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 13). Repeat to make the bottom row.
- 13. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to the top and to the bottom of (1) Unit 7 square. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Unit 4 square to make the middle row (Fig. 13).
- 14. Sew the (3) rows from Steps 12-13 together lengthwise to make (1) Unit 8 square (Fig. 13).





15. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 14 for component identification, placement and orientation to add the (4) Fabric C Large Leaves and (8) Fabric C Small Leaves to the (4) corners of the Unit 8 square to make the 39 ½" x 39 ½" Center Block.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 16. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 39 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 17. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 49 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 18. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 19. Sew the (5) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and
- 20. Bind as desired.
