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

1/4 yard	Tossed Easter Eggs - Pink (A)	2462-22
3/8 yard	Circle Texture - Lime (B)	2461-60
1/4 yard	Starlet - Teal (C)	6383-Teal
3/8 yard	Tossed Jelly Beans - White (D)	2465-01
1/4 yard	Line Dots - Yellow (E)	2456-44
½ yard	Plaid - White (F)	2459-01*
1/4 yard	Starlet - Petal (G)	6383-Petal
1/4 yard	Floral - Coral (H)	2457-83
½ yard	Tossed Bunnies - White (I)	2466-01
1 ½ vards	Circle Dots - White (Backing)	2460-01

### **Runner Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

### From the Tossed Easter Eggs - Pink (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 ½" squares.

### From the Circle Texture - Lime (B), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ½" squares.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 38 ½" WOF strips.

### From the Starlet - Teal (C), cut:

• (1) 4 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (24) 4 1/4" triangles.

### From the Tossed Jelly Beans - White (D), cut:

- (1) 4 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (9) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (36) 4 1/4" triangles.
- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ½" squares.

### From the Line Dots - Yellow (E), cut:

• (1) 4 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (12) 4 1/4" triangles.

### From the Plaid - White (F), cut:

- (1) 4 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (24) 4 1/4" triangles.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

### From the Starlet - Petal (G), cut:

• (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2" squares.

#### From the Floral - Coral (H), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" square.

## Page 1

### From the Tossed Bunnies - White (I), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 4" x 14 ½" strips.
- (3) 4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4" x 45 ½" strips.


### From the Circle Dots - White (Backing), cut:

• (1) 53" x 29" WOF strip for the backing.

### **Runner Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) 3 ½" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) 6 ½" Fabric A square, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 2).






- 2. Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 3 ½" Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the 6 ½" Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 4).
- 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make a second Unit 1 square.





4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figure 5 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (1) Unit 2 square.



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5. Place (1) 2" Fabric G square on the top left corner of (1) 3 ½" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 7).





- 6. Follow Figure 8 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric G square to the lower right corner of the 3 ½" Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 9).
- 7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (12) Unit 3 squares total.






8. Sew (1) 4 ¼" Fabric E triangle and (1) 4 ¼" Fabric D triangle together along their long sides to make (1) 3 ½" Unit 4 square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (12) Unit 4 squares total.




9. Follow Figure 11 and sew (1) 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" Fabric C triangle and (1) 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" Fabric D triangle to opposite sides of (1) Unit 4 square to make (1) Unit 5 piece. Repeat to make (12) Unit 5 pieces total.




## Page 2

10. Follow Figure 12 and sew together (2) 4 ¼" Fabric F triangles, (1) 4 ¼" Fabric D triangle, (1) 4 ¼" Fabric C triangle and (1) Unit 5 piece to make (1) Unit 6 rectangle. The unit should measure 3 ½" x 6 ½". Repeat to make (12) Unit 6 rectangles total.



11. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of (1) Unit 6 rectangle to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 6 rectangle to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½" Block One square (Fig. 13). Repeat to make a second Block One square.



12. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of (1) Unit 6 rectangle to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 6 rectangle to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 14).



13. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of the Block Two square to make the Runner Center Block (Fig. 15).



### **Runner Assembly Instructions**

(Follow the Runner Layout in Figure 16 while assembling the runner top.)

- 14. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Runner Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 38 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Runner Center Block.
- 15. Sew (1) 4" x 14 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Runner Center Block. Sew (1) 4" x 45 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Runner Center Block to make the Runner top.
- 16. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 17. Sew the (4) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 18. Bind as desired.



3/8 yard	Easter Banners - White (A)	2455-01
⅓ yard	Circle Texture - Lime (B)	2461-60*
1/4 yard	Floral - Coral (C)	2457-83
1/4 yard	Tossed Jelly Beans - White (D)	2465-01
1 yard	Tossed Bunnies - White (Backs)	2466-01

<sup>\*</sup>Includes binding

Batting: (4) 19" x 16"

(Recommended: Air Lite® Colour Me 100% Cotton)

### **Place Mat Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

### From the Easter Banners - White (A), cut:

• (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 10 ½" squares.

### From the Circle Texture - Lime (B), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Floral - Coral (C), cut:

• (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3 ½" squares.

### From the Tossed Jelly Beans - White (D), cut:

• (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2" squares.

### From the Tossed Bunnies - White (Backs), cut:

• (2) 16" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 16" x 19" rectangles for the backs.

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### **Place Mat Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

19. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (4) Block Three squares total.



20. Place (1) 2" Fabric D square on the bottom left corner of (1) 3 ½" Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 18). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 18). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 19).





- 21. Follow Figure 20 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric D square to the upper right corner of the 3 ½" Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 7 square (Fig. 21).
- 22. Repeat Steps 20-21 to make (16) Unit 7 squares total.






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
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23. Paying attention to the unit orientation, sew together (4) squares from top to bottom to make (1) Block Four strip (Fig. 22). Repeat to make (4) Block Four strips total.



## Place Mat Assembly Instructions (Follow the Place Mat Layout in Figure 21 while assembling the runner top.)

24. Sew (1) Block Four strip to the left side of (1) Block Three square to make (1) Place Mat top (Fig. 23). Repeat to make (4) Place Mat tops total.



- 25. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 26. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press. Cut the strip into (4) equal lengths.
- 27. Bind as desired.
