#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Christmas Trees - Gray (A), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x 55 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strip.
- (1) 6 ½" x 41½" LOF strip.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (1) 6 ½" x 27 ½" WOF strip and (1) 6 1/2" x 20 1/2" WOF strip.

#### From the Cabins with Snow - White (B), cut:

• (2) 13 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 13 ½" squares.

#### From the Cardinals in Trees - Black (C), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (5) 6 ½" squares.

#### From the Winter Scene - White (D), cut:

• (2) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 6 ½" squares.

#### From the Deer - Black (E), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.

#### From the Houndstooth - Black (F), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 6 ½" squares.

#### From the Swirl with Dot - Red (G), cut:

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 62 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 52 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together to make (1) 1 ½" x 62 ½" strip.
- (2) 1 ½" x 41 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 34 ½" WOF strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x 27 ½" WOF strip.
- (2) 1 ½" x 20 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 13 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (13) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Tossed Snowmen - Red (H), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.

#### From the Large Multi-Colored Snowflake - Black (I), cut:

- (4) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 66 ½" strips.
- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 52 ½" strips.


#### From the Small Snowflake - Red (Backing), cut:

• (2) 86" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 72" x 86" back.


#### **Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.


1. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric A strip to the left side of (1) 1 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric G strip lengthwise to make (1) 7 ½" x 41 ½" Block One strip (Fig. 1).



2. Sew together (1) 6 ½" Fabric C square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 6 ½" Fabric E square, in that order from left to right, to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 2).



3. Sew together (1) 6 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric A strip, (1) 1 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) Unit 1 strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 3).




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
4. Sew together (1) 13 ½" Fabric B square, (1) 1 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) Unit 2 strip, in that order from left, to right to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 4).



5. Sew together (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) 6 ½" Fabric F square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, in that order from left to right, to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 5).



6. Sew together (1) 6 ½" Fabric E square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 6 ½" Fabric C square, in that order from left to right, to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 6).



7. Sew together the Unit 4 strip, (1) 1 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric G strip and the Unit 5 strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 7).




8. Sew together (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) 1 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 13 ½" Fabric B square, in that order from left to right, to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 8).



9. Sew together (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 6 ½" Fabric C square, in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Unit 8 strip (Fig. 9).



10. Sew together (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 6 ½" Fabric C square in that order from left to right. Sew the newly sewn strip to the top of (1) 1 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric G strip. Sew together (1) 6 ½" Fabric F square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square in that order from left to right. Sew the newly sewn strip to the bottom of the Fabric G strip to make (1) Unit 9 square (Fig. 10).




11. Sew together (1) Unit 8 strip, (1) 1 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) 13 ½" Fabric B square, (1) 1 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) Unit 9 square, in that order from left to right, to make (1) Unit 10 strip (Fig. 11).



12. Sew together (1) Unit 3 strip, (1) 1 ½" x 34 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) Unit 7 strip, (1) 1 ½" x 34 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) Unit 10 strip, in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) 34 ½" x 41 ½" Block Two rectangle (Fig. 12).






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13. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 27  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to the top of (1) 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 27  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 11 strip (Fig. 13).



14. Sew together (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 6 ½" Fabric C square in that order from left to right. Sew the newly sewn strip to the top of (1) 1 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric G strip. Sew together (1) 6 ½" Fabric E square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square in that order from left to right. Sew the newly sewn strip to the bottom of the Fabric G strip to make (1) Unit 12 square (Fig. 14).

15. Sew together (1) 13 ½" Fabric B square, (1) 1 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) Unit 12 square in that order from left to right. Sew the newly sewn strip to the top of the Unit 11 strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 13 strip (Fig. 15).



16. Sew together (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 6 ½" Fabric E square in that order from left to right. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 13 ½" Fabric G strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 13 ½" Fabric B square to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 14 strip (Fig. 16).



17. Sew together (1) Unit 13 strip, (1) 1 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) Unit 14 strip in that order from left to right. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric G strip to the top of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) 21 ½" x 41 ½" Block Three strip (Fig. 17).




18. Sew together (1) 6 ½" Fabric F square, (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip and (1) 6 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric A strip in that order from top to bottom. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 62 ½" Fabric G strip to the left side of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) 7 ½" x 62 ½" Block Four strip (Fig. 18).



19. Sew the Block One strip to the left side of the Block Two rectangle lengthwise. Sew the Block Three strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip. Sew the Block Four strip to the right side of the newly sewn strip to make the 48 ½" x 62 ½" Center Block (Fig. 19).



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
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#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 20. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 62 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 52 ½ Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 21. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 66 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block.
- 22. Sew (1) 6 ½" Fabric H square to each end of (1) 6 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric I strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

- 23. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 24. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 25. Bind as desired.
