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

1/4 yard	Houndstooth - Black (E)	2704-99
1/4 yard	Small Snowflake - Red (F)	2073-88
1 ² / ₃ yards	Large Multi Colored Snowflake - Black (G)

5⁄8 yard	Swirl with Dot - Black (H)	2705-99*
$3\frac{3}{4}$ yards	Tossed Snowmen - Red (Backing)	2701-88

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Winter Blocks - Gray (A):

• Fussy cut (6) 11 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Eclipse - White (B), cut:

- (4) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 3" x 11 ½" strips.
- (6) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 3" x 16 ½" strips.
- (7) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 3" squares.

From the Deer - Black (C), cut:

• (2) 10 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 10 ½" squares.

From the Swirl with Dot - Red (D), cut:

• (7) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 3" x 5 ½" strips.

From the Houndstooth - Black (E), cut:

• (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3" squares.

From the Small Snowflake - Red (F), cut:

• (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3 ½" squares.

From the Large Multi Colored Snowflake - Black (G), cut:

• (16) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (31) 3 ½" x 15 ½" strips.

From the Swirl with Dot - Black (H), cut:

• (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.


From the Tossed Snowmen - Red (Backing), cut:

• (2) 65" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 65" x 83" back.


Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 3" x 11 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 11 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 3" x 16 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 15 ½" x 15 ½". Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.




2. Place (1) 3" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 3" x 5 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 3).





3. Place another 3" Fabric B square on the right side of the 3" x 5 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (48) Unit 1 strips total.




Unit 1 make 48 D Fig. 5


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
5. Sew together (2) Unit 1 strips end to end to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (24) Unit 2 strips total.



6. Sew (1) 3" Fabric E square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) 10 ½" Fabric C square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 15 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.



7. Sew together (4) 3 ½" Fabric F squares and (3) 3 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric G strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make (1) 3 ½" x 57 ½" Block Three strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (5) Block Three strips total.




Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
8. Sew together (1) 3 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 3 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 3 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) Block One square and (1) 3 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric G strip in that order from left to right to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.

9. Sew together (1) 3 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 3 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 3 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric G strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) 3 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric G strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.

- 10. Sew together the (5) Block Three strips and (4) pieced rows from Steps 8-9 in numerical order, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the quilt top.
- 11. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 12. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 13. Bind as desired.



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
