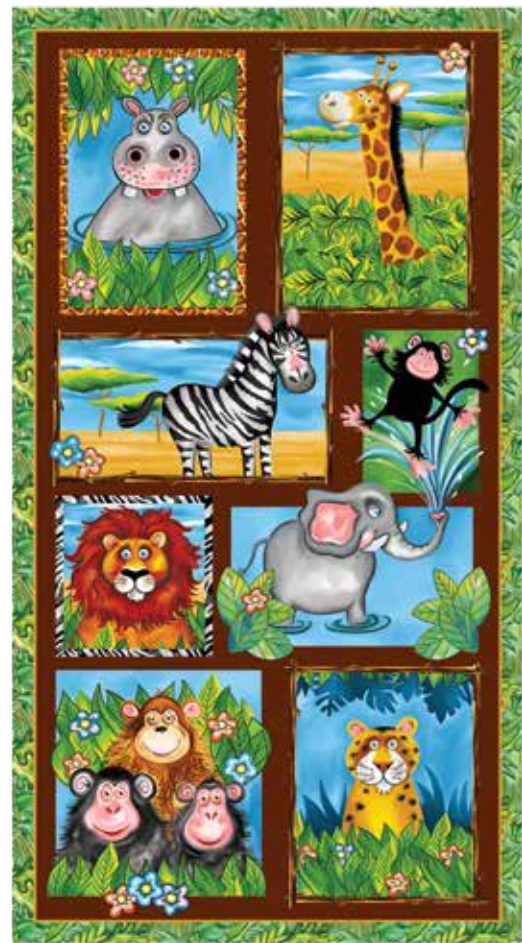

1 $\frac{1}{8}$ yards	Jot Dot - Brown (C)	9570-39
$\frac{1}{4}$ yard	Zebras - Light Gray (D)	2527-90
$\frac{1}{2}$ yard	Elephants - Light Gray (E)	2519-90
$\frac{1}{4}$ yard	Lions & Tigers - Amber (F)	2518-35
$\frac{1}{2}$ yard	Hippos - Light Gray (G)	2522-90
$\frac{1}{4}$ yard	Giraffes - Amber (H)	2521-35
1 $\frac{1}{8}$ yards	Jot Dot - Fog (I)	9570-93
2 yards	Mixed Jungle Animals - Amber (J)	2524-35
$\frac{5}{8}$ yard	Leaves - Green (K)	2520-66*

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Jungle Panel - 24 Inch - Green (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Jot Dot - Light Blue (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.

From the Jot Dot - Brown (C), cut:

- (3) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (6) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (34) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.

From the Zebras - Light Gray (D), cut:

- (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Elephants - Light Gray (E), cut:

- (2) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (7) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Lions & Tigers - Amber (F), cut:

- (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Hippos - Light Gray (G), cut:

- (2) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (7) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Giraffes - Amber (H), cut:

- (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Jot Dot - Fog (I), cut:

- (6) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (72) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 66 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Mixed Jungle Animals - Amber (J), cut:

- (2) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 69 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 61 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Leaves - Green (K), cut:

- (7) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Animal Skins - Amber (Backing), cut:

- (2) 87" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 69" x 87" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction.

Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

- Sew (1) 2" x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".**

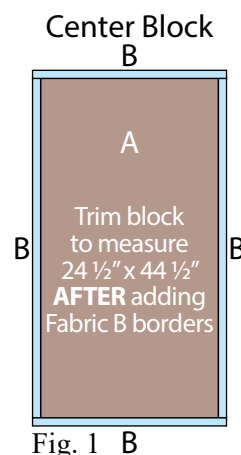

- Follow Figure 2 and sew together (2) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H squares, (2) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G squares, (2) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F squares, and (2) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E squares to make the Inner Left Side Border.

3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 3-5 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make the Inner Right Side Border, the Inner Top Border and the Inner Bottom Border.

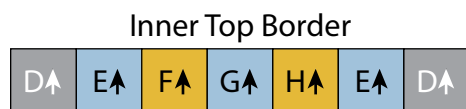

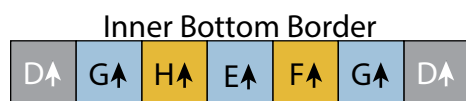

4. Place (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square on the left side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 7).

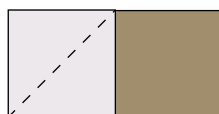

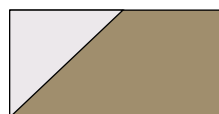

5. Place another $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square on the right side of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 9).

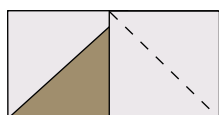

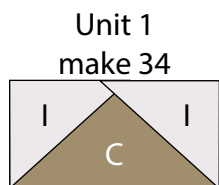

6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (34) Unit 1 strips total.

7. Paying attention to the orientation of the units, sew together (10) Unit 1 strips end to end to make the Outer Left Side Border (Fig. 10).

8. Paying attention to the orientation of the units, sew together (10) Unit 1 strips end to end to make the Outer Right Side Border (Fig. 11).

9. Paying attention to the orientation of the units, sew together (7) Unit 1 strips end to end. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Outer Top Border (Fig. 12).

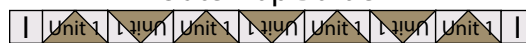

10. Paying attention to the orientation of the units, sew together (7) Unit 1 strips end to end. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Outer Bottom Border (Fig. 13).

Outer Bottom Border

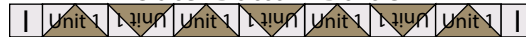

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

11. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 30 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

12. Sew the Inner Left Side Border and Inner Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

13. Sew the Inner Top Border and Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew the Outer Left Side Border and Outer Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

15. Sew the Outer Top Border and the Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

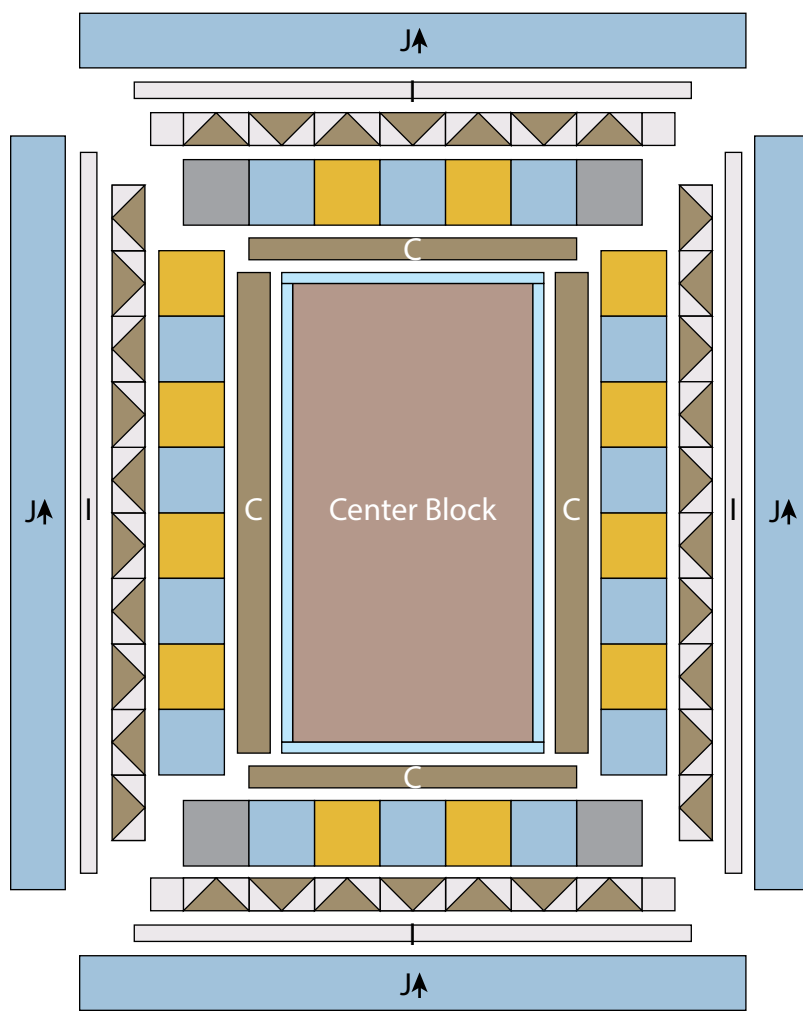
16. Sew (1) 2" x 66 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 69 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 61 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

18. Layer and quilt as desired.

19. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric K strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

20. Bind as desired.
