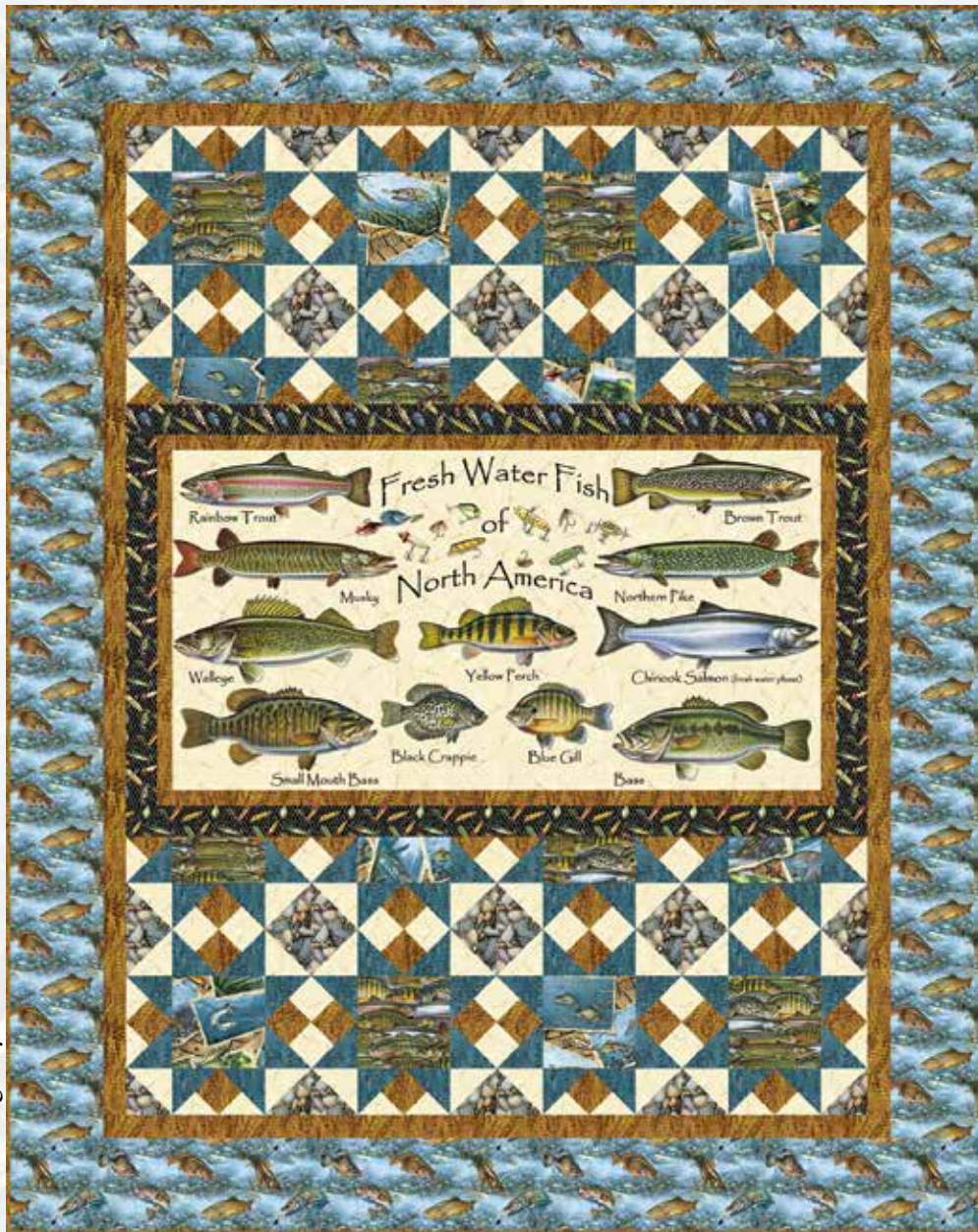

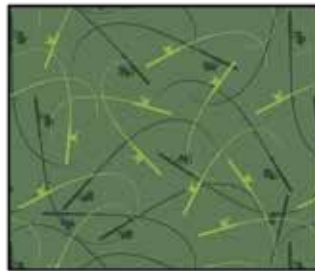

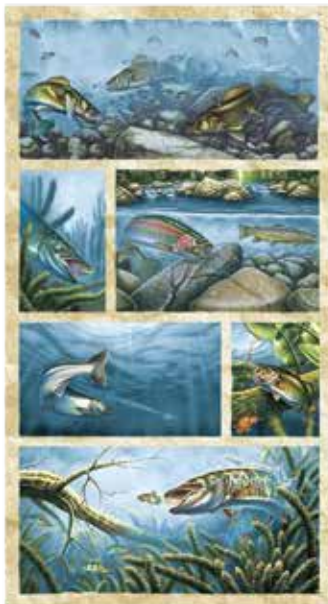

1 ¾ yards	Chameleon - Camel (B)	1178-35*
½ yard	Lures - Black (C)	1362-99
½ yard	Fish Collage - Olive (D)	1357-60
½ yard	Fish Postcards - Blue (E)	1356-70
⅔ yard	Chameleon - Slate (F)	1178-79
⅞ yard	Tossed Fishing Poles - Ivory (G)	1361-41
½ yard	Rocks - Gray (H)	1358-90
2 yards	Jumping Fish - Blue (I)	1359-70
5 yards	Patch - Green (Backing)	1360-66

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Descriptive Fish Panel - Ivory (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 42 ½" x 22 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Chameleon - Camel (B), cut:

- (3) 4 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (96) 4 ¼" triangles.
- (2) 2" x 22 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Lures - Black (C), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 24 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 48 ½" strips.

From the Fish Collage - Olive (D), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.
- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

From the Fish Postcards - Blue (E), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.
- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

From the Chameleon - Slate (F), cut:

- (5) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 3 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (96) 3 ⅞" triangles.

From the Tossed Fishing Poles - Ivory (G), cut:

- (3) 4 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (96) 4 ¼" triangles.
- (3) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 ⅞" squares.

From the Rocks - Gray (H), cut:

- (3) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 ⅞" squares.

From the Jumping Fish - Blue (I), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 67 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 6 ½" x 63 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Patch - Green (Backing), cut:

- (2) 87" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 71" x 87" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 22 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 42 ½" x 22 ½" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 45 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A Panel to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure 44 ½" x 24 ½"**.

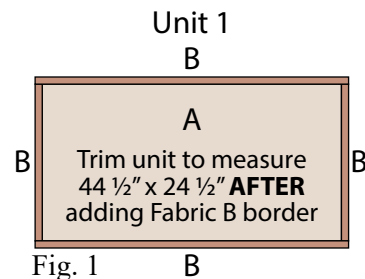

2. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 24 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 2).

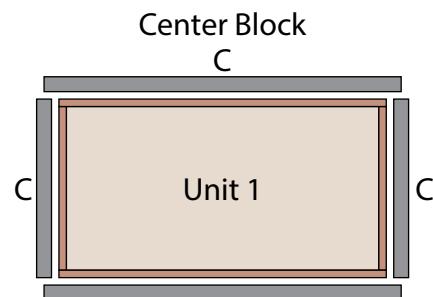

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Quilt 1

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3. Place (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric G square on top of (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric H, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 3). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 2 squares (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (48) Unit 2 squares total.

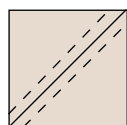

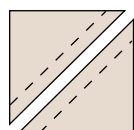

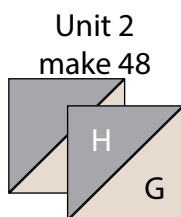

4. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric G triangle to (1) $4\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B triangle along one short side as shown. Sew (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric F triangle to the newly sewn triangle to make (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 3 square (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (48) Unit 3 squares total.

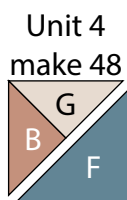

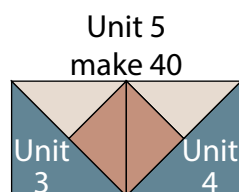

7. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to make the middle row. Sew the rows together to make (1) $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

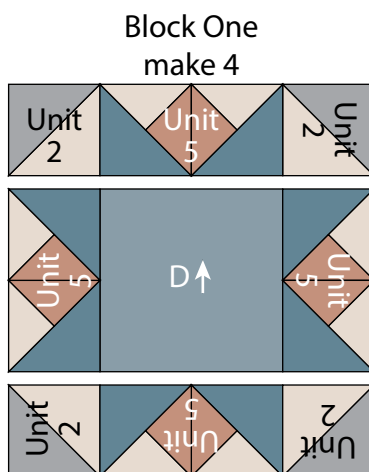

8. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to make the middle row. Sew the rows together to make (1) $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (4) Block Two squares total.

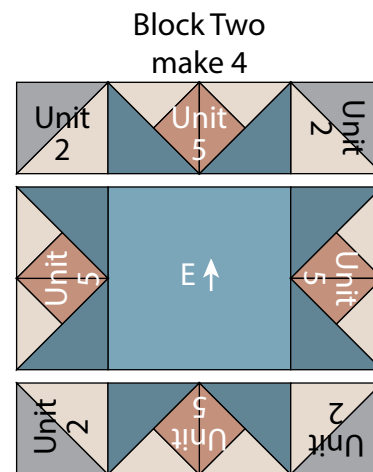

9. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to the right side of the Fabric E strip to make the bottom row. Sew the rows together to make (1) Block Three rectangle (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (2) Block Three rectangles total.

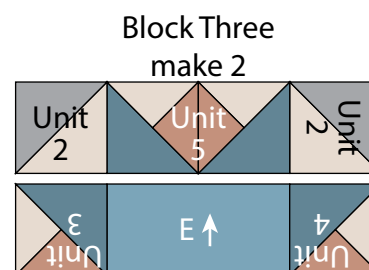

10. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to the right side of the Fabric D strip to make the bottom row. Sew the rows together to make (1) Block Four rectangle (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (2) Block Four rectangles total.

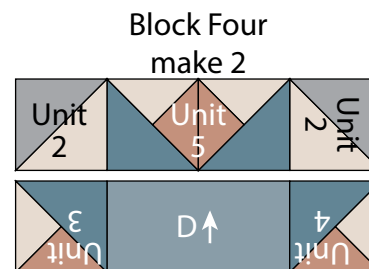

11. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to the left side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric D strip. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the right side of the Fabric D strip to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip as shown to make the bottom row. Sew the rows together to make (1) Block Five rectangle (Fig. 13). Repeat to make a second Block Five rectangle.

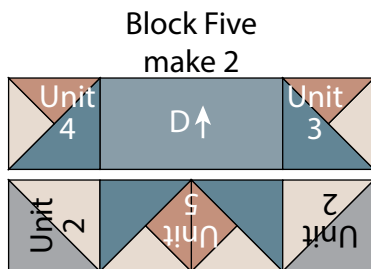

12. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to the left side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric E strip. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the right side of the Fabric E strip to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip as shown to make the bottom row. Sew the rows together to make (1) Block Six rectangle (Fig. 14). Repeat to make a second Block Six rectangle.

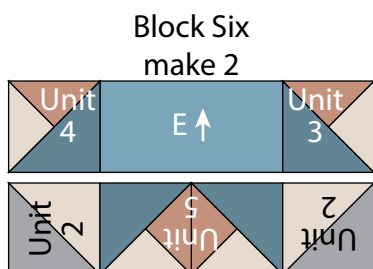

13. Sew together (2) Block One squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 15).

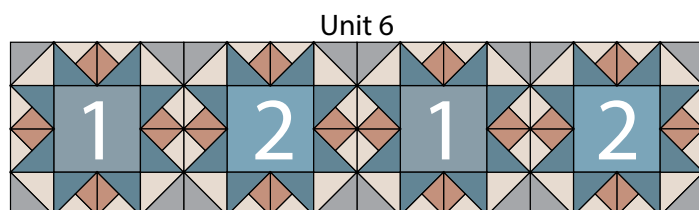

14. Sew together (2) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 16).

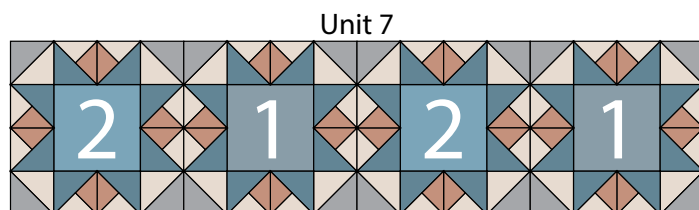

15. Sew together (2) Block Three rectangles and (2) Block Four rectangles, alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Unit 8 strip (Fig. 17).

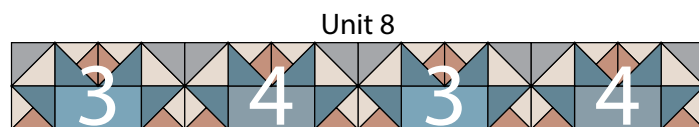

16. Sew together (2) Block Five rectangles and (2) Block Six rectangles, alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 18).

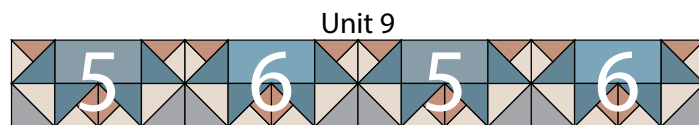

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

17. Sew (1) Unit 8 strip to the top of the Center Block. Sew (1) Unit 9 strip to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip to the top of the Center Block. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to the bottom of the Center Block.

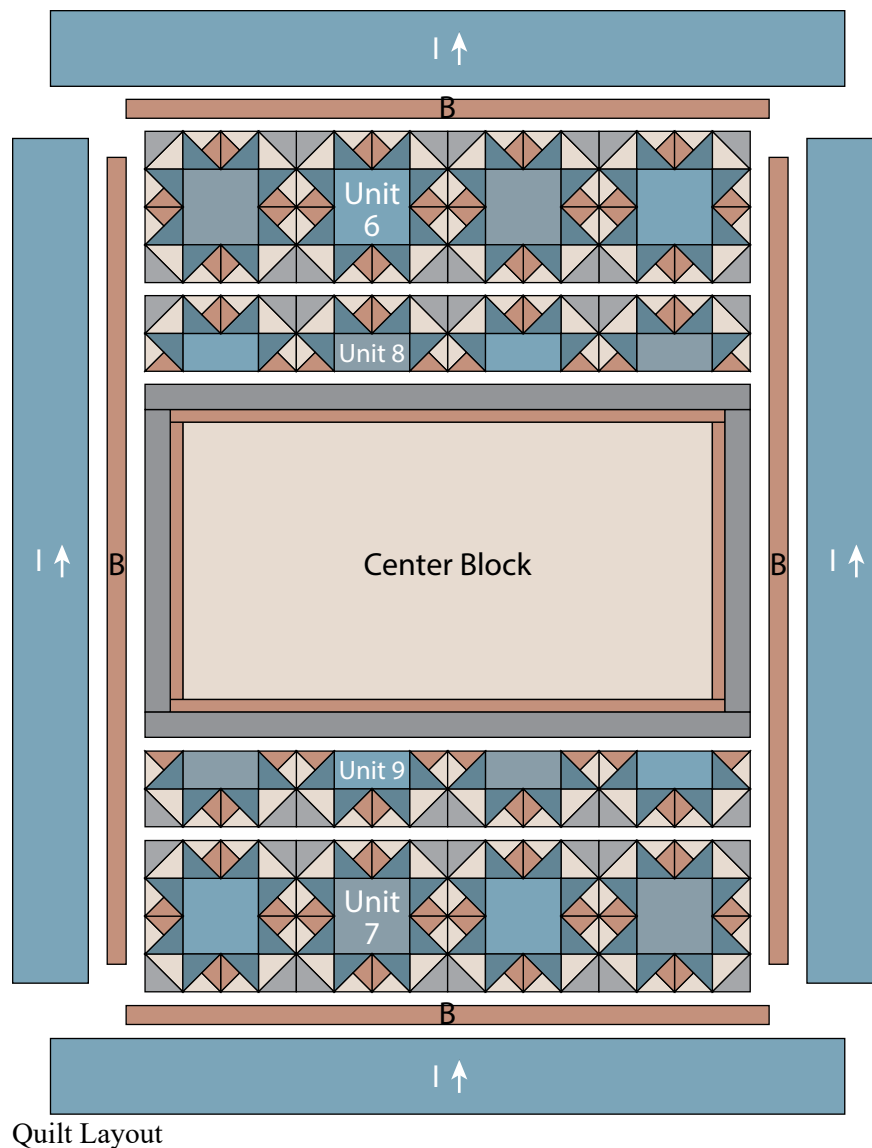
19. Sew (1) $2'' \times 64\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2'' \times 51\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

20. Sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 67\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 63\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

21. Layer and quilt as desired.

22. Sew the (8) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times$ WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

23. Bind as desired.
