

⅓ yard	Tossed Hot Air Balloon - Blue (C)	2447-11
1/4 yard	Tossed Kokopelli and Sun - Royal (D)	2451-75
5/8 yard	Tossed Frog - White (E)	2446-01
5/8 yard	Sun - Black (F)	2448-99
2 ½ yards	Border Stripe - Royal (G)	2452-75
5 1/4 yards	Tonal Sun - Royal (Backing)	2444-75

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24 Inch Banner Panel - Black (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 43" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Urban Legend - Red (B), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 43" strips.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 ½" WOF strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 66 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 53 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Tossed Hot Air Balloon - Blue (C), cut:

- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 44 ½" strips.
- (2) 4" x 36 ½" WOF strips.

From the Tossed Kokopelli and Sun - Royal (D), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 6 ½" squares.

From the Tossed Frog - White (E), cut:

• (5) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

From the Sun - Black (F), cut:

• (5) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (28) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

From the Border Stripe - Royal (G), cut:

- (2) 8 ½" x 88" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 8 ½" x 73" LOF strips.

From the Tonal Sun - Royal (Backing), cut:

• (2) 92" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 77" x 92" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 43" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 43" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 24 ½" x 44 ½".



Side Border make 2

- 2. Follow Figure 2 and sew together (8) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric E strips, (8) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric F strips and (1) 6 1/2" Fabric D square to make (1) Side Border. Repeat to make a second Side Border.
- 3. Sew (7) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric E strips and (6) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric F strips together lengthwise and alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 3). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.


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Quilt Top Assembly


(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 4. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block.

- 5. Sew (1) 4" x 36 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 6. Sew (1) 2" x 51 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 39 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 7. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block.
- 8. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 9. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 66 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 53 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 10. Center (1) 8 ½" x 88" Fabric G strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 11. Repeat Step 10 to sew (1) 8 ½" x 73" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 4).
- 12. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 4), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



13. Layer and quilt as desired.

- 14. Sew the (8) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 15. Bind as desired.
