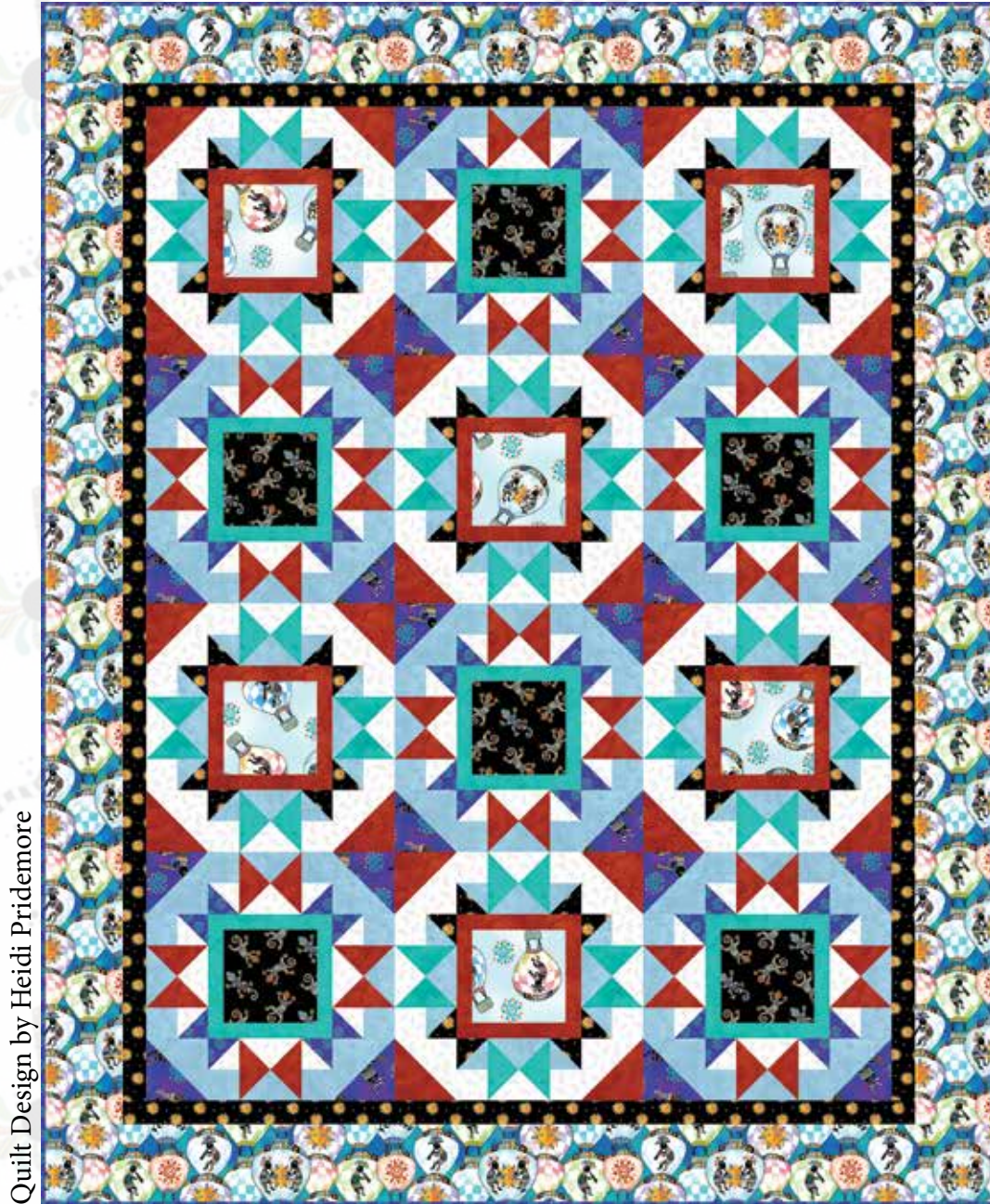

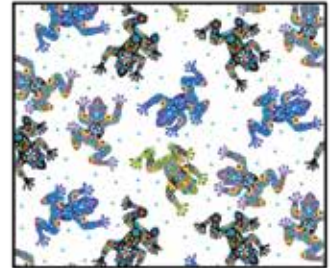

¼ yard	Tossed Hot Air Balloon - Blue (A)	2447-11
1 yard	Urban Legend - Terra (B)	7101-33
⅔ yard	Sun - Black (C)	2448-99
1 ⅛ yards	Urban Legend - Light Blue (D)	7101-11
⅔ yard	Urban Legend - Turquoise (E)	7101-75
1 ⅛ yards	White on White Kokopelli - White (F)	2443-01W
¼ yard	Tossed Gecko - Black (G)	2445-99
¾ yard	Tonal Sun - Royal (H)	2444-75*
⅜ yard	Tossed Kokopelli and Sun - Royal (I)	2451-75
1 ⅓ yards	Collage - Teal (J)	2450-71
4 ¾ yards	Tossed Small Kokopelli - White (Backing)	2449-01

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the Tossed Hot Air Balloon - Blue (A), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 6 ½" squares.

From the Urban Legend - Terra (B), cut:

- (2) 5 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 5 ¼" triangles.
- (2) 4 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ⅞" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

From the Sun - Black (C), cut:

- (2) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ⅞" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" strips.

From the Urban Legend - Light Blue (D), cut:

- (2) 5 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 5 ¼" triangles.
- (2) 4 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ⅞" squares.
- (2) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ⅞" squares.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

From the Urban Legend - Turquoise (E), cut:

- (2) 5 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 5 ¼" triangles.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

From the White on White Kokopelli - White (F), cut:

- (2) 5 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 5 ¼" triangles.
- (2) 4 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ⅞" squares.
- (2) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ⅞" squares.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

From the Tossed Gecko - Black (G), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 6 ½" squares.

From the Tonal Sun - Royal (H), cut:

- (2) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ⅞" squares.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Tossed Kokopelli and Sun - Royal (I), cut:

- (2) 4 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ⅞" squares.

From the Collage - Teal (J), cut:

- (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 67 ½" strips.
- (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 61 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Small Kokopelli - White (Backing), cut:

- (2) 85" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 69" x 85" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

2. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric G square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Unit 2 squares total.

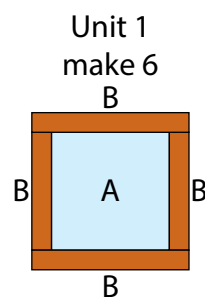

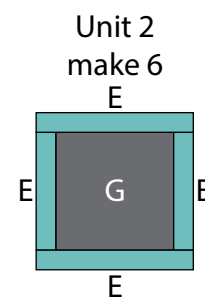

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3. Place (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric F square on top of (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric B square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 3). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 3 squares (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (24) Unit 3 squares total.

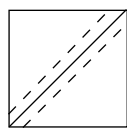

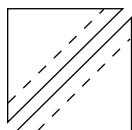

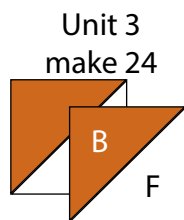

4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification and placement to make (24) Unit 4 squares.

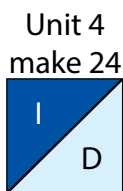

5. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figure 7 for fabric identification and placement while using (24) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric C squares and (24) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D squares to make (48) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 5 squares.

6. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figure 8 for fabric identification and placement while using (24) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric H squares and (24) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric F squares to make (48) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 6 squares.

7. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to the top of (1) Unit 5 square to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (24) Unit 7 strips total.

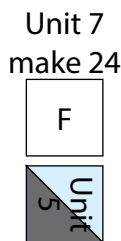

8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figures 10-12 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (24) Unit 8 strips, (24) Unit 9 strips and (24) Unit 10 strips.

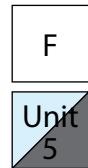

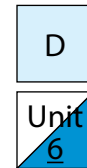

9. Follow Figure 13 and sew together (2) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric E triangles, (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F triangle and (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric D triangle to make (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 11 square. Repeat to make (24) Unit 11 squares total.

10. Follow Figure 14 and sew together (2) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B triangles, (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric D triangle and (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F triangle to make (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 12 square. Repeat to make (24) Unit 12 squares total.

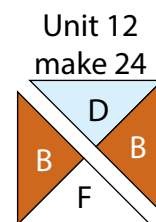

11. Sew together (1) Unit 7 strip, (1) Unit 11 square and (1) Unit 8 strip, in that order from left to right, to make (1) Unit 13 strip (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (24) Unit 13 strips total.

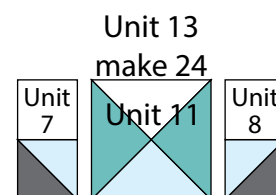

12. Sew together (1) Unit 9 strip, (1) Unit 12 square and (1) Unit 10 strip, in that order from left to right, to make (1) Unit 14 strip (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (24) Unit 14 strips total.

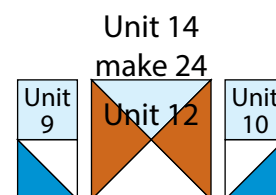

13. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of (1) Unit 13 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 13 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 16 ½" Block One square (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

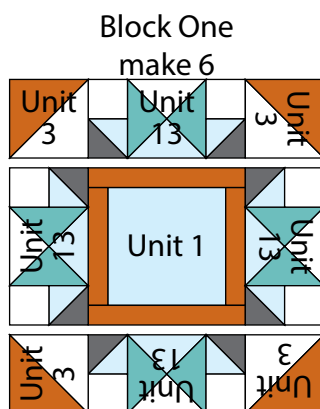

14. Repeat Step 13 and refer to Figure 18 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (6) Block Two squares.

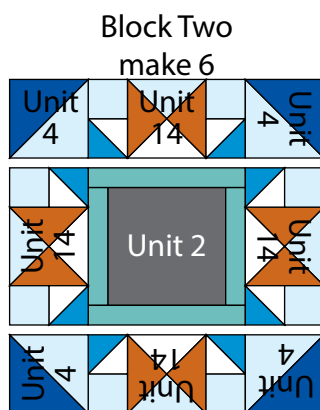

15. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 19). Repeat to make Row Three.

16. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 19). Repeat to make Row Four.

17. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 15-16, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 48 ½" x 64 ½" Center Block (Fig. 19).

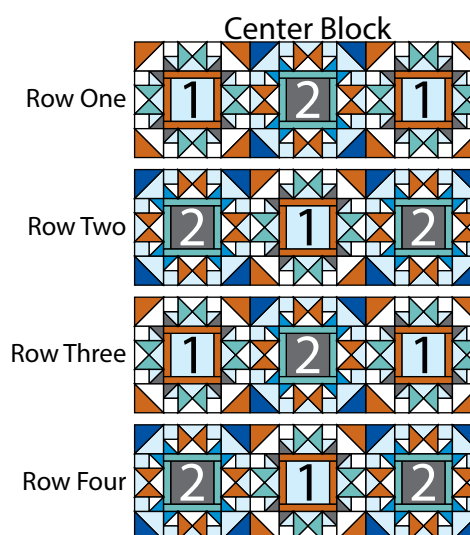

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

18. Sew (1) 2" x 64 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 67 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 61 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

20. Layer and quilt as desired.

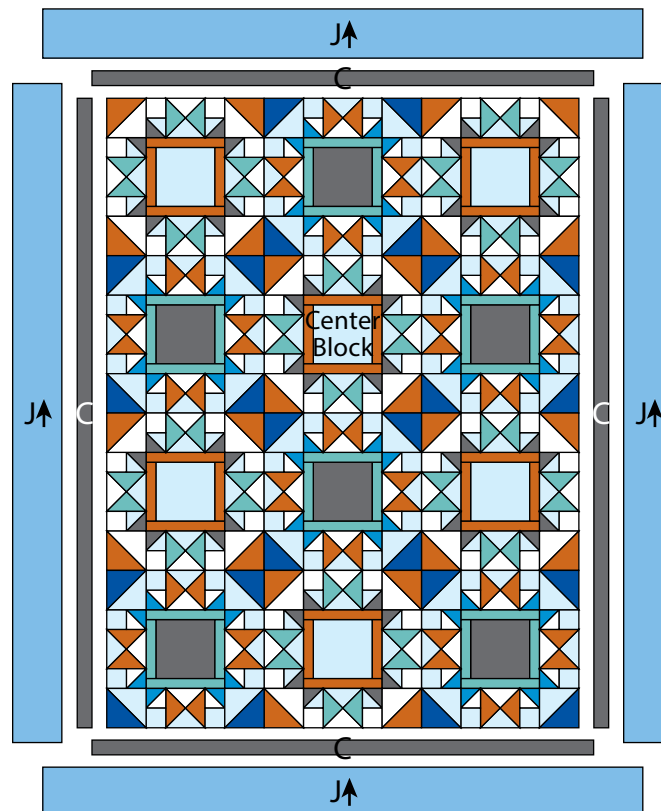
21. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

22. Bind as desired.
