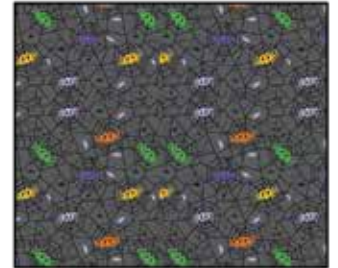

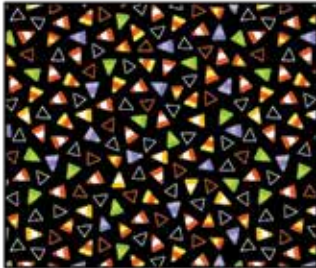

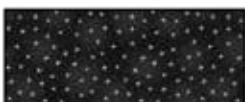

2/3 yard	Spiders on Spider Web - Gray (B)	2734-95
1/4 yard	Tossed Trick or Treaters - Orange (C)	2740-33
1/3 yard	Ghosts & Goblins - Green (D)	2739-66
1/2 yard	Starlet - Lilac (E)	6383-Lilac
1/2 yard	Candy Corn - Black (F)	2735-99
1/3 yard	Bats - Orange (G)	2736-33
3/8 yard	Starlet - Orange (H)	6383-Orange
1/4 yard	Starlet - Black (I)	6383-Black
3/8 yard	Plaid - Orange (J)	2738-33
1 1/8 yards	Starlet - Papaya (K)	6383-Papaya*
1 1/4 yards	Halloween Pumpkins - Black (L)	2733-99
3 1/2 yards	Tossed Halloween Candy - Light Purple (Backing)	2742-50

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Halloween Blocks - Black (A):

- Fussy cut (6) 10 1/2" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Spiders on Spider Web - Gray (B), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/2" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 1/2" strips.

From the Tossed Trick or Treaters - Orange (C), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 1/2" squares.

From the Ghosts & Goblins - Green (D), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Starlet - Lilac (E), cut:

- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (72) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Candy Corn - Black (F), cut:

- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Bats - Orange (G), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Starlet - Orange (H), cut:

- (1) 2 7/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 7/8" squares.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Starlet - Black (I), cut:

- (1) 2 7/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 7/8" squares.

From the Plaid - Orange (J), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 1/2" WOF strips.

From the Starlet - Papaya (K), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 51 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 43 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Halloween Pumpkins - Black (L), cut:

- (6) 6 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 6 1/2" x 55 1/2" strips.

From the Tossed Halloween Candy - Light Purple (Backing), cut:

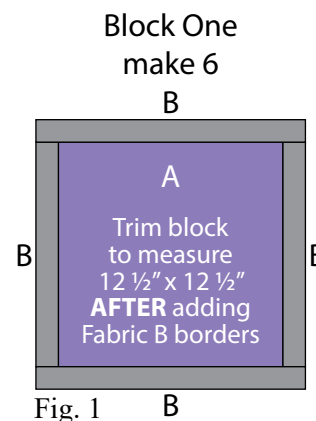
- (2) 63" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 63" x 75" back.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 10 1/2"

Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 13 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2"**. Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



2. Place (1) 2 1/2" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) 4 1/2" Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 3).

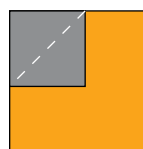

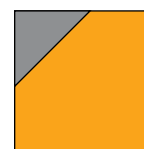

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3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the 4 ½" Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (6) Unit 1 squares.

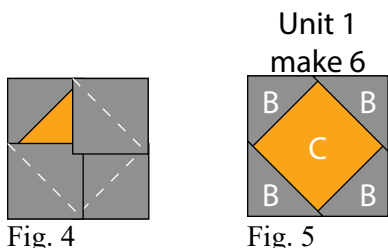

5. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 7).

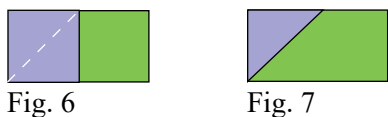

6. Place another 2 ½" Fabric E square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 9).

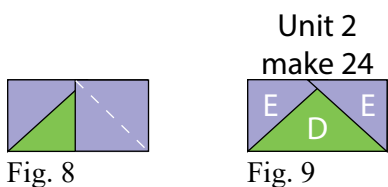

8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figures 10-11 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (24) Unit 3 strips and (24) Unit 4 strips.

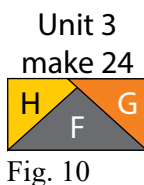

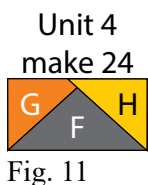

9. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 8 ½" Unit 5 square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (6) Unit 5 squares total.

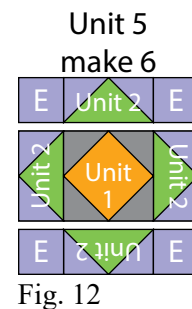

10. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the left end of (1) Unit 4 strip, along the Fabric G sides, to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (24) Unit 6 strips total.

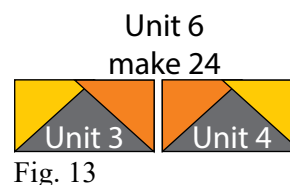

11. Place (1) 2 ⅞" Fabric H square on top of (1) 2 ⅞" Fabric I square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 14). Sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 14). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 15) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 ½" square to make (2) Unit 7 squares (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (24) Unit 7 squares total.

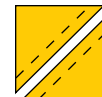

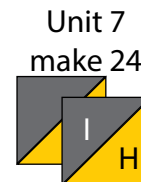

12. Sew (1) Unit 7 square to each end of (1) Unit 6 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip to each side of (1) Unit 5 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.

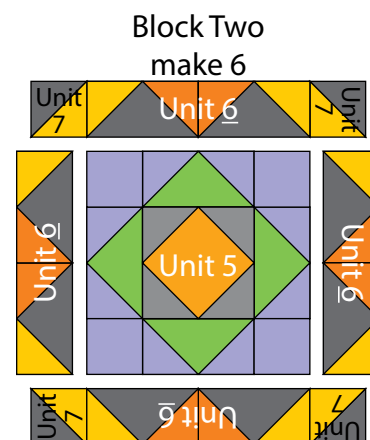

13. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 18). Repeat to make Row Three.

14. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 18). Repeat to make Row Four.

15. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 13-14 lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom to make $36\frac{1}{2}'' \times 48\frac{1}{2}''$ Center Block (Fig. 18).

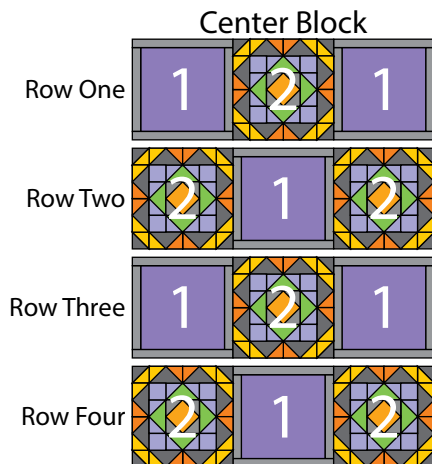

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

16. Sew (1) $2'' \times 48\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2'' \times 39\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

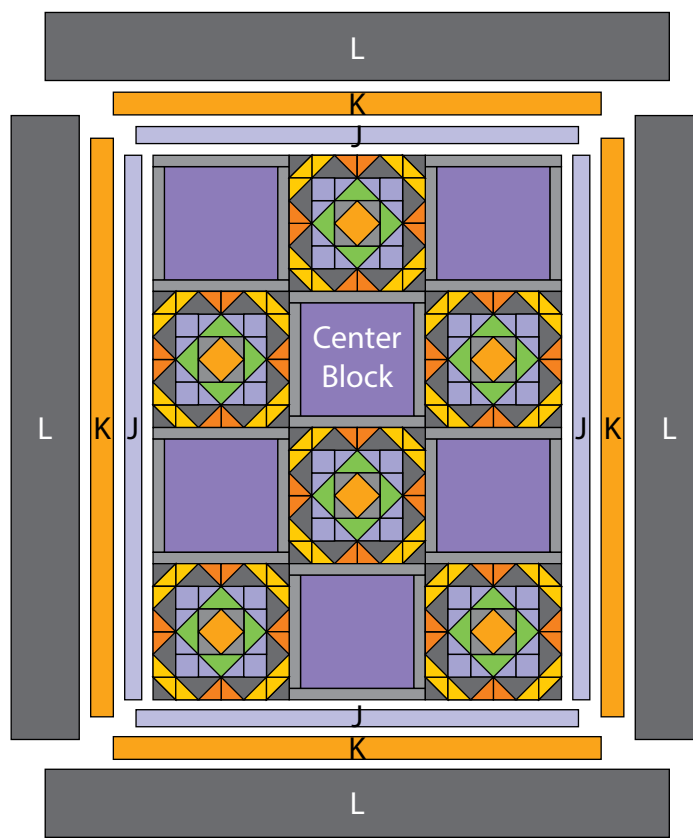
17. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 51\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 43\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 55\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric L strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 55\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

19. Layer and quilt as desired.

20. Sew the (7) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times \text{WOF}$ Fabric K strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

21. Bind as desired.
