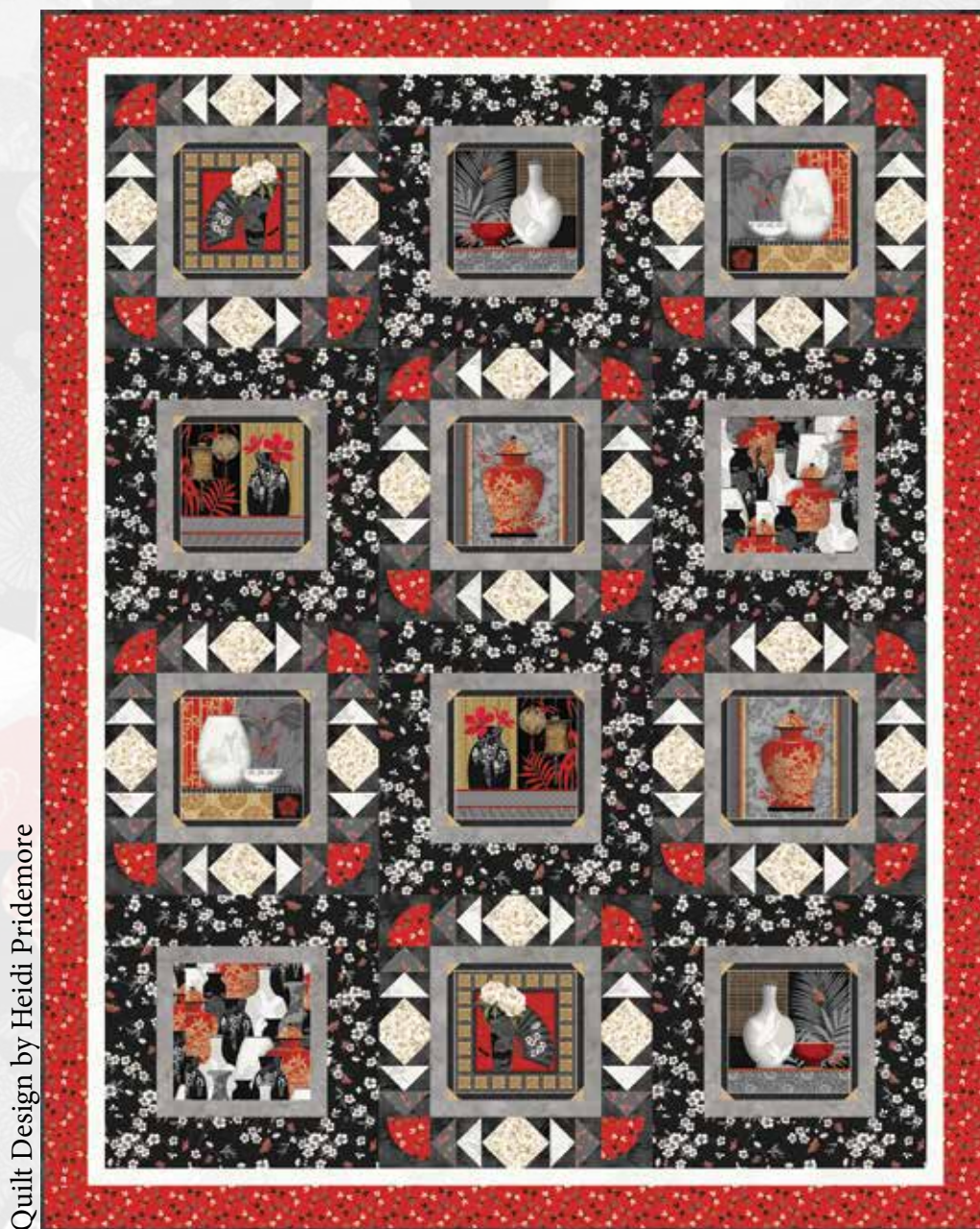

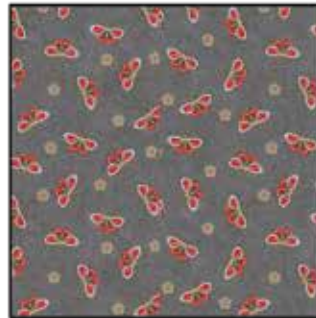

1 ⅛ yards	Urban Legend - Gray (B)	7101-90
⅞ yard	Dragonflies - Red (C)	9934-88
1 ⅔ yards	Urban Legend - Black (D)	7101-98*
⅓ yard	Mini Butterflies - Gray (E)	9935-95
⅓ yard	Birds on Branches - Off White (F)	9930-01
⅓ yard	Peonies - Ivory (G)	9933-41
1 yard	Cherry Blossom - Charcoal (H)	9929-99
⅓ yard	Vases - Red (I)	9927-88
⅜ yard	Urban Legend - White (J)	7101-01
3 ½ yards	Wisteria - Black (Backing)	9937-99

### Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Blocks with Vases - Gray (A):

- Fussy cut (10) 8 ½" squares each centered on a block.

#### From the Urban Legend - Gray (B), cut:

- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

#### From the Dragonflies - Red (C), cut:

- (4) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3" x 66 ½" strips.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3" x 55 ½" strips.
- (24) Template 2 quarter circles.

#### From the Urban Legend - Black (D), cut:

- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.
- (14) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (288) 2" squares.
- (24) Template 1 shapes.

#### From the Mini Butterflies - Gray (E), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2" x 3 ½" strips.

#### From the Birds on Branches - Off White (F), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2" x 3 ½" strips.

#### From the Peonies - Ivory (G), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles.

#### From the Cherry Blossom - Charcoal (H), cut:

- (6) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 3 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub cut (12) 3 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

#### From the Vases - Red (I), cut:

- (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 8 ½" squares.

#### From Urban Legend - White, cut:

- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.

#### From the Wisteria - Black (Backing), cut:

- (2) 63" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 63" x 79" back.

### Block Assembly

(Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.)

- Sew (1) 2 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the (1) 8 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square. Trim the block to measure 10 ½" square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (10) Unit 1 squares total.

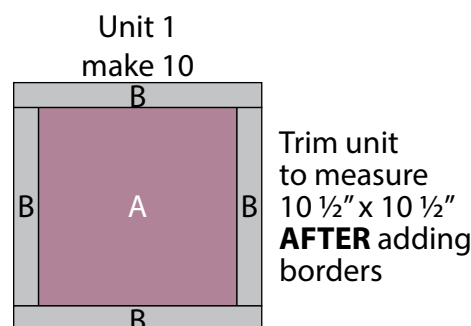

- Sew (1) 3 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 block. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 block to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

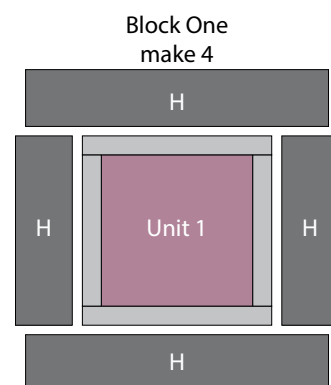

- Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric I square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric I square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make a second Unit 3 square.

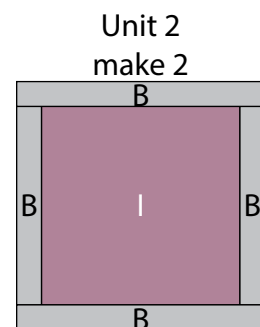

4. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $16\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make a second Block Two square.

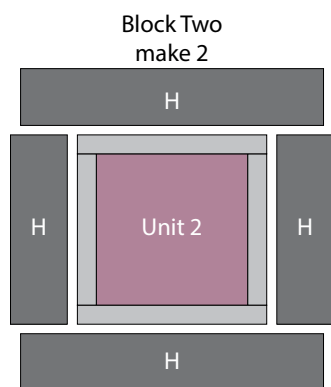

5. Find and mark the center of the Fabric D Template 1 background piece and the Fabric C-Template 2 arc piece.

6. Align the arc and background pieces, right sides together, matching the center mark on each piece. Pin the (2) pieces together at the center mark, then at each end. Continue to pin as needed. Carefully sew the (2) pieces together using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam (Fig. 5). Flip open the sewn unit and press to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 6). Unit should measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

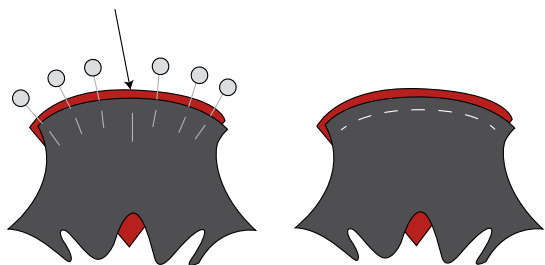

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (24) Unit 3 squares.

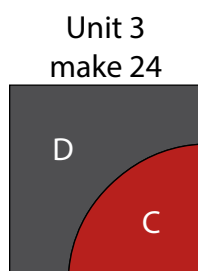

8. Place (1) 2" Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 2" x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 7). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 8).

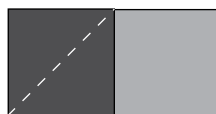

9. Place another 2" Fabric D square on the right side of the 2" x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 9). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Flip open the triangle formed and press to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 10).

10. Repeat Steps 8-9 to make (48) Unit 4 strips total.

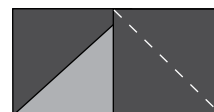

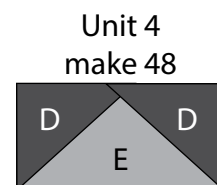

11. Repeat Steps 8-9 and refer to Figure 11 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (48) Unit 5 strips.

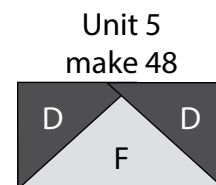

12. Place (1) 2" Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, right sides together (Fig. 12). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 12). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 13).

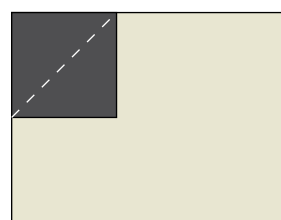

13. Follow Figure 14 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G rectangle to make (1) Unit 6 rectangle (Fig. 15).

14. Repeat Steps 12-13 to make (24) Unit 6 rectangles total.

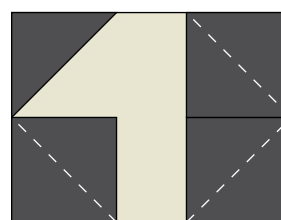

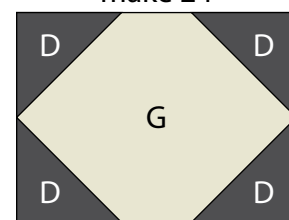

15. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) Unit 6 rectangle lengthwise. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each end of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (24) Unit 7 strips total.

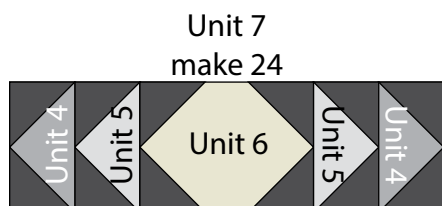

16. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of (1) Unit 7 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (6) Block Three squares total.

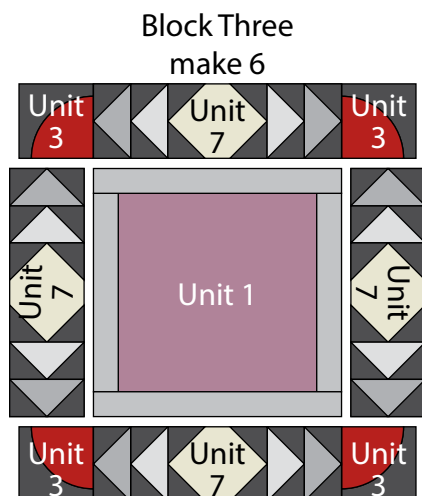

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

17. Sew (1) Block Three square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.

18. Sew (1) Block One square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block Two square together, in that order, to make Row Two.

19. Sew (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block One square together, in that order, to make Row Four.

20. Sew the (4) rows together, in numerical order, to make the Center Block.

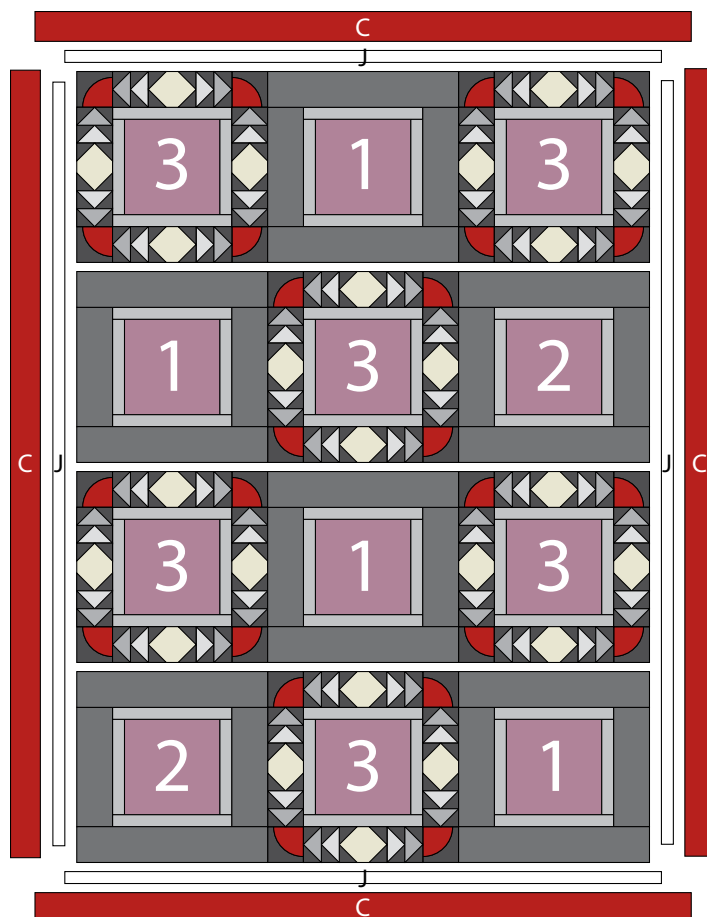
21. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 64 1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 50 1/2" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

22. Sew (1) 3" x 66 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3" x 55 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

23. Layer and quilt as desired.

24. Sew the (7) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric D strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

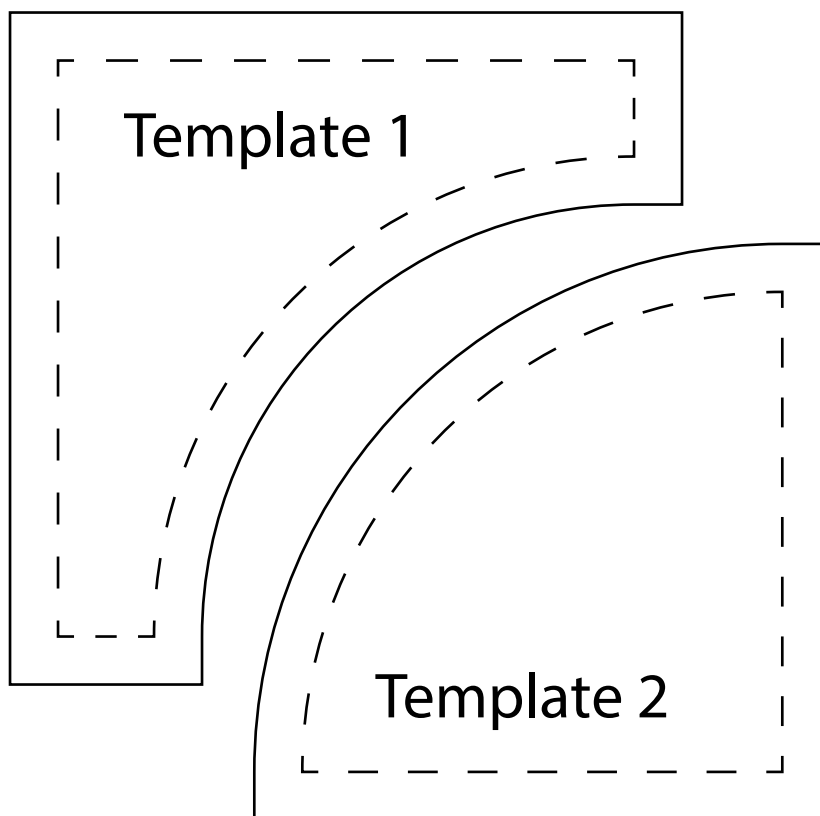
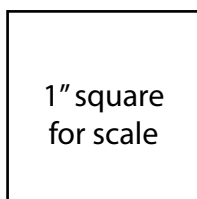
25. Bind as desired.
