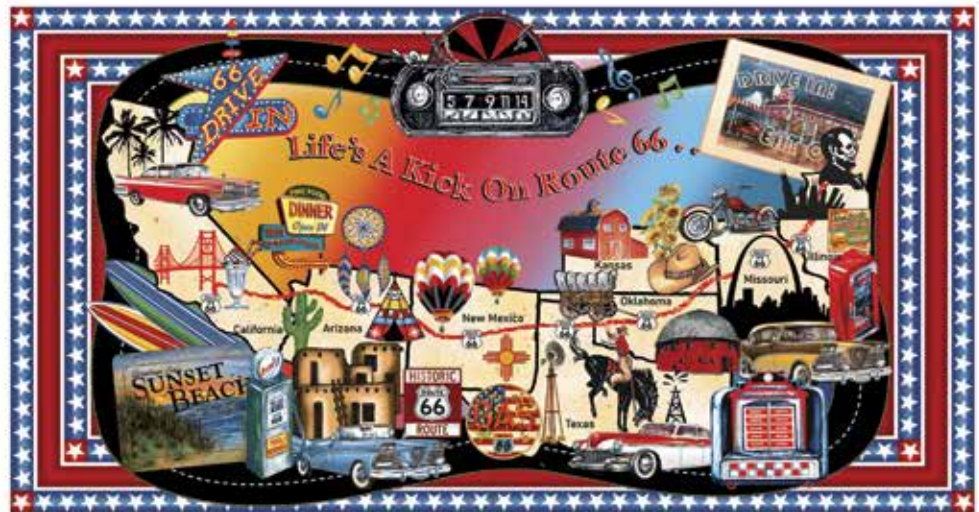

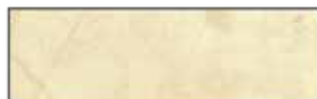

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Route 66 Panel - Tan (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Jot Dot Basics - Black (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (8) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Juke Box & Musical Notes - Black (C), cut:

- (4) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (34) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (5) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (72) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Urban Legend Basics - Ivory (D), cut:

- (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- (6) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 3" squares.
- (4) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (34) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (5) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (68) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Fast Food - Tan (E), cut:

- (1) 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Classic Cars - Black (F), cut:

- (3) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Urban Legend Basics - Red (G), cut:

- (14) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Scenic Route 66 - Brown (H), cut:

- (2) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Diner Signs - Black (I), cut:

- (2) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Urban Legend Basics - Navy (J), cut:

- (3) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (5) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 84 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (4) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

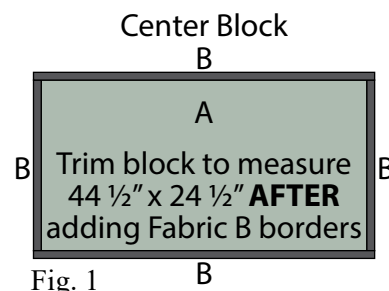
From the Scenic Route 66 - Brown (Backing), cut:

- (2) 96" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 72" x 96" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side the 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".**



2. Place (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 3).

3. Place another 2 ½" Fabric D square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (34) Unit 1 strips total.

5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (34) Unit 2 strips.

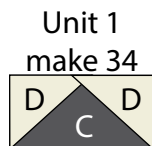

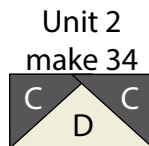

6. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip lengthwise to the top of (1) Unit 2 strip, along the Fabric C sides, to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 3 square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (34) Unit 3 squares total.

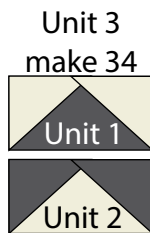

7. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric C square on the bottom right corner of (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Unit 4 squares total.

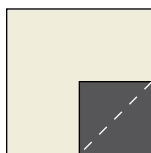

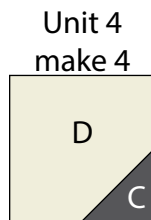

8. Sew together (6) Unit 3 squares to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

9. Sew together (11) Unit 3 squares. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 11 below). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

10. Place (1) 6 ½" Fabric G square on the top left corner of (1) 12 ½" Fabric F square, right sides together (Fig. 12). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 12). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 13).

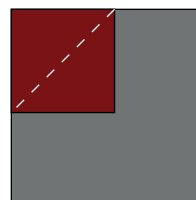

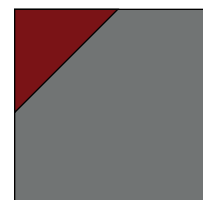

11. Follow Figure 14 for the seam direction to add a 6 ½" Fabric G square to each of the remaining corners of the 12 ½" Fabric F square to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 15).

12. Repeat Steps 10-11 to make (8) Unit 5 squares total.

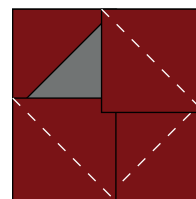

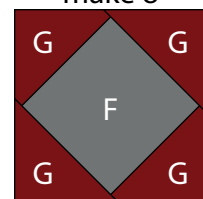

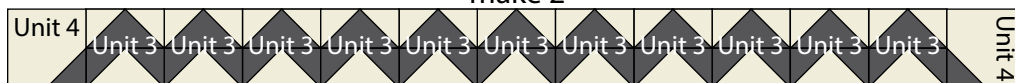

Repeat Steps 10-11 and refer to Figures 16-17 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (6) Unit 6 squares and (6) Unit 7 squares.

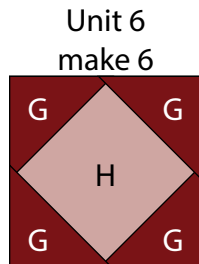

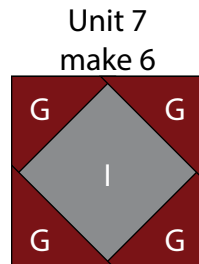

14. Place (1) 3" Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 5 square, right sides together (Fig. 18). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 18). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 19).

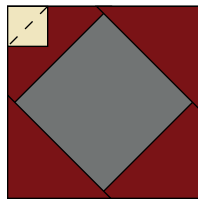

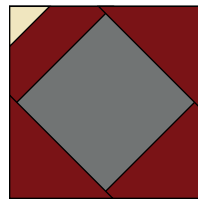

15. Follow Figure 20 for the seam direction to add a 3" Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 5 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 21).

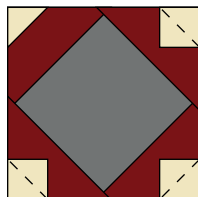

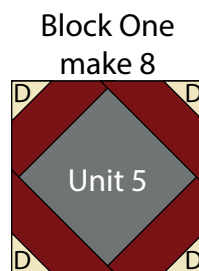

17. Repeat Steps 14-15 and refer to Figures 22-23 for component identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (6) Block Two squares and (6) Block Three squares.

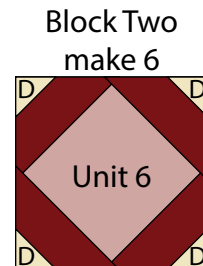

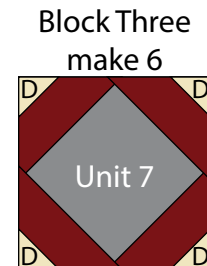

18. Follow Figure 24 and sew together (4) Block One squares, (3) Block Two squares and (3) Block Three squares into a 2 x 5 matrix to make (1) Block Four rectangle.

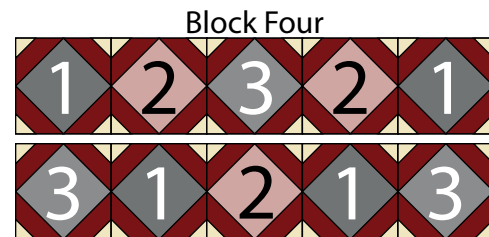

19. Follow Figure 25 and sew together (4) Block One squares, (3) Block Two squares and (3) Block Three squares into a 2 x 5 matrix to make (1) Block Five rectangle.

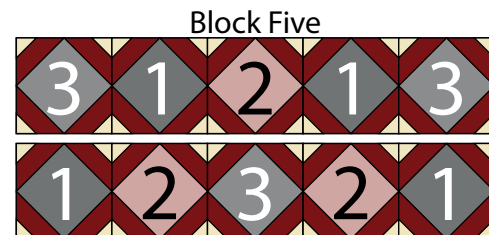

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

20. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

21. Sew (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block.

22. Sew (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

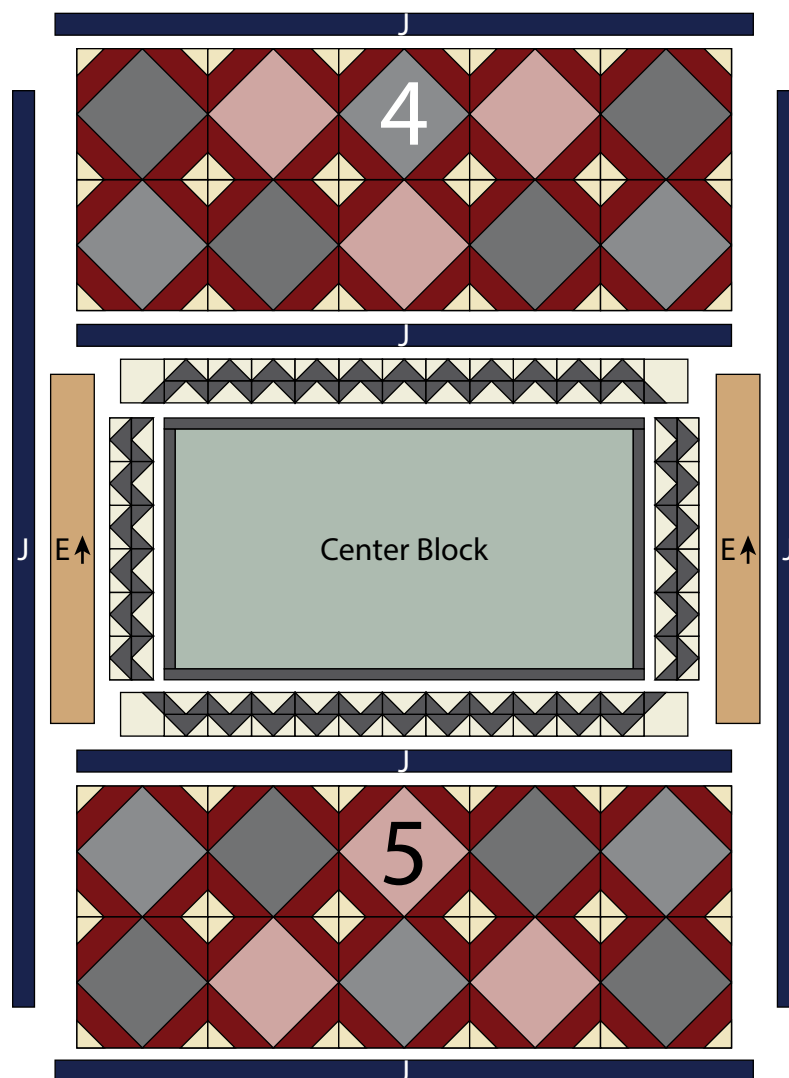
23. Sew the Block Four rectangle to the top of the Center Block and the Block Five rectangle to the bottom of the Center Block.

24. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 84 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 64 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

25. Layer and quilt as desired.

26. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

27. Bind as desired.
