





⅔ yard	Fish Blocks - Blue (A)	2387-77
$1\frac{1}{2}$ yards	Chameleon - Black (B)	1178-99*
³ ⁄ ₄ yard	Fish Scales - Green (C)	2393-60
3/8 yard	Fishing Rods & Reels - Blue (D)	2389-77
1/2 yard	Fish Emblems - Black (E)	2390-99
3/8 yard	Fish Lures - Gray (F)	2391-90
1/2 yard	Tossed Fish - Light Blue (G)	2388-70
5/8 yard	Chameleon - Olive (H)	1178-62
1/2 yard	Jot Dot - Charcoal (I)	9570-92
³ ⁄ ₄ yard	Fish Scales - Light Blue (J)	2393-70
$4\frac{1}{2}$ yards	Fish Collage - Blue (Backing)	2392-70

*Includes binding

Batting: 66" x 81" (Recommended: Air Lite[®] Colour Me 100% Cotton)

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Fish Blocks - Blue (A):

• Fussy cut (6) 10 ¹/₂" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Chameleon - Black (B), cut:

- (4) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2 ¹/₂" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 ¹/₂" strips.
- (2) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 1 ¹/₂" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.
- (2) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 1 ¹/₂" x 12 ¹/₂" strips.
- (7) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Fish Scales - Green (C), cut:

(8) 1 ¹/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ¹/₄" x 12 ¹/₂" strips.
(10) 1 ¹/₄" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (6) 1 ¹/₄" x 64 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Fishing Rods & Reels - Blue (D), cut:

• (2) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 5" x 12 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Fish Emblems - Black (E), cut:

• (2) 7" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 7" x 12 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Fish Lures - Gray (F), cut:

• (1) 10 ¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 10 ¹/₂" squares.

From the Tossed Fish - Light Blue (G), cut:

• (32) Template 2 triangles.

From the Chameleon - Olive (H), cut:

• (32) Template 1 triangles.

• (32) Template 3 triangles.

From the Jot Dot - Charcoal (I), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 52" strips.

From the Fish Scales - Light Blue (J), cut:

- (4) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ¹/₂" x 67 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ¹/₂" x 58" strips


From the Fish Collage - Blue (Backing), cut:

• (2) 81" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 66" x 81" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¹/₄" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 10 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 13 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 12 ½" x 12 ½". Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.


3. Sew (1) 1 ¹/₄" x 12 ¹/₂" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 5" x 12 ¹/₂" Fabric D strip lengthwise to make (1) 12 ¹/₂" x 6 ¹/₂" Unit 3 rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (6) Unit 3 rectangles total.

4. Sew (1) 1 ¹/₄" x 12 ¹/₂" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 7" x 12 ¹/₂' Fabric E strip lengthwise to make (1) 12 ¹/₂" x 8 ¹/₂" Unit 4 rectangle (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (6) Unit 4 rectangles total.


5. Place (1) Fabric H Template 1 triangle on top of (1) Fabric G Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the left sides (Fig. 5). Sew the (2) triangles together along the left side. Press the smaller triangle open.

6. Place (1) Fabric H Template 3 triangle on top of the Fabric G Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the right sides (Fig. 6). Sew the (2) triangles together along the right side. Press the smaller triangle open to make (1) Unit 5 block (Fig. 7). Trim the block to measure 4 ¹/₂" square to make (1) Unit 5 square.

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (32) Unit 5 squares total.



8. Place (1) 2 ¹/₂" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 5 square, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 9). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¹/₄" away from the sewn seam.










9. Follow Figure 10 for the seam direction to add a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square to the upper right corner of the Unit 5 square to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 11).

10. Repeat Steps 8-9 to make (32) Unit 6 squares total.

11. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to the top of a second Unit 6 square, along the Fabric G sides, to make (1) 4 ¹/₂" x 8 ¹/₂" Unit 7 rectangle (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (16) Unit 7 rectangles total.







12. Sew together (1) Unit 3 rectangle, (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 4 rectangle, (1) Unit 2 square, (1) Unit 4 rectangle, (1) Unit 1 square and (1) Unit 3 rectangle, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Block One Column (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (3) Block One columns total.

13. Sew together (8) Unit 7 rectangles end to end. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) 6" x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two column (Fig. 14). Repeat to make a second Block Two column.



14. Sew together the (3) Block One columns and (2) Block Two columns, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make the 47 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 15).



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 15. Sew (1) 1 ¹/₄" x 64 ¹/₂" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block.


16. Sew (1) 2" x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 52" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 67 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 58" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

18. Layer and quilt as desired.

19. Sew the (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

20. Bind as desired.




Quilt Layout
