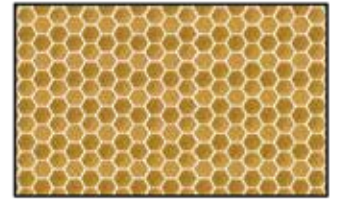

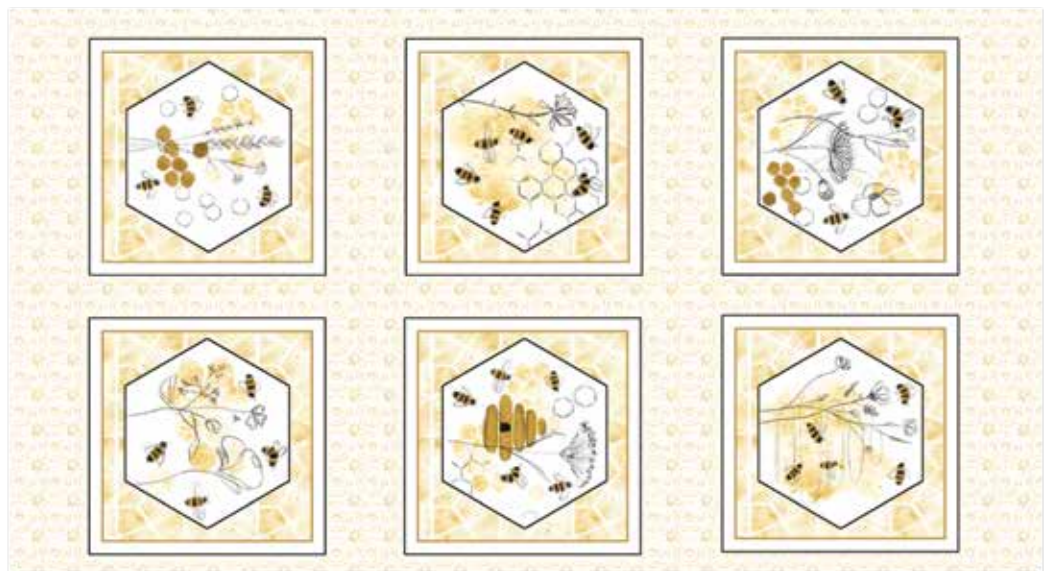

1 1/8 yards	Set Floral in Circles - Ivory (C)	2854-41
1 3/8 yards	Sketched Honeycomb - White (D)	2856-01
1/4 yard	Mini Bees with Honeycombs - Parchment (E)	2853-30
1 yard	Chameleon - Brown (F)	1178-39
5/8 yard	Bees - Ivory (G)	2849-41
1/3 yard	Tonal Texture - Parchment (H)	2857-30
1/4 yard	Bees with Beehives - Ivory (I)	2855-41
2 1/2 yards	Floral & Honeycomb Border Stripe - Ivory (J)	2851-41
5 yards	Bees in Scallops - White (Backing)	2858-01

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Bees & Floral in Large Honeycomb - Ivory (A), cut:

- (2) 8 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 8 1/2" squares.

From the Honeycomb - Honey (B), cut:

- (9) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (144) 2 1/2" squares.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 66" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 52 1/2" strips.
- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Set Floral in Circles - Ivory (C), cut:

- (11) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Sketched Honeycomb - White (D), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 68" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 55 1/2" strips.
- (21) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (62) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips.

From the Mini Bees with Honeycombs - Parchment (E), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 1/2" squares.

From the Chameleon - Brown (F), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/2" squares.
- (11) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (31) 2" x 12 1/2" strips.

From the Bees - Ivory (G), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (10) 4" squares.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Tonal Texture - Parchment (H), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Bees with Beehives - Ivory (I), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (10) 4" squares.

From the Floral & Honeycomb Border Stripe - Ivory (J), cut:

- (2) 6" x 86" length of fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 6" x 70" LOF strips.

From the Bees in Scallops - White (Backing), cut:

- (2) 90" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 74" x 90" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) 2 1/2" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 2).

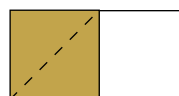

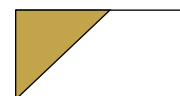

2. Place another 2 1/2" Fabric B square on the right side of the 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).

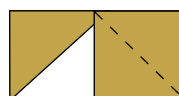

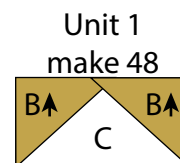

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (48) Unit 1 strips total.

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4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figures 5-7 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (24) Unit 2 strips, (24) Unit 3 strips and (24) Unit 4 strips.

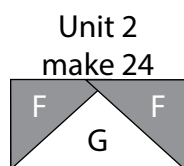

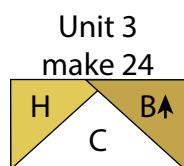

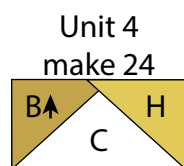

5. Sew (2) Unit 1 strips together end to end to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (24) Unit 5 strips total.

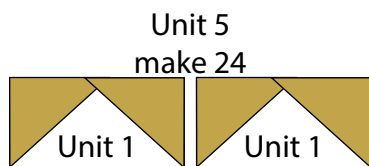

6. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the left end of (1) Unit 4 strip, along the Fabric B sides, to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (24) Unit 6 strips total.

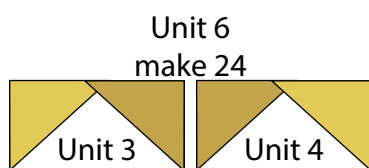

7. Sew (1) 2 1/2" Fabric C square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) 8 1/2" Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

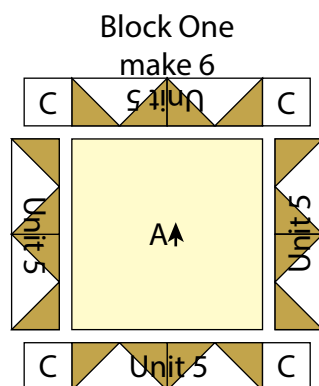

8. Sew (1) 2 1/2" Fabric G square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) 4 1/2" Fabric E square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 8 1/2" Unit 7 square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (6) Unit 7 squares total.

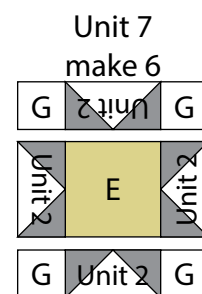

9. Sew (1) 2 1/2" Fabric C square to each end of (1) Unit 6 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip to each side of (1) Unit 7 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block Two square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.

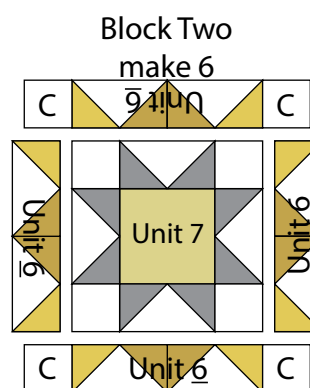

10. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 2" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip to make (1) 4" x 12 1/2" Block Three strip (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (31) Block Three strips total.

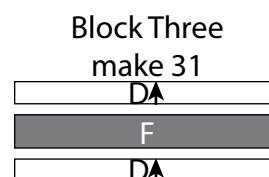

11. Sew together (1) 4" Fabric G square, (1) Block Three strip, (1) 4" Fabric I square, (1) Block Three strip, (1) 4" Fabric G square, (1) Block Three strip and (1) 4" Fabric I square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 14).

12. Refer to Figure 14 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Three, Row Five, Row Seven and Row Nine.

13. Sew together (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Three strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 14).

14. Repeat Step 13 and refer to Figure 14 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Four, Row Six and Row Eight.

15. Sew together the (9) Rows from Steps 11-14, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the Center Block (Fig. 14).

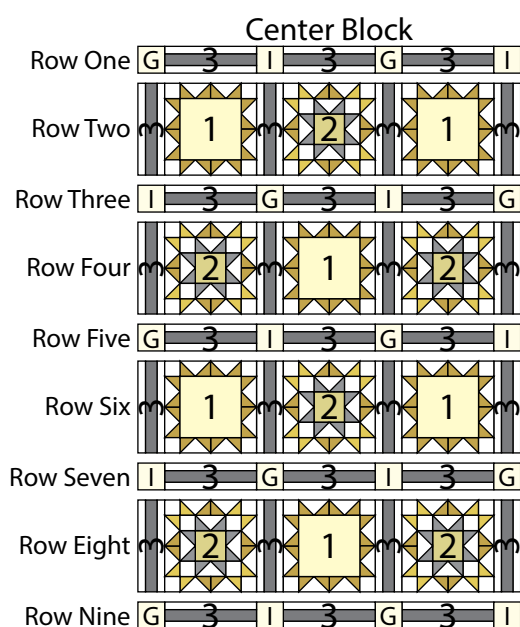

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

16. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 66" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 52 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) 2" x 68" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 55 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Center (1) 6" x 86" Fabric J strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

19. Repeat Step 18 to sew (1) 6" x 70" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 15).

20. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 15), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

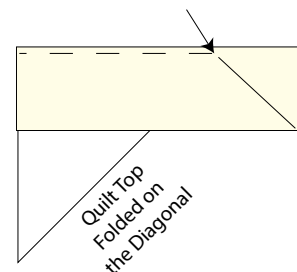
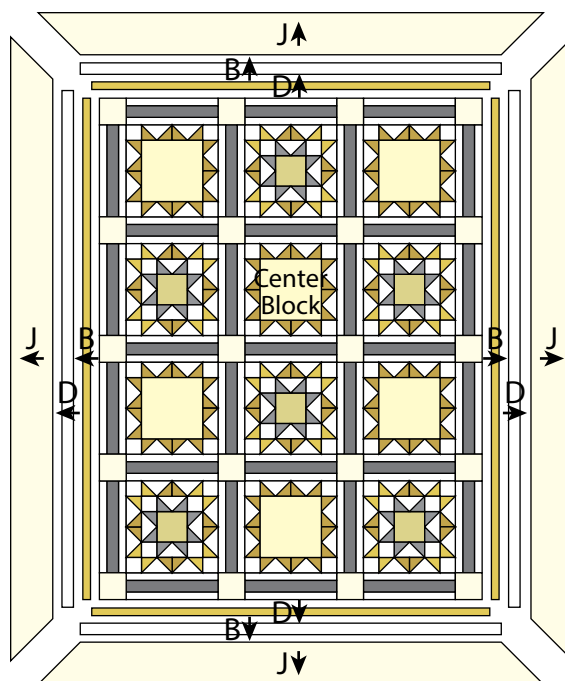

21. Layer and quilt as desired.

22. Sew the (8) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

23. Bind as desired.
