$\frac{1}{4}$ yard	Welcome To ... Signs - Red (E)	2120-88
$\frac{1}{2}$ yard	State Flowers - Gray (F)	2119-95
$\frac{5}{8}$ yard	Tossed State Abbreviations - Blue (G)	2121-75
1 yard	Jot Dots - Red (H)	9570-88*
1 $\frac{5}{8}$ yards	City and State Names - Gray (I)	2114-95

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the USA Panel - 24 inches - Blue (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Eclipse - White (B), cut:

- (11) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (144) 3" squares.
- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (3) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Tossed RV's - Light Gray (C), cut:

- (2) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the State Birds - Yellow (D), cut:

- (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Welcome To ... Signs - Red (E), cut:

- (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the State Flowers - Gray (F), cut:

- (3) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Tossed State Abbreviations - Blue (G), cut:

- (6) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (36) 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Jot Dots - Red (H), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 53 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (7) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

From the City and State Names - Gray (I), cut:

- (3) 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 56 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (4) 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the RV's and Landmarks - Yellow (J), cut:

- (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Stamps - Gray (Backing), cut:

- (2) 70" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 70" x 78" back.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling various components. Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".**

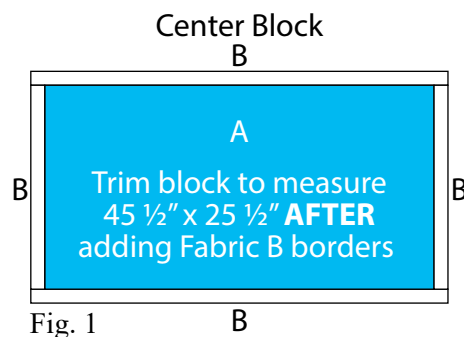

2. Place (1) 3" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 3).

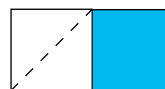

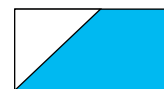

3. Place another 3" Fabric B square on the right side of the 3" x 5 1/2" Fabric G strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (36) Unit 1 strips total.

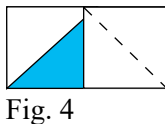

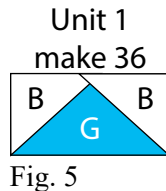

5. Sew (18) Unit 1 strips together lengthwise to make (1) Block One strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make a second Block One strip.

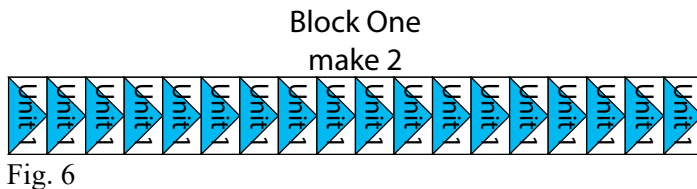

6. Place (1) 3" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) 5 1/2" Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 8).

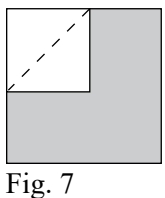

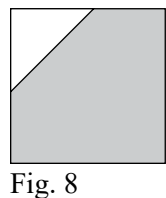

7. Follow Figure 9 for the seam direction to add a 3" Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the 5 1/2" Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 10).

8. Repeat Steps 6-7 to make (8) Unit 2 squares total.

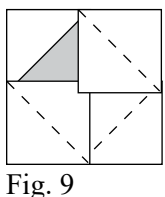

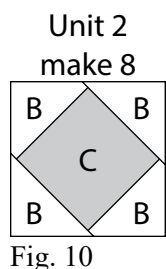

9. Repeat Steps 6-7 and refer to Figures 11-13 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (4) Unit 3 squares, (4) Unit 4 squares and (2) Unit 5 squares.

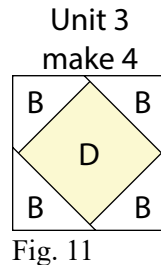

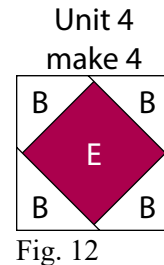

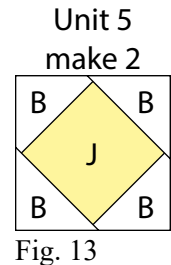

10. Sew (4) Unit 2 squares, (2) Unit 3 squares, (2) Unit 4 squares and (1) Unit 5 square together. Sew (1) 4 1/2" x 45 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of the newly sewn strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block One strip to the top of the Fabric F strip lengthwise to make the Top Border (Fig. 14). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

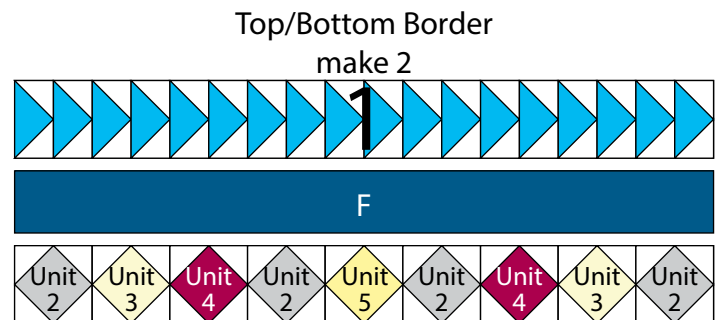

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

11. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

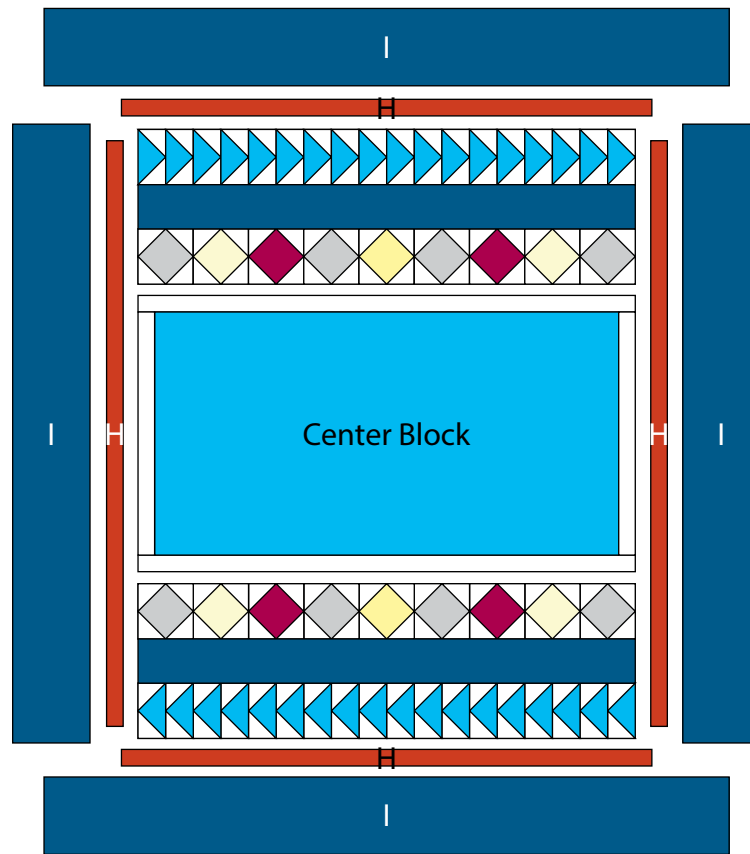
12. Sew (1) 2" x 53 1/2" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 48 1/2" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 7 1/2" x 56 1/2" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 7 1/2" x 62 1/2" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

14. Layer and quilt as desired.

15. Sew the (7) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

16. Bind as desired.
