

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Materials

⅓ yard	Doodles - Black (A)	1713-99
1/4 yard	Crayons - Green (B)	1714-66
1/4 yard	Colored Pencils - Blue (C)	1708-77
1/4 yard	Protractors - Blue (D)	1712-77
1/8 yard	Starlet - Royal (E)	6383-Royal
1/8 yard	Starlet - Yellow (F)	6383-Yellow
1/8 yard	Starlet - Red (G)	6383-Red

You will also need:

- (2) 1" grommets
- 1 yard of 1" red ribbon
- Batting-9 ½" x 35 ½"

(Recommended: Air Lite® Colour Me 100% Cotton)

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Doodles - Black (A), cut:

• (2) 9 ½" x 35 ½" strips

From the Crayons - Green (B), cut:

• (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip (2) 3 ½" x 4 ½" strips and (2) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Colored Pencils - Blue (C), cut:

• (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip (2) 3 ½" x 4 ½" strips and (2) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Protractors - Blue (D), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip (2) 4 ½" x 7 ½" strips and (2) 3 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

From the Starlet - Royal (E), cut:

• (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip (2) 1 ½" x 3 ½" strips and (2) 1 ½" x 2 ½" strips.

From the Starlet - Yellow (F), cut:

• (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip (2) 1 ½" x 3 ½" strips and (2) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips.


From the Starlet - Red (G), cut:

• (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip (4) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.


Organizer Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.


- 1. Place the (2) 9 ½" x 35 ½" Fabric A strips, right sides together. Place the layered fabrics on top of the batting and sew around all of the sides, leaving an opening for turning.
- 2. Turn the sewn unit right side out. Top stitch 1/8" from the edge all the way around, making sure to stitch the opening closed to compete organizer background.
- 3. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric E strip to the top of one 3 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric B strip to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 strip.
- 4. Place the Unit 1 strips on top of each other, right sides together. Sew around all four sides of the strips, leaving an opening for turning at the bottom of the pocket. Turn the pocket right side out and fold in the edges of the opening and press to make Unit 2 pocket (Fig. 2). Note: The opening will be stitch closed when attaching the pocket to the organizer.



5. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figures 3-4 while using (2) 3 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric C strips and (2) 1 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric F strips to make (1) Unit 4 pocket.




6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figures 5-6 while using (2) 3 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric D strips and (2) 1 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric G strips to make (1) Unit 6 pocket.




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
7. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figures 7-8 while using (2) 4 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric C strips and (2) 1 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric F strips to make (1) Unit 8 pocket.




8. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figures 9-10 while using the (2) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric B strips and (2) 1 ½" x 2 ½" Fabric E strips to make (1) Unit 10 pocket.



9. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figures 11-12 while using the (2) 4 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric D strips and (2) 1 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric G strips to make (1) Unit 12 pocket.





- - 10. Follow the Organizer Layout in Figure 13 for pocket placement on the Fabric A organizer background to pin the pockets in place. Topstitch down each side and across the bottom to sew pockets onto the organizer background.
 - 11. Following the manufacturer's instructions, add (2) grommets at the top of the organizer approximately 2" in from the side and 2" down from the top. Thread the ribbon through the grommets as shown in the cover image to complete the organizer.

Locker Organizer Layout


