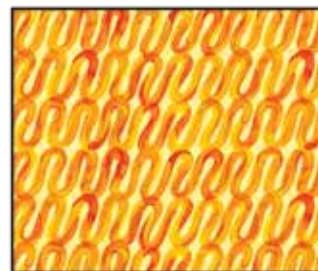

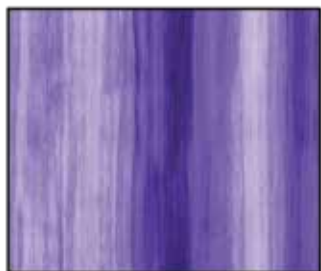

1 yard	Tonal Squiggles - Green (F)	1399-66*
3/4 yard	Eclipse - White (G)	3955-White
1/3 yard	Paisley - Light Blue (H)	1403-11
1 3/8 yards	Butterfly Ditsy - Navy (I)	1400-77
3/8 yard	Tonal Squiggles - Yellow (J)	1399-44
2/3 yard	Washy Stripe - Pink (K)	1402-22
4 yards	Butterfly Floral - Light Gray (Backing)	1397-90

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Butterfly Blocks - Navy (A):

- Fussy cut (9) 6 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangles, each centered on a block.

From the Starlet - Navy (B), cut:

- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 2" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 2" x 11 1/2" strips.
- (1) 1 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 1/4" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (1) 1 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 1/4" x 11 1/2" strips.

From the Mini Floral - Pink (C), cut:

- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2" x 10" strips.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 1 1/2" x 7" strips.

From the Washy Stripe - Purple (D), cut:

- (10) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2" x 16 1/2" strips.

From the Circles - Pink (E), cut:

- (2) 6 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 6 1/2" squares.

From the Tonal Squiggles - Green (F), cut:

- (4) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 1 1/4" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (4) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 1 1/4" x 8" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Eclipse - White (G), cut:

- (8) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 3" x 8" strips.

From the Paisley - Light Blue (H), cut:

- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 3" squares.

From the Butterfly Ditsy - Navy (I), cut:

- (4) 5 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 1/2" x 65" strips.
- (4) 5 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 1/2" x 62 1/2" strips and (1) 5 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangle.

From the Tonal Squiggles - Yellow (J), cut:

- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 63" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 52 1/2" strips.

From the Washy Stripe - Pink (K), cut:

- (10) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2" x 16 1/2" strips.

From the Butterfly Floral - Light Gray (Backing), cut:

- (2) 70" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 70" x 83" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Center (1) 2" x 10 1/2" Fabric B strip on (1) side of (1) 6 1/2" x 5 1/2" Fabric A block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.**

Repeat with the opposite side.

2. Repeat Step 1 to sew (1) 2" x 11 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Fabric A block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 1).

3. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 1), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 2). **Trim the unit to measure 8" x 7".**

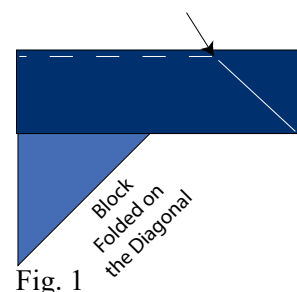

4. Repeat Steps 1-3 to make (9) Unit 1 rectangles total.

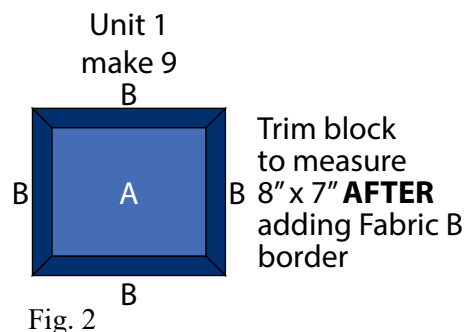
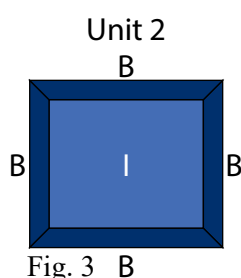

5. Center (1) 1 1/4" x 10 1/2" Fabric B strip on (1) side of (1) 6 1/2" x 5 1/2" Fabric I rectangle and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

6. Repeat Step 5 to sew (1) 1 1/4" x 11 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric I rectangle, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Fabric I rectangle on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 1).

7. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 1), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make (1) Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 3).



8. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 7" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 10" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (9) Unit 3 squares total.

9. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 7" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 10" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 rectangle to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 5).

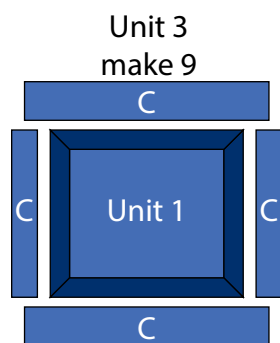

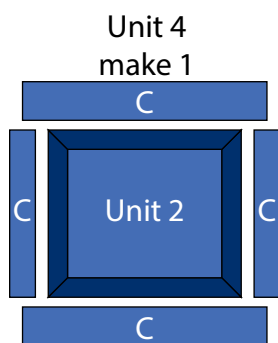
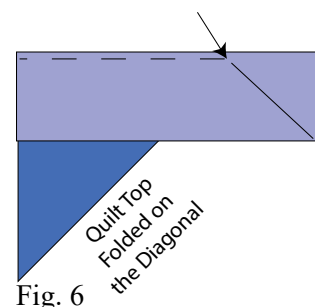

10. Center (1) 2" x 16 1/2" Fabric D strip on (1) side of (1) Unit 3 square and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

11. Repeat Step 10 to sew (1) 2" x 16 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 3 square, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Unit 3 square on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 6).

12. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 6), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 7). The block should measure 13".



13. Repeat Steps 10-12 to make (5) Block One squares total.

14. Repeat Steps 10-12 and refer to Figure 8 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (4) 13" Block Two squares.

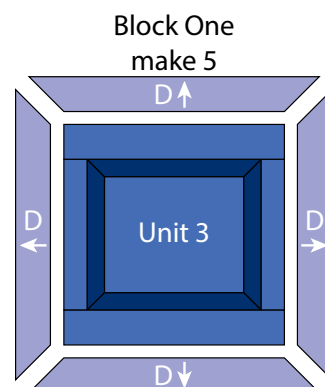

15. Repeat Steps 10-12 and refer to Figure 9 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (1) 13" Block Three square.

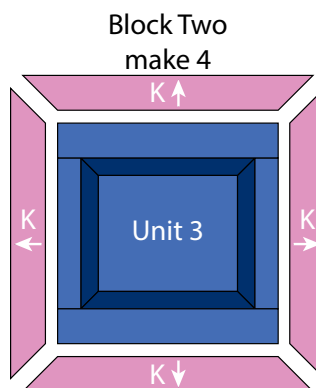

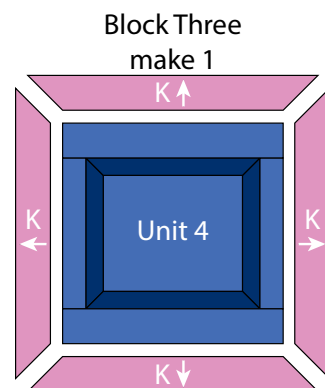
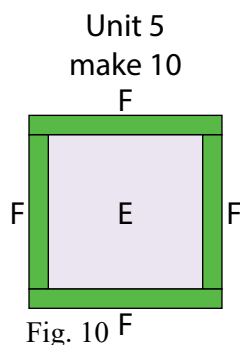
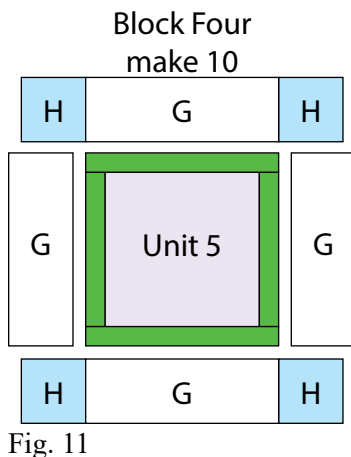

16. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 6 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric E square. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 8" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (10) Unit 5 squares total.



17. Sew (1) 3" Fabric H square to each end of (1) 3" x 8" Fabric G strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) 3" x 8" Fabric G strip to each side of (1) Unit 5 square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block Four square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (10) Block Four squares total.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

18. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Four square, (1) Block Two square and (1) Block Four square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Five.

19. Sew together (1) Block Four square, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Four square and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two.

20. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Four square, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Four square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Three.

21. Sew together (1) Block Four square, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Four square and (1) Block Two square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Four.

22. Sew the (5) Rows from Steps 18-21 together, in numerical order, to make the Center Block.

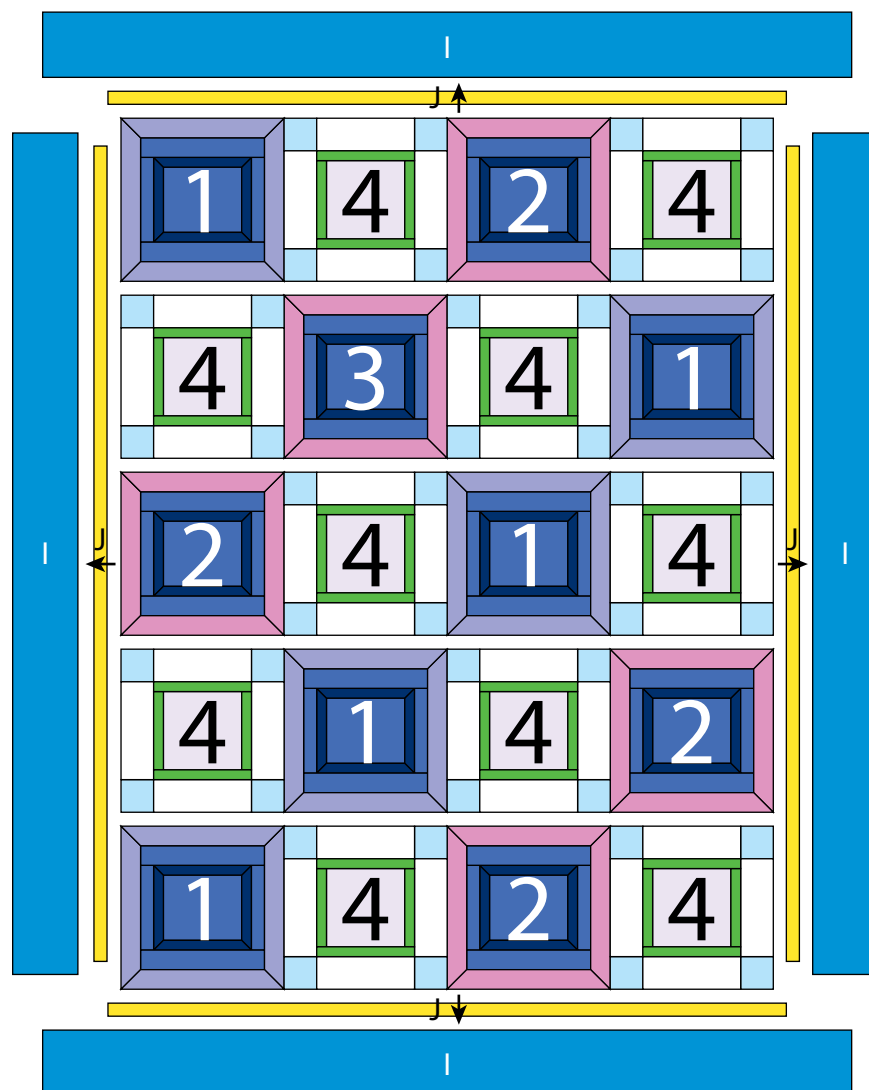
23. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 63" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

24. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 65" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 62 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

25. Layer and quilt as desired.

26. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

27. Bind as desired.
