

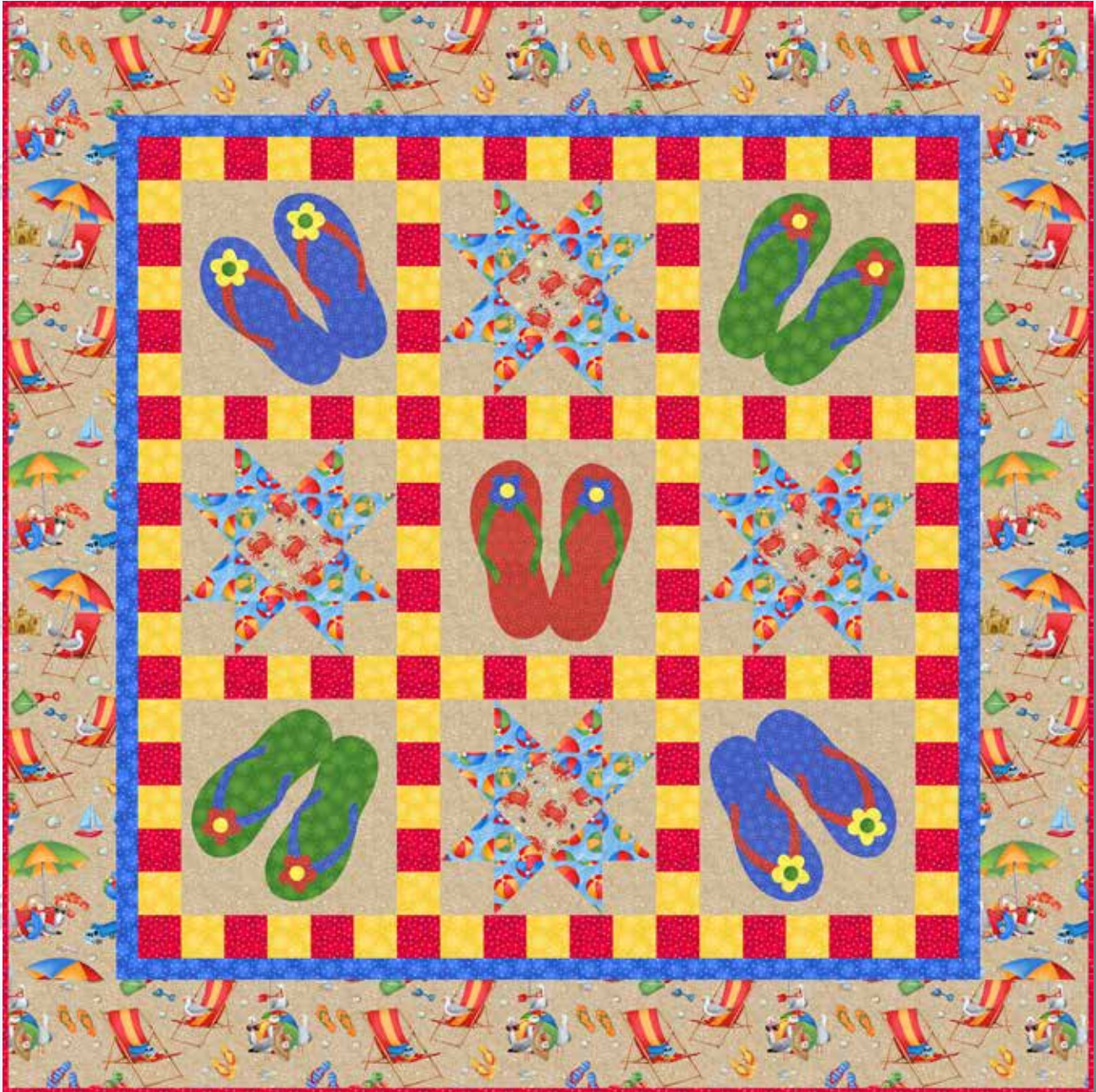

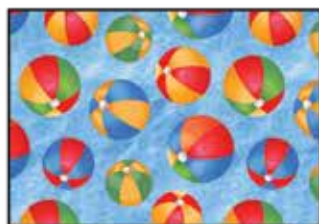

1 ¾ yards	Sandy Beach Scene - Sand (A)	9527-41
1 ⅛ yards	Starlet - Red (B)	6383-Red*
⅔ yard	Starlet - Yellow (C)	6383-Yellow
1 yard	Sand Texture - Sand (D)	9532-41
½ yard	Beach Balls - Blue (E)	9531-70
¼ yard	Crabs - Sand (F)	9529-41
⅝ yard	Starlet - Royal (G)	6383-Royal
⅓ yard	Starlet - Kelly (H)	6383-Kelly
3 ⅓ yards	Flip Flops - Sand (Backing)	9534-41

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Sandy Beach Scene - Sand (A), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 40 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 50 ½" strips.

From the Starlet - Red (B), cut:

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (16) 2 ½" squares.
- See instruction to cut (2) Right Strap Sets.
- See instruction to cut (2) Left Strap Sets.
- See instruction to cut (4) Flowers.
- See instruction to cut (1) Right Flip Flop.
- See instruction to cut (1) Left Flip Flop.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Starlet - Yellow (C), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips.
- See instruction to cut (4) Flowers.
- See instruction to cut (6) Dots.

From the Sand Texture - Sand (D), cut:

- (2) 10 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 10 ½" squares.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3" x 5 ½" strips and (2) 3" squares.
- (1) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (14) 3" squares.

From the Beach Balls - Blue (E), cut:

- (4) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 3" squares.

From the Crabs - Sand (F), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5 ½" squares.

From the Starlet - Royal (G), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 38 ½" WOF strips.
- See instructions to cut (2) Right Strap Sets.
- See instructions to cut (2) Left Strap Sets.
- See instructions to cut (2) Flowers.
- See instructions to cut (2) Right Flip Flops.
- See instructions to cut (2) Left Flip Flops.

From the Starlet - Kelly (H), cut:

- See instructions to cut (1) Right Strap Set.
- See instructions to cut (1) Left Strap Set.
- See instructions to cut (2) Right Flip Flops.
- See instructions to cut (2) Left Flip Flops.
- See instructions to cut (4) Dots.

From the Flip Flops - Sand (Backing), cut:

- (2) 58" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 58" x 58" back.

Sewing Instructions

1. Following the manufacturer's instructions to trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.

2. Refer to the cover image and Figures 1-3 to arrange and press the flip flop shapes onto the 10 ½" Fabric D squares to make (2) Block One squares, (2) Block Two squares and (1) Block Three square.

3. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch.

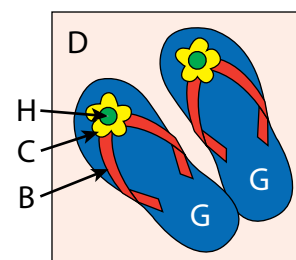

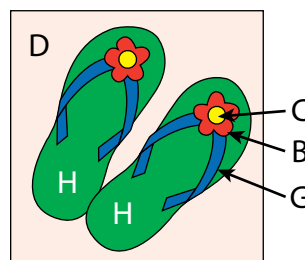

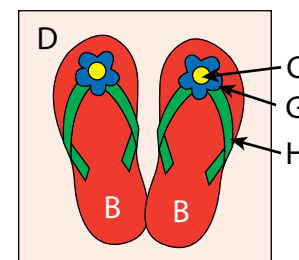

4. Sew together (3) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strips and (2) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips lengthwise, alternating them, to make (1) CB strip set (Fig. 4). Repeat to make a second CB strip set. Cut across the strip sets to make (24) 2 ½" x 10 ½" Unit 1 strips (Fig. 4).

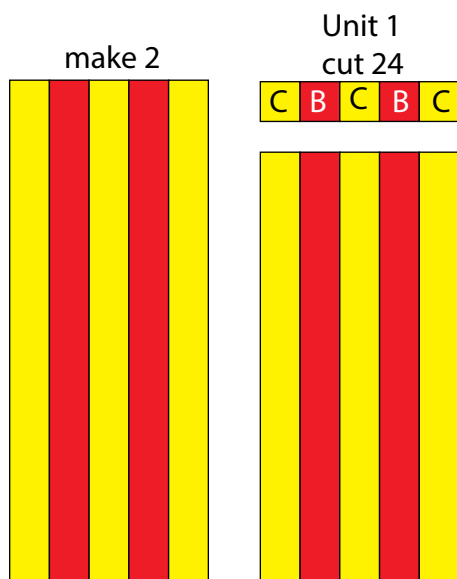

5. Sew together (4) 2 ½" Fabric B squares and (3) Unit 1 strips, alternating them, to make (1) Sashing Strip (Fig. 5 below). Repeat to make (4) Sashing Strips total.

6. Place (1) 3" Fabric E square on the left side of (1) 3" x 5 1/2" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 7).

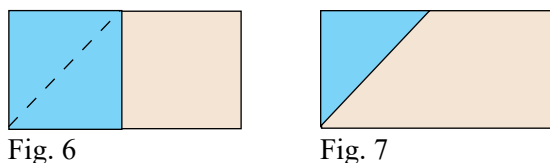

7. Place another 3" Fabric E square on the right side of the 3" x 5 1/2" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig 9). Repeat to make a (16) Unit 2 strips total.

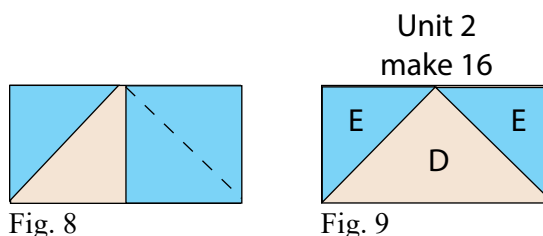

8. Place (1) 3" Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) 5 ½" Fabric F square, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 11).

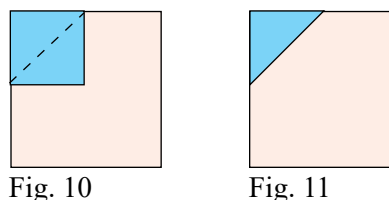

9. Follow Figure 12 for the seam direction to add a 3" Fabric E square to each of the remaining corners of the 5 1/2" Fabric F square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (4) Unit 3 square total.

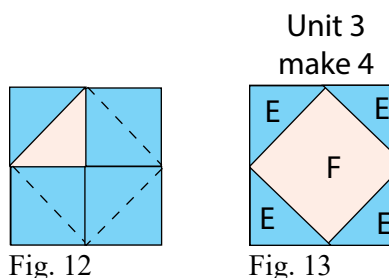

10. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) Unit 3 square to make (1) Middle Block Strip. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Sew (1) 3" Fabric D square to each side of (1) Unit 2 strip to make (1) Top Block Strip. Repeat to make (1) Bottom Block Strip. Sew the Top Block Strip and Bottom Block Strip to the top and to the bottom of the Middle Block Strip to make (1) Block Four square (Fig. 14). Pay attention to the strip orientations. Repeat to make (4) Block Four squares total.

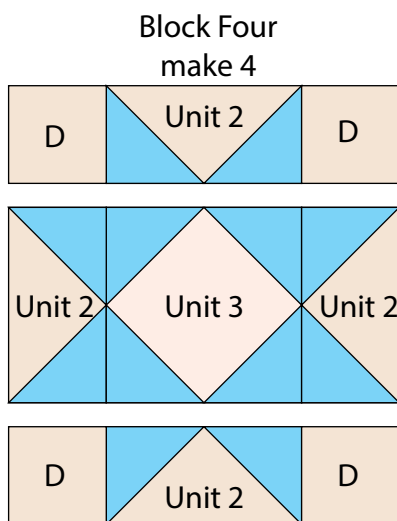

Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)

11. Sew together (4) Unit 1 strips, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Four square and (1) block Two square to make Row One. Pay attention to the block orientations.

12. Sew together (4) Unit 1 strips, (2) Block Four squares and (1) Block Three square to make Row Two. Pay attention to the block orientations.

13. Sew together (4) Unit 1 strips, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Four square and (1) Block One square to make Row Three. Pay attention to the block orientations.

14. Sew together (4) Sashing Strips and the (3) Rows lengthwise, alternating them, to make the Center Block. Pay attention to the row orientations.

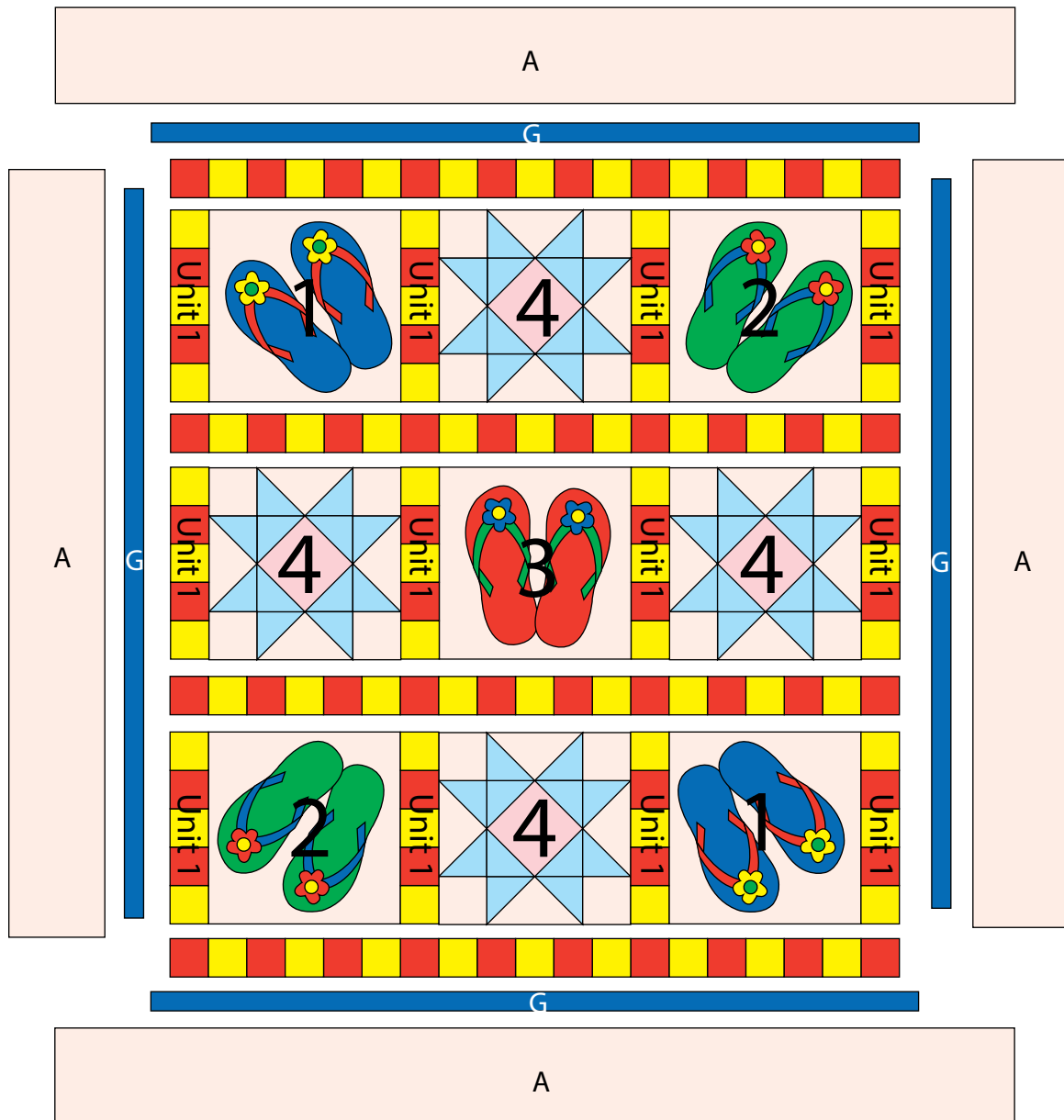
15. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 38 1/2" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 40 1/2" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 40 1/2" Fabric A strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 50 1/2" Fabric A strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

17. Layer and quilt as desired.

18. Sew the (6) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

19. Bind as desired.



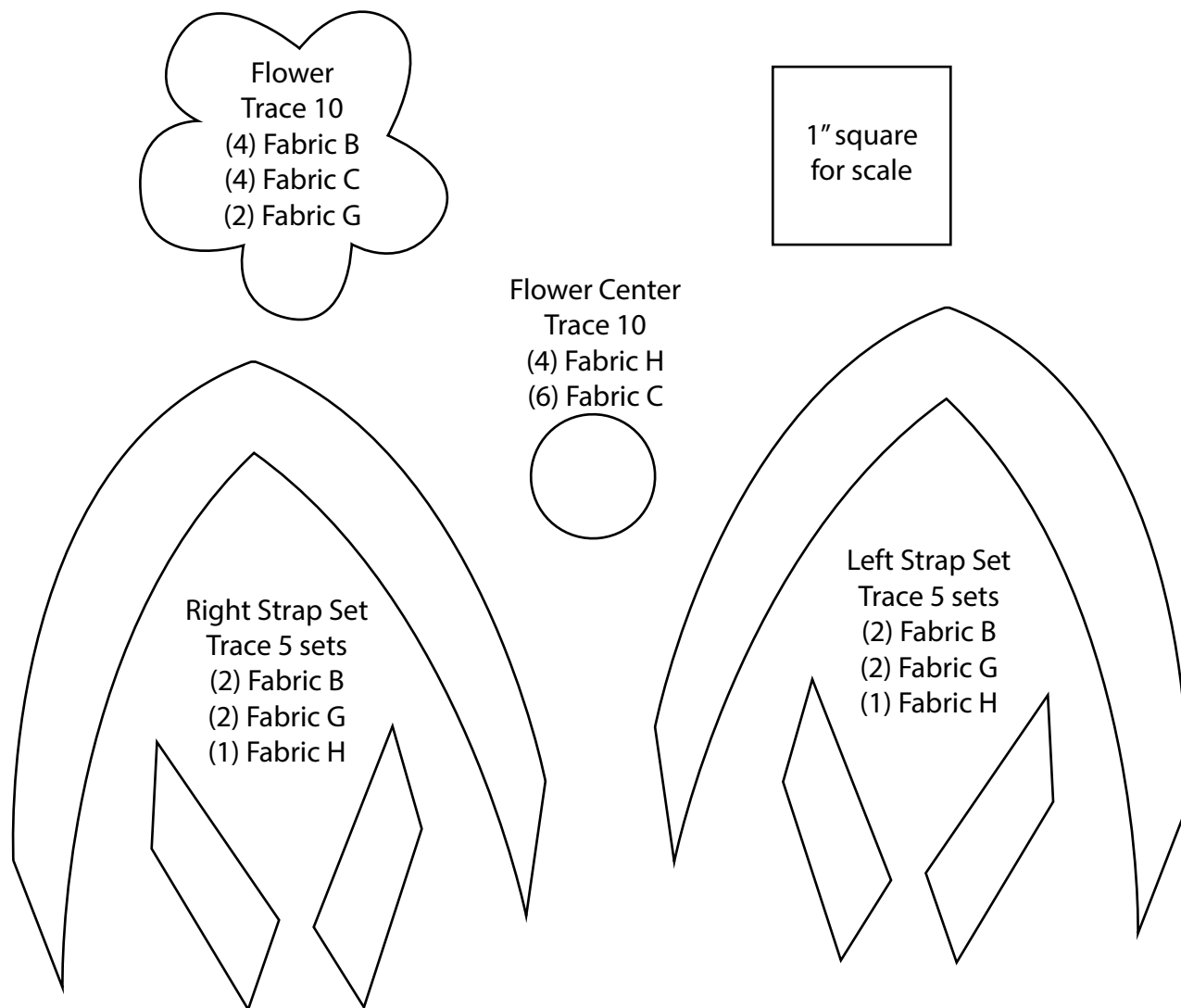
Quilt Layout
