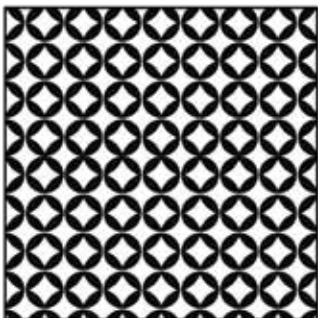

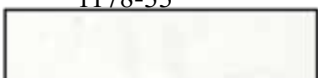

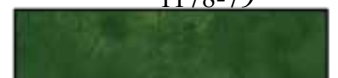

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Plant Panel - 36 inches - Light Pink (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Chameleon Basics - Slate (B), cut:

- (2) 3" x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 3" x 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (4) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 61 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 54 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Chameleon Basics - Orange (C), cut:

- (3) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Potted Plants - White (D), cut:

- (3) 7" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 7" x 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Plant Display - Light Pink (E), cut:

- (2) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 63 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 66 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.

From the Urban Legend - Olive (F), cut:

- (1) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares.

From the Urban Legend - Hunter (G), cut:

- (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (2) 1" x 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (7) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Chameleon Basics - Green (H), cut:

- (1) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares.
- (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Cactus - Green (I), cut:

- (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Allover Leaves - Green (J), cut:

- (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Chameleon Basics - Olive (K), cut:

- (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Hanging Plants - Black (L), cut:

- (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Urban Legend - White (M), cut:

- (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (4) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (76) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares.
- (3) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (72) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- (1) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (6) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (72) 1" x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Watering Cans - Black (N), cut:

- (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7" strips.

From the Tossed Plants - White (Backing), cut:

- (2) 74" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 74" x 83" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

- Sew (1) 3" x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 3" x 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 39 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".**

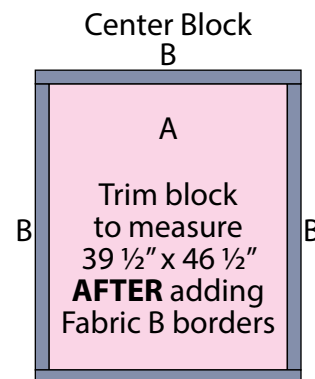

2. Place (1) 1 3/4" Fabric F square on the top right corner of (1) 2 1/2" x 3 1/2" Fabric M strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 3). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 strip.

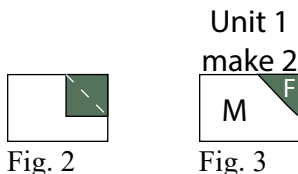

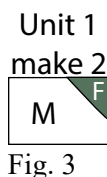

3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 4-10 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make the designated number of unit strips for Unit 2 through Unit 8.

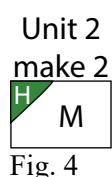

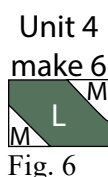

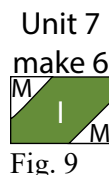

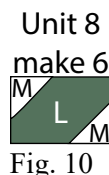

4. Place (1) 1 1/2" Fabric M square on the left side of (1) 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" Fabric K strip, right sides together (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 12).

5. Place another 1 1/2" Fabric M square on the right side of the 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" Fabric K strip, right sides together (Fig. 13). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 13). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 14).

6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (6) Unit 9 strips total.

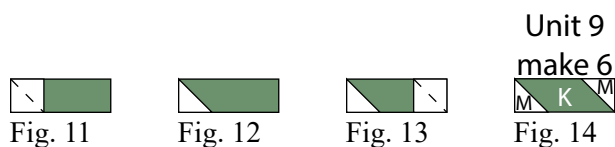

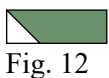

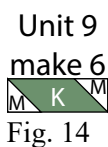

7. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figures 15-18 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make the designated number of unit strips for Unit 10 through Unit 13.

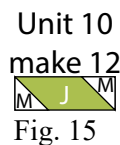

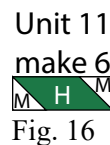

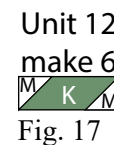

8. Sew (1) 1" x 3 1/2" Fabric M strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) Unit 9 strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 14 strip (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (6) Unit 14 strips total.

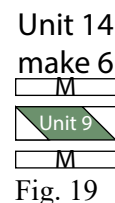

9. Repeat Step 8 and refer to Figures 20-23 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the designated number of unit strips for Unit 15 through Unit 18.

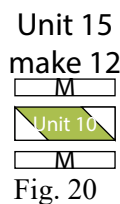

10. Sew together (1) Unit 3 strip, (1) Unit 14 strip, (1) Unit 4 strip, (1) Unit 15 strip, (1) Unit 5 strip and (1) Unit 16 strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Unit 19 strip (Fig. 24). Repeat to make (6) Unit 19 strips total.

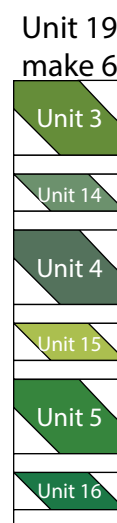

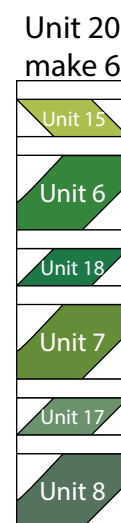

11. Repeat Step 10 and refer to Figure 25 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (6) Unit 20 strips.

12. Place (1) $1\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric M square on the bottom left corner of (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N square, right sides together (Fig. 26). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 26). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 27).

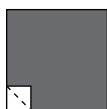

13. Follow Figure 28 for the seam direction to add a $1\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric M square to the lower right corner of the $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N square to make (1) Unit 21 square (Fig. 29).

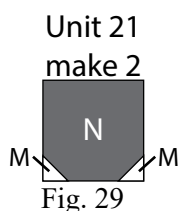

15. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric M strip to each side of (1) Unit 21 square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7" Fabric N strip to the top of the Unit 21 strip to make (1) 7" x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 22 rectangle (Fig. 30). Repeat to make a second Unit 30 rectangle.

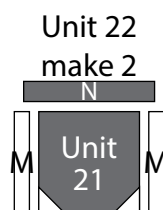

16. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip, (3) Unit 19 strips and (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric M strip together in that order top to bottom to make (1) Unit 23 strip (Fig. 31). Repeat to make a second Unit 23 strip.

17. Repeat Step 16 and refer to Figure 32 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Unit 24 strips.

18. Sew (1) Unit 23 strip, (1) 1 " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip and (1) Unit 24 strip together lengthwise. Sew (1) Unit 22 rectangle to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make the Left Side Border (Fig. 33). Repeat To make the Right Side Border (Fig. 34).

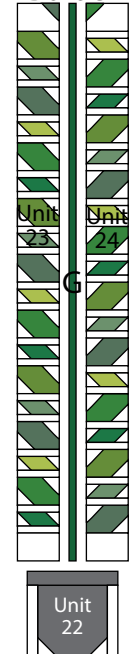

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

19. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and right sides of the Center Block.

20. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

21. Sew (1) 7" x 52 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

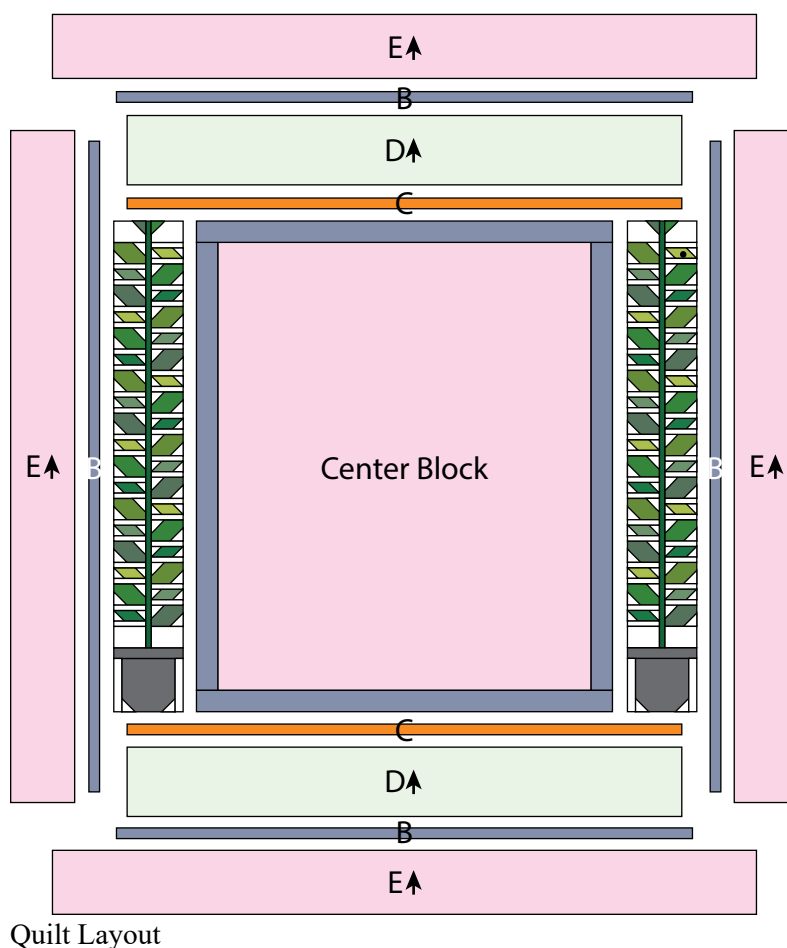
22. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 61 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 54 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

23. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 63 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 66 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

24. Layer and quilt as desired.

25. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

26. Bind as desired.
